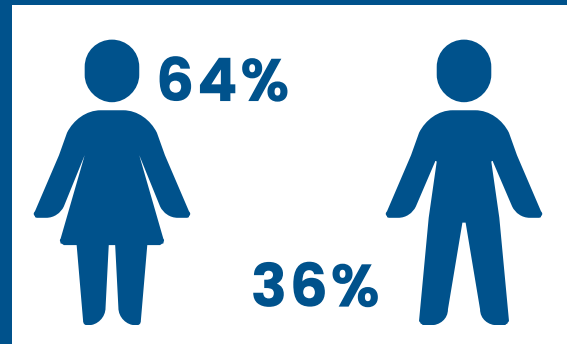
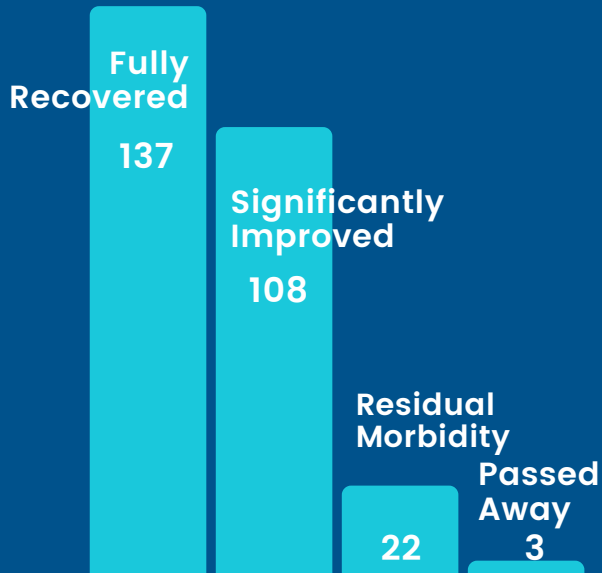


Treatment outcome

270 Patients supported

in February 2026



Meghana (name changed), 33, is a single mother to her two-year-old child. When her husband abandoned the family, her brother, a technician working in a private lab supported her.

For the last twelve months, she has been struggling with health problems. An intense cough and weight loss of over 12 kgs has left Meghana a shadow of her former self. She struggles to carry on with daily life. Her family brought her to CMC Vellore. The Department of Pulmonary Medicine diagnosed her with bronchiectasis affecting both lungs, a chronic condition, worsened by repeated lung infections. She was treated with medicines, respiratory therapy, and recovered slowly in the general ward.

Her brother struggled to support the family during her extended hospitalisation. Through CMC's charitable funds, including Person-to-Person (PTP), and the generosity of our donors, Meghana received the treatment she needed. She was discharged in stable condition and has been advised long-term oxygen therapy at home.
