

Dr. Mousumi Mukherjee participates in 2nd research symposium of the World Council of Comparative Education Societies



Dr. Mukherjee is Assistant Professor and Assistant Director, International Institute for Higher Education Research and Capacity Building (IIHEd) and Founding Executive Director, Centre for Comparative and Global Education. She was invited to participate in the 2nd research symposium of the World Council of Comparative Education Societies (WCCES) at UNECO-IBE coinciding with the release of 2019 Global Education Monitoring Report on Migration, Displacement and Education by UNESCO. During the two-day research symposium held on 14-15 January at UNESCO-IBE in Geneva, Dr. Mukherjee deliberated on the various facets of migration and explored how comparative education may offer pragmatic solutions to some of these challenges. The proceedings from this research symposium will be published by Brill/Sense publishers in the book Immigrants and Comparative Education: Call to Re-Engagement edited by Dr. Zehavit Gross, UNESCO-Chair in Values Education, Tolerance & Peace.
