- This scheme Corporation Service of Scheme,
- of this scheme shall be deemed to have come into force on and from the 24th day of January, 1976.
- 2. Definitions.-In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires :-
 - (a) "Act" means the Bharat Petroleum Corpora-tion Limited (Determination of conditions of service of Employees) Act, 1988;
 - (b) "clerical employees" means as employee covered by Standing Orders No. B-51(1-A) 79-S.O. dt. 30th June, 1982 certified by the Regional Labour Commissioner (Central)

- Bombay under sub-section (3) of section 10 of the Industrial Employment (Standing Orders) Act, 1946 (20 of 1946) read with sub-section (3) of section 5 thereof;
- (c) "labour employee" means an employee covered by Standing Orders No. B-51(1)| 79-S.O. dt. 30th June 1983 certified by the Regional Labour Commissioner (Central) Bombay under sub-section (3) of section 10 read with sub-section (3) of section 5 of the Industrial Employment (Standing Orders) Act, 1946, (20 of 1946) for workmen other than clerks.
- (d) "Schedule" means a Schedule appended to this scheme.
- 3. Application.—The provisions of this scheme shall apply to all clerical employees and labour employees who have joined the Refinery of the Corporation on or after 24th day of January, 1976 (hereinafter referred to as "the employee").
- 4. Conditions of Service.—(1) The clerical employees and labour employees of the Corporation shall be governed by the conditions of service, as applicable to them, in the following manner, namely:—
 - (i) for the period beginning on the 24th day of January, 1976 and ending on the 31st day of December, 1979 as specified in Part 'A' of the First Schedule;
 - (ii) for the period beginning on the 1st day of January, 1980 and ending on the 31st day of December, 1983 as specified in Part 'B' of the First Schedule;
 - (iii) for the period beginning on the 1st day of January, 1984 and ending on the 31st day of December, 1987 as specified in Part 'C' of the First Schedule;
 - (iv) for the period beginning on the 1st day of January, 1988 and ending on the 31st day of December, 1991 as specified in the Second Schedule; and
 - (v) for any period after the 31st day of December, 1991, the conditions of service shall be governed by the Second Schedule unless they are altered, varied or repealed by any other scheme.
- (2) Subject to the provisions of paragraph 5 of this scheme, the Corporation shall grant such benefit to every employee, as is applicable to him in accordance with sub-paragraph (1) above, depending upon the period of his employment in the Corporation.
- Explanation: For the purpose of calculation of such benefit, wages of the employee alongwith other benefits which were extended to him prior to the date of publication of this scheme in the Official Gazette shall be taken into account:

Provided that where an employee has received emoluments more than the amount due to him in accordance with sub-paragraph (1) above, the Corporation shall have the right to recover such excess amount.

- 5. Computation of Arrears.—(1) Payment of amounts computed in accordance with paragraph 4 shall be governed by the following conditions namely:—
 - (a) the employee shall not be entitled to the amount of arrears for the period he was away from duty on loss of wages;
 - (b) the Corporation shall deduct from the amount of arrears so computed, income tax in accordance with the provisions of the Incometax Act, 1961 (43 of 1961);
 - (c) (i) on completion of computation of wages of an employee, provident fund contributions of the employee shall be recalculated or readjusted on the basis of the difference between the provident fund contribution actually made by him and the amount of provident fund calculated in accordance with paragraph 4 and any excess amount of provident fund payable by the employee shall be recovered out of the arrears payable to him and credited to his provident fund account and the Corporation shall also contribute a matching amount to the provident fund account of the employee.
 - (ii) after recalculation of the provident fund contribution of an employee, if it is found that during any period, the amount deducted, based on the actual wages paid, is more in comparison with the amount of provident fund required to be deducted on the basis of wages due to him on the basis of paragraph 4, such excess contribution to his Provident Fund Account shall not be refunded to the employee. However, the excess equivalent contribution made by the Corporation for the relevant period shall be re-adjusted from the amount of arrears that may be payable to the employee.
- (2) Where an employee has received for any period an amount in excess of the amount computed in accordance with paragraph 4, the Corporation shall have the right to recover such excess amount from the amount of arrears payable to the employee.
- 6. Time Limit for the Payment of Arrears.—The Corporation shall make the payment of arrears in accordance with paragraph 4 within six months from the date of publication of this scheme.
- 7. Categorisation of Employees.—There shall be seven grades for the Clerical Employees and Labour Employees of the Corporation who are governed under the scheme, as set out in the Third Schedule.
- 8. General.—Subject to the condition that there shall be no retrenchment of any employee, the Corporation shall undertake such steps as may be necessary for increasing productivity by way of work-simplification, reallocation of work, redeployment of employees, installation of improved and more efficient equipment, closure of unproductive units, relocation of establishments or part thereof, relocation of plants and machinery or introduction of new lines of production and manufacture.

- 9. Transfers.—(i) The Corporation shall be entitled to transfer employee from one unit to another unit in the same Department or from one Department to another Department in the same establishment of the Corporation.
- (ii) An employee of the Corporation may be transferred from one establishment of the Corporation to another establishment in the interest of increasing productivity of the Corporation.
- 10. Interpretation.—If any question arises as to the interpretation of this scheme, the decision of the Central Government thereon shall be final.
- 11. All other conditions of service of employees which are not specifically covered by this scheme shall continue to be applicable.

For the purposes of this Sub-Cause Quarterly average Consumer Price Index Number shall be computed as follows:—

For Variable Dearness Allowance payable for the first quarter of any year, average of Consumer Price Index Numbers for the months of September, October and November of the preceding year shall be taken into account. Similarly, for Variable Dearness Allowance payable in the Second quarter of any year, the average of Consumer Price Index Numbers for the month of December of the preceding year and January and February of the current year shall be taken into account. The Variable Dearness Allowance payable for subsequent quarters shall also be worked out on similar basis.

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(C) Special Dearness Allowance:

With effect from the 1st day of January 1984, all eligible employees shall be paid Special Dearness Allowance as per table given below:—

4. HOUSE RENT ALLOWANCE

With effect from the 1st day of January, 1984, all eligible employees shall be paid House Rent Allowance at the rate of 30 per cent of the Basic Pay provided that the maximum payable without Rent Receipt shall not exceed Rs. 275 per month upto 31st day of March, 1987 and from 1st day of April 1987, the maximum payable without rent receipt shall not exceed Rs. 1000 per month.

5. CITY COMPENSATORY ALLOWANCE

With effect from the 1st day of January 1984, all eligible employees shall be paid City Compensatory allowance at the rate of 8 per cent of the Basic Pay subject to a maximum of Rs. 75|- per month upto 31 day of March 1987, and from 1st day of April, 1987 subject to a maximum of Rs. 100|- per month. 6. SHIFT ALLOWANCE

With effect from the 1st day of January 1984, a cligible employees working in two shifts note or three shifts rota shall be entitled to Shift allowance at the rate of Rs. 31- per shift worked.

7. TRANSPORT ALLOWANCE

With effect from the 1st day of January, 1984, all eligible employees shall be paid Transport allowance at the rate of Rs. 50-per month.

8. WASHING ALLOWANCE

With effect from the 1st day of January 1984, Washing allowance at the rate of Rs. 20]- per month shall be paid to those employees who were in receipt of Uniforms or protective clothes, provide dthat the arrangements made by the Corporation to wash the uniforms were not availed by the v.

9. LEAVE FARE ASSISTANCE

With effect from the 1st day of January 1984, all employees, who have completed more than 6 months' service in a calendar year, shall be entitled to Leave Fair Assistance as follows:

10. LEAVE

(A) Privilege Leave :

Privilege Leave for all eligible employees shall be credited at the rate of 32 running days per calendar years of service.

(B) Casual Leave:

All eligible employees shall be entitled Casual Leave at the rate of 12 days per year.

(C) Sick Leave :

All eligible employees shall be entitled to Sick Leave, if not covered under the Employees State Insurance Scheme, at the rate of 10 days per annum and if covered under the Employees State Insurance Scheme, at the rate of 7 days per annum.

(D) Maternity Leave:

Maternity Leave shall be admissible to eligible female employees in accordance with the provisions of the Maternity Benefits Act 1961 (53 of 1961).

11. WORKING HOURS

With effect from the 1st day of January 1984, the Working hours for labour and clerical employees shall be as follows, namely:—

- (i) For labour employees—44 hours per weak;
- (ii) For clerical employees—40 hours per week. NOTE:

The labour employees shall be actually working for 48 hours a week and they shall be compensated for 4 hours extra time worked during the week at single rate.

12. PROVIDENT FUND:

(a) Eligible employees shall be required to make contribution to Provident Fund at the rate

of 8 per cent of their Busic Salary plus
Variable Dearness Allowance plus Fixed
Dearness Allowance and plus Special Dearness Allowance.

(b) The Corporation shall make matching contribution to the employees' Provident Fund Accounts.

13. GRATUITY

Gratuity shall be payable to eligible employees as per the provisions of the Payment of Gratuity Act 1972 (39 of 1972).

2. FITMENT BENEFIT

The employees who are on the Payroll of the Corporation on the date of notification of this Scheme shall be entitled to the Fitment benefit of Rs. 125]- per month.

3. FIXATION OF SALARY

- (a) The revised Basic Salary as on the 1st day of January 1988, shall be determined as follows:
 - (i) The revised basic salary as on the 1st day of January 1988, of the employees ho were in the service of the Corporation as on the 31st day of December 1987, shall be arrived at by addition of Rs. 515|- (being the component of Variable Dearness Allowance merged into basic) and Rs. 125|- (being the component of fitment benefit) to the basic salary payable to them in their respective Wage Scale as on the 31st day of December 1987.
 - (ii) If as a result of what is stated in Clause (i) above, the revised basic salary so arrived at is out of step in the appropriate Wage Scales, it shall be brought to the next step in

the Scale by giving appropriate step up

(D) In case Government of India adjustment.

- (b) Employees who have joined the Corporation's service on or after the 1st day of January 1988 upto the date of Notification shall be fitted, from the date of joining, at the minimum of the Grades applicable to them,
- (c) The employees who have joined the Corporation's service after the date of the notification of the Scheme, shall be fitted in the appropriate Wage Scales on point-to-point basis.

4. DEARNESS ALLOWANCE

- (A) Fixed Dearness Allowance
- With effect from the 1st day of January 1988, all eligible employees shall be paid Fixed Dearness Allowance at the rate of Rs. 100-per month.
- (B) Special Dearness Allowance
- With effect from the 1st day of January 1988, all eligible employees shall be paid a Special Dearness Allowance at the following rates:

With effect from the 1st day of January 1988, all eligible employees shall be paid Variable Dearness Allowance, linked to All India Price Index Number (1960=100)
Series. For any increase or decrease in quarterly average of Consumer Price Index by a full point, Variable Dearness Allowance shall be increased or decreased at the rate of Rs. 1.65 per point beyond All India Consumer Price Index No. 608.

Explanation: For the purposes of this sub-clause, Quarterly average of Consumer Price Index Number shall be computed as follows:

For Variable Dearness Allowance payable for the first quarter of any year, average of Consumer Price Index Numbers for the months of September, October and November of the preceding year shall be taken into account, Similarly, for Variable Dearness Allowance payable in the second quarter of any year, the average Consumer Price Index Numbers for the months of December of the preceding year and January and February of the current year shall be taken into account, The Variable Dearness Allowance payable for subsequent quarters shall also be worked out on similar basis.

(D) In case Government of India revises its policy on neutralisation per point variation in Consumer Price Index Number in the Public Sector Undertakings, where the rate of Rs. 1.65 per point applies at present, the revised rate shall be made applicable to the employees covered by this Scheme from the date the said change becomes effective.

5. HOUSE RENT ALLOWANCE

With effect from the 1st day of January 1988, House Rent Allowance to eligible employtes shall be payable on the following basis:

- (i) In the case of employees who do not produce rent receipt. House Rent Allowance shall be paid at the rate of 30 per cent of the basic salary or Rs. 1000|- per month, whichever is less.
- (ii) In the case of employees who produce rent receipt or claim House Rent allowance on the basis of assessed market rent of their own house, House Rent allowance shall be paid on the following basis:
 - (a) Employees shall be required to first bear rent equal to 10 per cent of their basic salary; and
 - (b) The Corporation shall pay balance rent incurred by the employees upto maximum of 30 per cent of basic salary or Rs. 1000 per month, whichever is less.
- (iii) House Rent Allowance shall not be paid to the employees occupying Corporation owned]leased accommodation for which deductions on account of occupancy charges at 10 per cent of basic salary shall be made from the date such Corporation owned or leased accommodation is occupied by the employee.
- (iv) House Rent Allowance shall not be paid for periods of absence on loss of pay.
- (v) House Rent Allowance shall not be considered for contribution to Provident Fund or for the purposes of retirement benefits or for bonus|ex gratia or for any allowances whatsoever.

6. CITY COMPENSATORY ALLOWANCE

- (a) With effect from the 1st day of January 1988, City Compensatory Allowance shall be paid to eligible employees at the rate of 8% of basic salary subject to a maximum of Rs. 100[- per month.
 - (b) City Compensatory Allowance shall not be paid for periods of absence on loss of pay.
- (c) City Compensatory Allowance shall not be considered for calculation of House Rent Allowance, contribution to Provident Fund or for the purpose of retirement benefits or for any boaus[ex gratia or for any allowance whatsoever.
