SUBMISSION GUIDELINES:

- 1) The abstract should be 100 - 150 words.
- 2) The full paper should be within 3000–3700 words, including title, abstract, main text, and references. The full-length paper should include the following: Abstract, Keywords, Introduction, Literature Review, Methodology, Findings/Discussion, Conclusion, and References.
- 3) Plagiarism must be below 10%. Authors must submit their own plagiarism report along with the paper (plagiarism report should be in one of the following software: Urkund / Turnitin / iThenticate / Drillbit). The review committee may conduct an additional plagiarism check.
- 4) The paper title should align with the conference themes and sub-themes.
- 5) All citations and references must follow the Harvard Author-Date referencing style, and authors must ensure consistent formatting throughout the paper. Proper in-text citations corresponding to the reference list are mandatory.
- 6) All papers should be in Times New Roman/Unicode-10, font size 12, with 1.5-line spacing.
- 7) Authors must send their abstracts in a Word Document only to the mail ID: arts.conference@kalingauniversity.ac.in by 25th January 2027

Selected papers will be included in the conference proceedings, with an ISBN, as an E-book. Selected papers will be published in the UGC/ABDC/Scopus-indexed journals, with applicable charges determined by the respective journals.
