Their growth, skills and attendance in classes are regularly monitored and their parents are kept posted with their wards' performance. A system of continuous assessment and appraisal of students has been introduced. The courses set by the University are covered intensively with the help of all available teaching aids in the college. The faculty members use computers / multimedia / audiovisual aids to make lectures interesting. A

variety of teaching methods combining the traditional lecture with laboratory-based practical, tutorials and seminar teaching, wherever required, are employed. Term wise teaching plans and unitized syllabi help the students / teachers gauge their performance and progress. Subject related quizzes, contests, etc. are arranged to monitor students' reading and for developing a better awareness and understanding of the subjects. All departments have their own subject societies for arranging extra-curricular activities. All students are encouraged and trained to develop one or the other interest as a hobby. Their participation in such activities is duly rewarded accordingly.

To promote student-centric learning, the college provides its students with an anytime-anywhere learning platform through its Learning Management System implemented using GSuite. The teachers provide all kinds of notes, video lectures, assignments and quizzes etc. through Google Classrooms that the registered students can access any time. Regular virtual meetings are also planned for needy students through virtual meeting platforms like Meet, Zoom, WebEx etc.

## MENTORING

Mentoring is a professional activity, a trusted relationship and a meaningful commitment. Mentoring program at DAV College is meant for enabling constructive and positive interaction between students and the teachers so as to provide proper guidance and mentorship. In the beginning of the session, each student is assigned a mentor teacher who remains available throughout the session to provide emotional, academic and social assistance.

## PARENT-TEACHER ASSOCIATION

Every educational institution has its own set of values by which the standards of that institution are assessed. It is not enough to send a list of college rules to the parents to which their children would be subjected to. It is most important for parents to understand the essence of those rules and regulations and be a part of the team that forms these rules. Such understanding and involvement can only be derived in the form of PARENT TEACHER ASSOCIATION. Meetings of the association always have the advantage of very frank and open discussions which lead to resolutions being taken in the interest of all. PTA is essential for excellent performance of the students academically, morally and spiritually. Keeping all these facts in mind the parent teacher association of DAV College, Chandigarh is performing the tasks that have been assigned to it. Aims of the PTA are:

1. To act as a link between the teachers and parents.
2. To support and facilitate the development of the college.
3. To encourage students in their studies and extra as well as co-curricular activities.

## RESEARCH CELL



DAV College is one of the few colleges in the country, which has established a Research Cell for the purpose of promoting research temperament and culture among students. The college has been allotted four research centers in the subjects of Chemistry, Zoology, Biotechnology and Physics. The college was granted Rs 1.5 crore by FIST for creating the requisite infrastructure to carry out quality research in the college. In the year 2020-21, DST-FIST in continuation with its earlier grant, also accorded a sanction of Rs. 45 Lacs to the college for the creation of Capital Assets for

equipment. In addition to this, several major and minor projects sponsored by the U.G.C. and other funding agencies are undertaken by the faculty members from time to time.

During the session 2023-24, the Research Cell in association with Chandigarh Vigyan Parishad (VIBHA) & Society for Promotion of Science and Technology in India organised a talk on the topic 'From Galileo to the James Webb Space Telescope' on Sept 15, 2023. The talk was delivered by Prof Ajit Kembhavi, FASC., FNASC, Prof Emeritus, Former Director and Former Raja Ramanna Fellow at Inter-University Centre for Astronomy and Astrophysics (IUCAA), Pune. Many distinguished guests attended the event including Prof Arun Grover, Former Vice Chancellor, Panjab University Chandigarh, Principal K.S. Arya Sh. Dharam Vir, IAS (Retd), President, SPSTI, Prof Keya Dharamvir from Physics Dept. Panjab University Chandigarh. Prof Ajit Kembhavi enlightened the audience with his vast knowledge and expertise on space science. He gave a power point presentation in which he showed very interesting slides of various elements of Universe. The talk was very informative and interactive. This day coincided with the Engineer's day which is celebrated on 15th September every year.

## RESEARCH CONSULTANCY

A research consultancy project of Rs. 2.5 lakhs has been signed between Dr. Kakoli Biswas and Amulya Herbs Pvt. Ltd in 2019. Under this project Dr. Kakoli performed Bio Quality Assurance by performing DNA fingerprinting of the herbs used in the herbal drug industry. This is the first-ever consultancy service of DAV College and in the City colleges where Academia and Industry collaboration has been started.

Dr. Raghur Singh from the Department of Chemistry bagged a consultancy project worth 1 Lakh from Ashavin Labs, Industrial Area, Chandigarh, for the synthesis of different pharmaceutical molecules.

Dr. Navneet K Pruthi, Assistant Professor, Department of Physics, awarded collaborative research project entitled "Indian Participation in ALICE experiment at CERN" involving 11 Indian Institutions by Department of Science and Technology, New Delhi for 5 years w.e.f 1 Nov. 2021. The sanctioned amount for the project is 54.5 Lakhs.

Further, an MOU was signed between DAV College Chandigarh and CIBioD (ICMR- Centre for Innovation and Bio Design) Post Graduate Institute of Medical Education & Research (PGIMER), which will help our students to undertake translational research and summer training at PGIMER research laboratories. The innovative ideas of our faculty and students will shape up into progressive research in the field of medical science.

### Memorandum of Understanding (MoU)

In addition to these, DAV College also signed the following MOUs with renowned organisations to enhance skills of the students:

- With The Power Academy (Microsoft Learning Partners) to train students in Power App Developer and Power Business Intelligence

## PATENTS

The Patent titled Reduce, Recycle and Reuse (RRR) IoT Intelligence Waste Management System was awarded to Dr. Harmunish Taneja, Assistant Professor, Department of Computer Science and Applications and IT, and his team. This particular system suggests an efficient waste management system for managing biodegradable, non-biodegradable and food waste. Another patent has been granted to the patentee for an invention entitled System and Method for Monitoring Sanitation Status of Toilet as disclosed in the above mentioned application for the term of 20 years from the 26th day of November 2019 in accordance with the provisions of the Patents Act, 1970 (15.05.2024)

Dr. Kashma (Department of Chemistry) was granted a patent Title: Biodegradable Packaging Film and a Process for its Preparation thereof. An Indian Patent was awarded to Dr. Kakoli Biswas, Associate Professor and Head, Department of Biotechnology, on 17.12.2020 (Patent No. 353927) entitled "Novel Media for plant tissue culture" by the Indian patent Office, Govt. of India. She also has filed for two more patents, one international and one national.



### CENTRAL INSTRUMENTATION LABORATORY

DAV College Managing Committee along with the grant of the Department of Science and Technology, the Government of India has started an Instrumentation Lab on College Campus. In this instrumentation lab, various instruments like HPLC system, Electrochemical workstation, Inverted microscope, Gradient PCR, Gas Chromatograph, Digital Polarimeter, UV-Vis. Spectroscopy, FTIR, Ultrapure water purification (HPLC grade) and Fluorescence spectroscopy are available for all institutional and industrial research purposes.

### INSTITUTION'S INNOVATION COUNCIL (IIC)

The Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) is an initiative launched by the Ministry of Education's Innovation Cell (MIC) in 2018. The IIC program, developed in collaboration with the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), aims to systematically foster a culture of innovation and start-up ecosystem within Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) across India. The IIC's primary role is to engage a large number of faculty, students, and staff in various innovation and entrepreneurship-related activities. ## PLACEMENT CELL

The Training and Placement cell which is committed to provide all possible assistance to the students pursuing various degree/ Diploma/ Vocational Courses in their effort to find employment. The placement cell team includes a Placement Incharge (appointed from the faculty members), a Placement Coordinator and student coordinators from various departments. The training and placement cell is active throughout the year for the facilities of contacts between recruiter and students. It arranges pre-placement lectures on communication skills, Soft skills, group discussions, personal interviews, resume writing etc. for honing the capabilities of students. Both on-campus and off-campus interactions with the recruiters are facilitated regularly. The cell also invites industry professional to interact with the students in order to identify the emerging opportunities in the corporate world. ## HEALTHY PRACTICES

The college attempts to cater to the special needs of all the students in various ways. It provides an environment which facilitates holistic learning of every student. Based upon an individual's learning needs, the college organizes remedial as well as meritorial classes which students can join as per their needs. Ragging, drinking and smoking are strictly prohibited on the campus. Musical concerts, which encourage vulgarity and obscenity, are not allowed in the college. Anti-drugs, anti-violence, anti-alcohol programmes and medical checkups are regularly organized on the campus. Organising Hawan on the campus is a regular practice. The 200th birth anniversary of Swami Dayanand Saraswati ji was celebrated by performing hawan with 200 hawankunds which was held with the active participation of the faculty, staff and students. The students are allowed only two wheelers on the campus so that they realize the need of observing some austerity, and can also contribute to the conservation of natural resources. Our endeavour is to produce sensitive and successful humans who are in tune with the demands of modern times.

In order to provide a safe, healthy and a loving environment to the children of the faculty members of DAV College, the facility of DAV Day care was started in the college on 15th October in 2022. The inauguration of the day care was done by Padma Shri Awardee, Dr. Punam Suri, the president, DAVCMC, New Delhi.

## WASTE MANAGEMENT & SOLAR PLANT

The college has a well established Waste Management Society which takes care of cleanliness and utilization of organic waste in the campus in addition to ensuring proper disposal of e-waste. In the hostels composters are installed to convert organic waste like; vegetable-peels, left-over food etc. into compost. On an average 5 quintals of compost is produced monthly by microbial degradation process which is utilised in the college campus.

To make the students and faculty aware regarding the impact of dumping of waste in the surroundings and the methods of disposal, which can be manageable at home by every individual, webinars, workshops, rallies and seminars are organized by the society. Moreover, for hygienic disposal of used sanitary napkins, an electric machine has been installed in the campus to make it pollution free.

The college is also contributing towards Swachhata Rank of Chandigarh. 2000 students got registered for Swachhata Abhiyan by the team of Municipal Corporation who visited the college.

In order to conserve electrical energy, a 100 KW Solar plant was installed in the administrative block of the college, inaugurated by Sh. S.S. Gill, IAS, Secretary, Education, UT Chandigarh, an illustrious alumnus of DAV College. The setting up of this On Grid Solar plant is a step by the college towards conservation of resources by using renewable energy to meet the electricity demands of the college. Apart from this, solar LED lights (30 Watt capacity each) have been installed recently in the whole college campus including gardens, corridors and hostel premises.

On this occasion the students of the college presented vibrant and mesmerizing cultural events like Rajasthani, Nati dances and Gidda and songs.

## INFRASTRUCTURE

Our greatest advantage is that the college is located in the heart of the city and is easily accessible to commuters from outside as well as to the ones from different sectors of the 'City Beautiful'. We boast of our contemporary and state-of-the-art infrastructure that serves as a stanchion to facilitate the variety of the services provided to the faculty as well as the students. The infrastructure includes a huge building with spacious and well ventilated traditional and smart classrooms, sprawling lawns, a beautiful seminar complex with audio visual aids, two auditoriums, 27 sophisticated labs, Language Lab and vast playgrounds. Facilities such as State Bank of India ATM, a Cyber Cafe, Photocopy Shop, Phone Recharges, Bookshop, General Merchant Shop, Fruit & Juice Shop, Cobbler Shop, Dry Cleaner, Coffee House, Nescafe vent, Canteen, well equipped Gymnasium and Beauty Parlour for Hostel Girls are also available on the campus. A doctor remains on duty in the college dispensary to attend to the minor ailments of staff and students.

The college also provides high speed wireless internet connectivity, which students can access on their personal phones and laptops and which works unimpeded throughout the entire campus.



## COLLEGE LIBRARY

The library of DAV College is well stocked and well equipped to fulfill the knowledge and information needs of the readers. It provides a conducive atmosphere and sufficient seating facility to its readers for browsing and relaxed reading.

The building of the library is multi-storeyed, well ventilated and air-conditioned as well. On the ground floor there is a circulation section, stack areas, meditation room, property counter, outer reading hall and Lal Chand Research Library.

The outer reading hall of the library is kept open late in the evening before and during the examinations. The Open shelf system is provided in the stack areas from where the students can get the books issued. There is a rich collection of books in the streams of humanities, social sciences, sciences, IT, language, literature, commerce and management. On the first floor of the library there is the reference section and the textbook section. All kinds of reference material like dictionaries, encyclopedias, yearbooks, directories, maps, gazettes and gazetteers, reference books belonging to specific disciplines are housed in the reference section of the library. In the textbook section one copy each of textbook of every subject is kept in this section. On the top floor of the library there is the periodical section, biography section and digital corner. This section houses magazines, multi-faculty journals, newspapers, biographies and autobiographies. 24 computer systems have been installed in the digital corner of the library for our faculty members and the research scholars of our college.



Library is fully automated and provides facilities like in-house Xerox and binding services. It also provides access to e-resources through databases like NLIST and J-Gate Social Sciences and Management.

Library issues Unique Smart ID cum library cards to all the bonafide students and to all the staff members and the faculty of the college. It also provides back sets of Journals and Magazines, University Syllabi, Old Question papers of University exams.

To ensure students' active participation in the library, various activities are held from time to time like book exhibitions, signature campaign and training workshops on knowledge based themes.

## LIBRARY RULES

1. Books are issued to students as per their entitlement.
2. A fine of Re 1/- per day per volume is charged for the books returned after the due date.

3. Reference books, text books, rare books and periodicals are not issued except for consultation in the library.
4. The students are required to possess their identity cards while inside the Library/ Reading Rooms. Defaulters will be asked to leave and their cases will be reported to the Principal.
5. Books issued from the Library should be kept carefully and in no case be underlined or disfigured. If a book is already damaged in any form, it should be reported to the issuing clerk or the Librarian. Once the book is issued the student will be held responsible for the damage.
6. The loss of a book should be reported to the library before the due date in the absence of which the usual fine will be charged. The borrower will be required to replace it or to pay double its price along with his next college dues if the book is not replaced.
7. The students are expected to observe silence in the Reading Room and not to disturb others in any way.
8. Special Library service, for extended hours, is provided near examination days.
9. Needy and meritorious students are issued books for the whole session.

### LAL CHAND RESEARCH LIBRARY



Another landmark feature of our college is Lal Chand Research Library which has completed 100 years of its existence. The library was established in 1917 in Lahore by the DAV College Management Trust and Society after the name of Rai Bahadur Lal Chand, the first president of the Trust. Thousands of manuscripts were collected from the nooks and corners of various villages around Lahore and other areas. In the late nineties these were brought to the D.A.V. College, Chandigarh to preserve and protect them. The library today has a collection of almost 8,360 rare manuscripts. Apart from the manuscripts, as many as 10,303 rare books are also part of the library's inventory. As many as 6,462 manuscripts are paper based, while 1,898 are written on palm leaves in various Indian and South Indian scripts namely Devanagari, Sharada, Grantha, Gurumukhi, Utkal, Banga, Nandi, Nagari, Kannada, Malyalam, Tamil and Vartala. Apart from Kautilya's Arthashastra, Valmiki's Ramayana, Mahabharata and the Bhagavad Gita, Shankar Bhashyam among many others, the manuscripts also comprise Asvalayana Sharut Sutra, the first 'Sutra' (ritual manuals) of Rig Veda, and Kartika Ratnam. This astonishing collection spans 45 subjects, including the Vedas, Brahmanas, Dharmashastras, literature, philosophy, art, astronomy, architecture, ethics and linguistics. Detailed records of drawings and measurements of

monuments such as the Taj Mahal, the Qutab Minar and the Golden Temple can also be found here. Some of the rare books stocked here are *irukta*, a standard in linguistics by author Yaska, *Charak Samhita*, *Mahabhasya*, *Leelawati* and *Kamasutra*. Then there are some very rare ones on Ayurveda. The library has a rare book on medicinal plants by Major BD Basu that was published by Panini Office, Allahabad in 1918. These manuscripts are being given a new lease of life in our college and have been preserved for posterity. The paper manuscripts have been laminated and the palm leaf manuscripts have been incised with a metal pen. The blackening of the text on palm leaf manuscripts is being done with the periodic application of lemon grass oil with coal dust. The rich collection of paper manuscripts is being uploaded on the website: [www.splrarebooks.com](http://www.splrarebooks.com). The staff at the library of D.A.V. College, Chandigarh has worked wonders with this archival treasure. With the aid of latest technology, we have succeeded in protecting and preserving this magnificent heritage. Many scholars from India and abroad have shown keen interest in these manuscripts and books. The sustenance of more than 100 years of this rare treasure of ancient knowledge owes its existence to the efforts of authorities and the team work and dedication of library staff. We work on the principle of preserving the heritage for posterity.



## SPORTS

College students are required to take part in games regularly. Ample provision exists on the college campus for various games and sports. The college participates in tournaments of Cricket, Tennis, Table Tennis, Badminton, KhoKho, Gymnastics, Yoga, Athletics Judo, Boxing, Cross Country, Relay races, Ball Badminton, Rowing, Water Polo, Wrestling, Shooting, Softball, Squash Racquet, Archery, Basketball, Swimming, Netball, Chess, Powerlifting, Best Physique, Cycling, Kayaking, Canoeing and Handball. Sportspersons of outstanding merit are granted handsome concessions. All the sportspersons are expected to establish healthy traditions regarding dress, behaviour and attitude.

## NATIONAL CADET CORPS

The college is known for the emphasis it lays on NCC training. All the three wings exist in the college. Students can join one of these wings depending on their aptitude and physical fitness. They are also prepared for Regular commission in the Army, Navy and Air Force. As per NCC rules, a cadet is required to attend the annual training camp of the unit each year and undergo service training for a period of 65 hours or 96 periods or 32 parades during the academic session. In addition to this normal training, he is required to undergo further training for which he may volunteer and which may from time to time be sanctioned by the Ministry of Defence, Government of India or by the State Government. The uniforms issued to the cadets are to be used with care. Any loss or damage shall be made good by them.

## ARMY WING

The aim of NCC Army Wing is to develop different qualities in the cadets like Character, Comradeship, Discipline, Secular outlook and Ideals of selfless service. We achieve this with the training syllabus which includes subjects like Infantry Weapon Training, Field and Battle Craft, Map Reading, Drill, First Aid, Personality Development, Health & Hygiene, Military History, Communication skills, Obstacle Training, Military Geography and Civil Defence. The total strength of NCC (Army Wing) is 160 cadets. The criteria for selection is based upon – Physical Fitness (Push ups, Sit ups, Squats, Running etc.), GK, Speaking Skills, Knowledge about NCC, Personal Interview.

## THE STUDENTS' CENTRAL ASSOCIATION (STUDENT WELFARE ASSOCIATION)



## ANTI RAGGING PRACTICES

“RAGGING IS COGNIZABLE OFFENCE AND IS BANNED IN ANY FORM INSIDE OR OUTSIDE THE COLLEGE CAMPUS” As per the UGC letter No. F1-8/2006(CPP-II) dated February 2008 addressed to the Registrar, Panjab University, Chandigarh, Hon'ble Supreme Court of India has strictly banned ragging in Educational Institutions. If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the college authorities, the concerned student shall be given liberty to explain and if his explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel him/her from the institution. Ragging includes disorderly conduct whether by words, spoken or written or by an act which has effect of teasing, treating and handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which cause or are likely to cause hardship or psychological harm or apprehension to a fresher or junior student.

The association in collaboration with NSS unit of college and Lions Club Chandigarh Central invited painted pots on the theme of Blood Donation. 13 entries were received and winners were awarded on 28th February, 2024. The winners were – First Prize to Gunjan , Second prize to Diya Jindal , third prize to Gurpreet Kaur and Consolation prize to Seema and Shreya.

## BIOTECHNOLOGY ACTIVITY CLUB (BAC) (DEPARTMENT OF BIOTECHNOLOGY)

The objective of the club is to make aware the students and faculty members about the recent advanced developments in the field of Biotechnology by organizing invited lectures delivered by eminent scientists from institutes like PGIMER, Chandigarh, IISER, IMTECH Chandigarh, NABI, Mohali etc..

BAC was initiated by the Department of Biotechnology in 2005; the same year the Department was initiated in the college. The short term used for this club i.e. BAC is derived from Bacterial Artificial Chromosomes depicting the significance of Biotechnology. The objective of the club is to hold seminars, invited lectures, and student competitions to enhance scientific temper of students and update them with the latest research at the national and global level. In the present session 2023-2024 student competitions including slogan writing, Rangoli making, PowerPoint presentations on Women Scientists, and Photography for the students of the department. The students were apprised of the opportunities in Biotechnology in India and Abroad by organizing lectures by experts from Edwise International and Expert Opinion Academy, Chandigarh. Students were also exposed to Institutional lab set-up by a visit to Merck Skill development center, IMTECH, Chandigarh. On the occasion of "National Science Day" 2024 a Science fest was organized from 27th -29th February 2024 wherein four scientific talks were organized on the theme "Indigenous Technologies for Viksit Bharat" as proposed by govt. of India. The talks were delivered by eminent scientists viz: Prof Purnanada Guptasharma, Director from IISER, Mohali, Dr. Pradeep Sen Senior Principal Scientist IMTECH, Chandigarh, Prof Kashmir Sing, Department of Biotechnology and Prof. Rohit Sharma, Department of Microbial Biotechnology, Panjab University, Chandigarh. On the same occasion, an interactive panel discussion by our alumni students was organized to apprise and motivate the students of the opportunities in the field of Biotechnology. Various inter-college competitions like Quiz, Powerpoint presentations, Poster presentations on 'Innovative ideas to entrepreneurship', and cultural events were organized for the students. A lecture by Prof Arun Kumar Grover, Former Vice Chancellor, Panjab University, Chandigarh on 'Historical context of Viksit Bharat' on 23rd February, 2024. It was supported by Punjab State Council for Science & Technology under 'Indigenous Technologies of Viksit Bharat'. The department celebrated the National Science Day on 28th February, 2024 and organized competitions in two categories:

- Science Model & Poster making
- Power point Presentation

The Department consistently endeavours to excel in academics and research in different fields of Chemistry with the participation of hardworking, and committed faculty and non-teaching members.

For the session 2023-24 the recruitments started from 5th August, 2023 Onwards. The Orientation for the activities of the session started from 18th October, 2023. An inter-college debate competition on Incredible India- all about our diverse states was held on 8th November, 2023. The event "Market Mingle: A Fusion of Finance and Future." was organised on 31st January, 2024. The theme for this seminar was 'Unlock Financial Potential. 





## ACHIEVEMENTS IN SPORTS FOR THE SESSION 2023-24

The College has maintained its esteemed sports heritage by achieving outstanding results in international and national level tournaments, as well as in the Panjab University Inter College Championships for both male and female categories. Three students from the college have achieved a historic milestone by winning three Olympic Quota places for the Paris Olympic Games 2024. Additionally, five of our shooters earned three gold, two silver, and one bronze medal in the Hangzhou Asian Games.

The excelling sports persons are awarded cash prizes around twelve lakhs fifty-five thousand five hundred Rupees (Rs 1255500/-) by the college as incentive and appreciation.



#### RE-ADMISSION

- a. A student who remains absent for more than ten days at a stretch, including holidays, in one or more than one subjects/periods, without sanctioned leave is liable to have his/her name struck off from the college rolls.
- b. If a student's name is struck off from the college rolls, he/she will be required to seek readmission within 10 working days failing which his/her admission will stand cancelled.
- c. Re-admission fee will be charged. It is mandatory for the student to bring his/her parents at the time of readmission.
- d. Re-admission is not the right of every student. It is the prerogative of the Principal of the college and it is allowed for not more than two times per semester/per session.
- e. The attendance of the student seeking readmission will however be counted from the first day of teaching and not from the date of readmission.

#### MIGRATION/DEFICIENT SUBJECT(S)

A candidate who has passed his/her 1st Semester and 2nd Semester of B.A./B.Sc. (General)/B.Com./B.B.A./B.C.A. Course conducted by another University/College affiliated to another university in India under specific authorization by the University concerned, be allowed to migrate to a college affiliated to this University in the 3rd semester/5th semester of the respective course (as per rules prescribed under Chapter XIV – 'Migration of Students' Page No.292 to 309 of P.U. Calendar Volume-III, 2019) on the condition that such a candidate will have to clear the deficient subject(s) if any, within the permissible chances.

Deficiencies should be determined by the Principal at the time of admission under intimation to the University (i.e. on the Registration Return and examination forms) as well as to the students as per University Rule No.6 given at Page No.310-311 of P.U. Calendar Volume – III, 2019.

### FOREIGN STUDENTS

All Foreign Students shall obtain Eligibility Certificate from Deputy Registrar (General) Panjab University in all cases and the admission of the foreign students to College would be governed by the guidelines issued by the Dean Foreign Students. The eligibility form should be accompanied by a forwarding letter from the Principal of the College of the Teaching Department indicating the reason for denying the admission to the candidate. After obtaining the Eligibility Certificate, the candidate should submit the same to the College/department where he/she is seeking admission.

The eligibility form should be accompanied by a forwarding letter from the Principal of the College/Chairperson of the Teaching Department indicating the reason for denying the admission to the candidate.

### RESERVATION POLICY

Reservation of seats in different categories viz, Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Dependents of Defence and Paramilitary Personnel, Freedom Fighters, Physically Challenged and Sports will be made in accordance with the rules and instructions framed by the Chandigarh Administration, whereas in case of Single Girl Child, One out of Two Girl Children, Kashmiri Migrants, Kargil Martyrs, Cancer/AIDS/Thalassemia, students from Jammu & Kashmir, Border Area, Rural Area will be made as per instructions issued by Panjab University from time to time.

### IN MAKING ADMISSIONS

- A. All the affiliated colleges of Chandigarh (U.T.) shall follow the reservation policy of Union Territory Administration.
- B. Any student who applies in more than one reserved category will be considered in each reserved category in which he/she applies for admission, maintaining his/her internal seniority in each reserved category on the basis of merit in that category. In such a case, the student will get the benefit in one category of his/her choice.

As per letter no. 19/1/93/IH (3) 5311 dated 18th March, 1999 from Home Secretary, Chandigarh Administration, the following policy shall be followed w.r.t reservation of seats:

In continuation of this Administration's circular letter no. 19/1/93/IH(3- 99/11136) dated 9th June, 1999 on the above subject, which inter alia provides that 85% seats of the total sanctioned intake of an institution will be filled up from amongst the students who pass their qualifying examination from schools/colleges recognized by the Chandigarh Administration and situated in the Union Territory, Chandigarh, as regular students of the said school/college, which will be termed as UT POOL. The remaining 15% seats will be filled from amongst students, who pass their qualifying examinations from institutions other than those located in the Union Territory, Chandigarh or otherwise, which will be termed as GENERAL POOL.

#### Note:

- I. UT Pool Candidates: Those who have passed lower qualifying examination as regular candidates from schools and colleges in UT, Chandigarh.
- II. General Pool Candidates: Those who have passed lower qualifying examination from schools and colleges outside UT, Chandigarh.

\*According to the letter vide Home Department, Chandigarh Administration order no. 19/1/3-IH(3)-2008/20352 dated 27/10/2008, endorsed by DHE vide no. 2778-dhe-ut-c5-26(i)92-II dated 6/11/ 2008, it has been decided to consider the wards of serving defence personnel/ex-servicemen i.e. sons/daughters, under 85% quota only for calculation of seats.

## RESERVATION OF SEATS

The reservation of seats shall be governed by the Regulation 29.1 and 29.2 given at Page No.169 in Panjab University Calendar Volume-I, 2022 and any intimation sent by the Deputy Registrar (Colleges). However, it is clarified that the reservation of seats/fee concession is not available in the case of candidates who are seeking admission to the next higher class on the basis of having earned compartment in +2 examinations i.e. in the subject of compartment. The affiliated Colleges situated in the territorial jurisdiction of U.T. Administration, Chandigarh shall follow the reservation policy of U.T. Administration, Chandigarh for the various categories whereas the affiliated Colleges situated in the State of Punjab shall follow the reservation policy of Government of Punjab.

Relaxation of % of marks for the purpose of determining eligibility for various categories viz. SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy Layer)/BC/Differently abled candidates shall be given as per the guidelines of the respective Governments.

- (i) Wards of Kashmiri Migrants and Kashmiri Pandits/Kashmiri Hindu Families (Non- Migrants living in Kashmiri Valley).
  - a) Relaxation in cut-off percentage upto 10% subject to minimum eligibility requirements.
  - b) Increase in intake capacity upto 5% course-wise.
  - c) Reservation of at least one seat in merit quota in technical/professional institutions.
  - d) Waiving off domicile requirements. As per Circular No.Misc./A-1/1327-1627 dated 20.02.2024 (Already circulated by the Colleges Branch).

The benefit of additional seats under the aforesaid categories will not be admissible to the students seeking admission in the courses falling under regulatory agencies such as MCI, DCI, BCI and NCTE.

- (ii) Wards of martyrs/permanent disabled of Kargil war.
  - I. Concession be given for admission to various courses in Educational Institutions for those wards of martyrs/permanent disabled (up to 80% leading to incapacitation) of Kargil war who have a valid certificate from the Ministry of Defence to this effect and the same be entered in the Pension Book of the family:-

- a. 1% seats with minimum of 1 seat in the Departments and affiliated Colleges; (except in partially financed/self-financing courses.)
  - b. Exemption in fee.
  - c. Exemption in hostel fee. As per Circular No.Misc./A-1/1327-1627 dated 20.02.2024(Already circulated by the Colleges Branch).
- (iii) Additional seats for One Girl child out of only Two Girl Children and patients of Cancer/AIDS/Thalassemia.
- a) TWO additional seats, per unit, per course, for a Single Girl Child or One Girl Child out of only Two Girl Children, subject to maximum limit of four.
  - b) One additional seat each for the student suffers from Cancer/AIDS/Thalassemia. As per Circular No.Misc./A-1/1327-1627 dated 20.02.2024 (Already circulated by the Colleges Branch).
- (iv) Victims of 1984 riots of Punjab.
- i) Free education to children of persons killed in November, 1984 riots and terrorist violence in Punjab State. {Approved vide Syndicate Para 5 (Statement 'A') dated 25.04.1987}.
  - ii) That grand-sons and grand-daughters be excluded from the provision made in Syndicate decision dated 18.10.2015, with regard to admission for sons/grandsons/ daughters/grand-daughters/husband/wife/brothers/sisters of persons killed/incapacitated in November, 1984 riot and of persons killed/incapacitated in terrorist violence in Punjab & Chandigarh w.e.f. the Session 2018-19. As per Circular No.Misc./A-1/1327-1627 dated 20.02.2024 (Already circulated by the Colleges Branch).
- (v) Additional seats for Border area and Rural area students:
- a) Two seats for the candidates belonging to rural areas should have passed the 10th and 12th class examination from the rural area to become eligible for additional seats meant for rural area students.
  - b) One seat for the candidates belonging to border areas should have passed the 10th class examination from a school situated in border area and the 12th from a school situated in any other area to become eligible for additional seats meant for border area student. As per Circular No.Misc./A-1/1327-1627 dated 20.02.2024(Already circulated by the Colleges Branch).
- (vi) One Additional seat for Transgender Students:
- One additional seat be created for the transgender students from the session 2024-25 onwards in each course in the Panjab University Teaching Departments, Panjab University Regional Centres, Panjab University Constituent Colleges and the Colleges affiliated to the University, subject to the following eligibility conditions, provided the concerned Regulatory Body Permits.
1. The candidate seeking admission is otherwise eligible as per Panjab University Rules.
  2. The claimant candidate will have to submit a validated Transgender Certificate from the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment or Certificate of Identity as well as Identity Card issued by the District Magistrate as per the prescribed format given under 'The Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights) Rules, 2020 read with the Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights) Act, 2019.As per Circular No.Misc./A-1/1327-1627 dated 20.02.2024. (Already circulated by the Colleges Branch).
- (vii) Blind students who join a regular degree / Post-graduate degree courses at the Panjab University (Campus/Departments) would be allowed exemption from payment of tuition fee & would be provided free accommodation in the University Hostels. {Approved vide Syndicate Para (iv) meeting held on 19.08.1996}.

The free education to the completely blind student belonging to below poverty line, as described by the relevant Government notification/s, in any course in the University and its affiliated Colleges, subject to the students being otherwise eligible and on merit, but the candidate has to submit an affidavit to this effect issued by the competent authority. Even the free hostel accommodation may also be considered, if required by the students, but he/she will have to pay the mess charges, which are already subsidized. A limited number of course books (one per paper) may also be considered which would be returnable after the completion of the course. (Syndicate Para-1 dated 18.04.2009).

### WEIGHTAGES

The following weightages shall be given, wherever applicable, on the normalized aggregate marks arrived at or on academic weightage determined for qualifying examination for courses covered under the Entrance Test. However, these weightages, for those courses which are purely based on Entrance test, shall not be applicable.

- 15% Hons. weightage be given to candidates who have passed B.A./B.Sc./B.Com with Hons. either from Panjab University or from any other University.
- 5% of the marks thus obtained by such candidates as have passed the qualifying examination from Panjab University.
- Up to a maximum of 4% for distinction in any or all of the following co-curricular activities, achieved in any of the 3 years preceding to the year of admission (except for NCC for which the certificate once achieved is for lifetime).

**a) N.C.C.**

The holders of N.C.C. A, B and C certificates shall be given the weightage in marks as under: A : 1% B : 2% C : 3%

**b) N.S.S.**

The accreditation of A, B & C certificate & weightage 1%, 2% & 3% for NSS volunteers.

1. 'A' Certificate 1% of obtained Marks Completed One year (120 hours) and Participated in Seven day and night camp. (one Camp)
2. 'B' Certificate 2% of obtained Marks Completed Two years (240 hours) and Participated in Seven day and night camp. (two Camps)
3. 'C' Certificate 3% of obtained Marks Completed Three years (360 hours) and Participated in Seven day and night camp. (three Camps)

**c) YOUTH WELFARE**

- i) Youth and Heritage Festival: (Maximum of 3%)
- ii) Youth Training Camps: 1% marks per camp (subject to maximum 3%)
  - Participation in Youth Training Camp

## ADMISSION AFTER REVALUATION

Admission of students whose results are revised as a consequence of revaluation or otherwise late declaration of result, can be made only if :

- (i) Seats are available;
- (ii) Candidate is higher in merit than the candidate in the waiting list.
- (iii) The request is made before the last date for late admission with the prior approval of the Vice- Chancellor as already laid down.

The following Rule in the P.U. Cal. Vol. III, 2016 at page 489 will be followed in case of revaluation cases :

If as a result of Re-evaluation, a candidate passes the examination, he/she shall be eligible to seek admission to the next higher class within ten working days of the communication of re-evaluation result to him/her. His/her attendance shall be counted from the date of his/her admission. However, no candidate would be granted admission on the basis of revaluation results after 31st December of the academic session. In the case of admission to a course having Semester Exam, the date will be October 15. (Panjab University Handbook of Information, 2023-24)

In case of ongoing classes, each student whose result of the lower semester/class has not been declared, shall have to seek provisional admission with an undertaking to the effect that his/her admission shall stand cancelled if he/she fails to meet the eligibility requirement(s) for promotion to the next higher semester/class as per the rules and regulations of the course. The date of start of teaching of ongoing classes shall be notified by the Dean of University Instruction and the counting of attendance for the purpose of calculation of shortage of lectures will be made from the above-said notified date of start of teaching. If the candidate, whose result of lower semester/class has not been declared, seeks the provisional admission after the start of teaching, his/her attendance will be counted from the notified date of start of teaching and not from the date on which he/she seeks provisional admission. The candidate after the declaration of result of lower semester/ class will have to deposit the due fees within ten days of such declaration in order to get his/her admission confirmed. (Syndicate Para No. xliii of 30.04.2017)

### CERTIFICATE CONCERNING GAP YEARS :

An affidavit in duplicate from each candidate having gap year seeking admission to the College to the effect that he/she was not disqualified by any Board/Body/Council/University and he/she was not already registered with the Panjab University (wherever applicable), must be obtained by the concerned College before allowing admission. In case the candidate was disqualified, the period of disqualification and the activities in which the candidate was involved during the period of disqualification, should be indicated by the candidate in the said affidavit. No candidate will be admitted under any circumstances during the disqualification period. In case of re-admission after a long spell, the candidate must quote his/her old Registration Number/PUPIN of the Panjab University. ## BACHELOR DEGREE PROGRAMMES

### New Undergraduate Programmes as per the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020

The DAV College, Chandigarh is pleased to introduce a revised Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (CCFUP), as per the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, implemented by Panjab University Chandigarh. The new framework is based on the guidelines issued by the University Grants Commission's (UGC) New Delhi. The emphasis on this framework has been put on a student-centric focus, flexible choice-based credit system, and a multidisciplinary approach. It also provides multiple entry and exit options, which allows the students willing to pursue higher education, align their education with their career aspirations by choosing subjects/fields of their interest.

### Certification and Duration of Study with Multiple Entry Multiple Exit (MEME)

The undergraduate degree will have a flexible duration of either three or four years, with multiple exit options during this period. The table below outlines the various certifications a student can earn at different stages of their undergraduate study:

### Multiple Entry and Multiple Exit Options

The Multiple Entry and Multiple Exit (MEME) scheme will be implemented in undergraduate programmes in compliance with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the guidelines set forth by the University Grants Commission (UGC), and the framework implemented by the Panjab University, Chandigarh. This structure gives students the freedom to join, leave, and rejoin the programme at different points, each with a certification as stated in Table 1 above.

The students need to note that the four-year interdisciplinary Bachelor's curriculum is the recommended option, as it offers them the chance to focus on Major and Minor subjects of their choice, while also experiencing a wide spectrum of holistic and multidisciplinary education.

Credit-based courses and projects focused on environmental education, value-based education, and community engagement will be part of the undergraduate curriculum. Students will also have the chance to participate in research internships with teachers and researchers at their own or other Higher Education Institutions (HEIs)/research institutions, as well as internships with local firms, industries, artists, and craftspeople. These hands-on learning opportunities are essential to improving students' learning and employability.

**The maximum time in which a student will be allowed to complete the Degree is Seven Years.**

### Semester and Credit Structure

A standard academic year is divided into two semesters, each semester spanning a minimum of 15 weeks. In addition to this, an eight-week summer term is also included in the academic calendar.

During the summer term, students are encouraged to engage in internships, apprenticeships, or work-based vocational education and training. This is particularly beneficial for students who plan to exit after two or four semesters of study.

### Choice of Courses

Undergraduate students will make course selections from the various lists approved by their respective College/ CDOE/University Department/PURC. The choices will fall into categories as outlined below:

#### Major Course:

This is the primary subject area a student wishes to delve into during their undergraduate course. It is the area of study that the student is most passionate about and may wish to pursue as a career. Students may be permitted to change their major within the broad discipline at the end of the second semester, providing them with ample time to explore interdisciplinary courses during their first year.

#### Minor Course:

This is a secondary area of study that complements the student's chosen Major. Students who complete a sufficient number of courses in a discipline or an interdisciplinary area of study other than their chosen Major will qualify for a Minor

in that discipline or interdisciplinary area. A student may declare their choice of Minor and vocational stream at the end of the second semester.

#### **Multidisciplinary Course:**

All undergraduate students are required to complete three introductory-level courses relating to any of the broad disciplines. These courses aim to broaden the student's intellectual experience and form part of liberal arts and science education. Students are not allowed to choose or repeat courses already taken as their proposed Major and Minor stream under this category.

While choosing a subject under Multi-Disciplinary Courses (MDC), students will have to keep in their minds; the following two restrictions, which are mentioned in UGC's document (see page 21, 5.1.3).

- (a) The student must not have studied that course in 10+2 level.
- (b) The student must not have taken that course as a core subject (major/minor).

#### **Ability Enhancement Course (AEC):**

These are Modern Indian Language (MIL) & English language courses focused on enhancing language and communication skills. The courses aim to enable students to acquire and demonstrate core linguistic skills, including critical reading and expository and academic writing skills. The courses also emphasize the development and enhancement of skills such as communication, and the ability to participate in/conduct discussion and debate.

#### **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):**

These courses aim to impart practical skills, hands-on training, soft skills, etc., to enhance the employability of students. The institution may design courses as per the students' needs and available institutional resources.

#### **Value Added Course (VAC):**

These courses are designed to provide extra skills or knowledge beyond the standard curriculum, often tailored towards enhancing employability, promoting entrepreneurship, or developing personal and professional skills.

#### **PUNJABI COMPULSORY/HISTORY CULTURE OF PUNJAB**

The students who are not domiciled in Punjab and have not passed Punjabi upto class 10th/12th can opt History & Culture of Punjab in place of Punjabi (Compulsory).

#### **ENVIRONMENT, ROAD SAFETY EDUCATION AND VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN & CHILDREN AND DRUG**

Environment, Road Safety Education and Violence against Women & Children and Drug is a compulsory paper, which the candidates are required to pass with at least 33% marks either in the First Year (Semester System) or in Second Year/Third Year of the Course, failing which the Degree will not be issued.

## ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES AS PER THE NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY (NEP) OFFERED AT THE COLLEGE

### 1. BACHELOR OF ARTS (B.A./B.A.(Hons.)/B.A. (Hons. With Research) 1st year

1.1 A candidate who has passed one of the following examinations with English as one of the subjects shall be eligible to join the 1st Semester of B.A./B.A.(Hons.)/B.A.(Hons. With Research) degree course of the College. However, a person who has not qualified English as one of the subjects at the +2 examination, shall be eligible to join B.A./B.A.(Hons.) 1st Semester provisionally subject to his/her passing the deficient subject of English from the parent Board/Body/Council/University in two consecutive chances after his/her admission, failing which his/her admission to B.A.(Hons.) 1st Semester and the result for the examination shall automatically stand cancelled.

- (i) B.A./B.A.(Hons.) Part I (Old Scheme)/Pre-Medical/Pre-Engg. Intermediate Arts/Science/Agriculture examination of Panjab University;
- (ii) the +2 examination under 10+2+3 system of education of a recognised University/Board/Council;
- (iii) Prak/Shastri/Visharad examination with Compulsory English;
- (iv) any other examination recognised by Panjab University, Chandigarh as equivalent to (i),(ii) or (iii) above.

1.2 A candidate who has been placed under compartment in the +2 examination conducted by a Board/Body/Council/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of B.A./B.A.(Hons.) course, provided he/she fulfills the following conditions:-

- (i) He/she should have been placed in compartment in one subject only;
- (ii) He/she should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which he/she had been placed in compartment; and
- (iii) He/she should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in the aggregate of the examination as laid down in the relevant regulations.

The admission of the candidate with a compartment as indicated above shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after the candidate has cleared the compartment in one consecutive chance subsequent to the qualifying examination. In case the candidate does not clear the compartment at one chance allowed to candidate subsequent to the date of the qualifying examination, the provisional admission of the candidate to the course shall stand cancelled.

Provided that a candidate joining the B.A./B.A.(Hons.) first semester should have obtained at least 35% marks in the aggregate of all the subjects (including the marks obtained by him/her in the subject of compartment, theory & practicals taken together) taken up by him/her at the +2 examination.

**NOTE:-** Candidates securing less than 20% marks in the subject of compartment in +2 examination is eligible to join B.A./B.A.(Hons.) 1st Semester, if they clear their compartment subject in the supplementary examination held in July/August, on or before the last date for admission with late fee with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor, provided the seat/s is/are available.

- (b) +2 Examination with at least two of the subjects mentioned in (a) securing at least 50% marks in aggregate;
- (c) +2 Examination who does not covered in (a) and (b) securing at least 55% marks.
- (d) Any other examination recognized by the University as equivalent to (a) or (b) or (c) as given above with requisite percentage of marks given under each clause.

**Provided further that:-**

A candidate who has been placed under compartment in the +2 examination conducted by a Board/Body/Council/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Year of B.Com./B.Com. (Hons.) Course, provided the candidate fulfills the following conditions:

- (i) should have been placed in compartment in one subject only;
- (ii) should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which the candidate had been placed in compartment; and
- (iii) should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in the aggregate of the examination as laid down in the relevant regulations.

The admission of the candidate with a compartment as indicated above shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after the candidate has cleared the compartment in one consecutive chance subsequent to the admission. In case the candidate does not clear the compartment at any of the two consecutive chances allowed to candidate subsequent to the date of the admission, the provisional admission of the candidate to the course shall stand cancelled.

2.2 Subject to the reservation rules made by the Panjab University, Chandigarh the admission shall be on merit. The merit for this purpose shall be determined based on the score of a candidate to be computed as follows:-

- (i) Percentage of marks in the qualifying examination;
- (ii) Add score of 2 for each of the subjects passed from the subjects referred in List of subjects in 2.1 not exceeding a score of 8 in total.

**Explanation:** In case of a compartment candidate, eligibility shall be determined by including the marks of the subject in which the candidate has been placed in Compartment.

**NOTE:** The candidates securing less than 20% marks in the subject of compartment at the +2 examination be made eligible to join B.Com. 1st Semester, if they cleared their compartment subject/s in the Supplementary Examination held in July/August, on or before the last date for admission with late fee with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor, provided the seat/s is/are available.

### **3. Bachelor of Computer Application (B.C.A/B.C.A (Honours) / B.C.A (Honours with Research) 1st year**

3.1 A person who has passed one of the following examinations shall be eligible to join the First Year of B.C.A./B.C.A (Honours) course:-

- (i) +2 examinations in any discipline with at least 50% marks and passed Mathematics as one of the subjects at Matriculation level;  
OR
- (ii) Any other examination recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent to (i) above.  
shall be eligible to join B.C.A./B.C.A (Hons.) 1st Semester provisionally subject to his/her qualifying the deficient subject of English from the parent Board/Body/Council/University in two consecutive chances in the Supplementary Examination held in July/August, subsequent to his/her admission, failing which his/her admission to B.C.A./B.C.A (Hons.) 1st Semester and the result for the examination shall automatically stand cancelled.
- (iii) Subject to the reservation made by the University (governed by Chandigarh UT administration rules), the admission shall be on merit basis.

**Note:** 5% weightage will be given for subject of Mathematics/ Statistics or equivalent to the candidate who studied the subject at 10+2 level at the time of admission in B.C.A./ B.C.A.(Hons.) 1st semester.

3.2. A candidate who has been placed under compartment in+2 examination conducted by a Board/Body/Council/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of B.C.A./B.C.A (Hons.)/B.C.A (Honours with Research) course provided he fulfils the following conditions:-

- (i) He/She should have been placed in compartment in one subject only;
- (ii) He/she should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which he had been placed in compartment; and
- (iii) He/she should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in aggregate of the examination (subjects) as laid down in the relevant regulations.

The admission of the candidate with a compartment as indicated above shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after the candidate has cleared the compartment in one consecutive chance subsequent to the qualifying examination. In case the candidate does not clear the compartment at one chance allowed to candidate subsequent to the date of the qualifying examination, the provisional admission of the candidate to the course shall stand cancelled.

**Provided that:-**

(i) A candidate joining the B.C.A./B.C.A. (Hons.) First Semester should have obtained at least 50% marks in the aggregate of all the subjects (including the marks obtained by him/her in the subject of compartment, Theory & Practical/s taken together) taken up by him/her at the +2 examination.

**NOTE:** The candidates securing less than 20% marks in the subject of compartment at the +2 examination will be eligible to join B.C.A./ B.C.A (Hons.) 1st Semester, if they clear their compartment subject/s in the Supplementary Examination held in July/August, on or before the last date for admission with late fee with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor, provided the seat(s) is/are available.

#### **4. BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION {(B.B.A./ B.B.A Honours / B.B.A Honours with Research)} 1st Semester:**

4.1 Admission to the first semester of B.B.A/ B.B.A. (Hons.) Degree course shall be open to a person who has passed one of the following examinations conducted by a recognized Board/Council/University:

- (i) +2 examinations securing at least 50% marks in aggregate;
- (ii) Any other examination recognized by the University as equivalent to (i) as given above with requisite percentage of marks.

Provided that a candidate seeking admission to the first year of B.B.A/ B.B.A. (Hons.) should have passed in the subject of English at the +2 examination and in cases where passing in English is not necessary according to the regulations of certain Boards/Bodies/Councils/ Universities in India, the admission of the candidate shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after a candidate has cleared the subject of English as a deficient subject from the parent Board/Body/ Council/ University in two consecutive chances subsequent to the admission. In case a candidate does not clear the relevant subject at any of the two consecutive chances allowed to him after the date of the admission, provisional admission of the candidate to the course shall stand cancelled.

Further that:

A candidate who has been placed under compartment in the +2 examination conducted by a Board/Bodies/Councils/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Year of B.B.A/ B.B.A. (Hons.) Course, provided the candidate fulfils the following conditions:

- (i) should have been placed in compartment in one subject only;
- (ii) should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which the candidate had been placed in compartment; and
- (iii) should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in the aggregate of the examination as laid down in the relevant regulations.

The admission of the candidate with a compartment as indicated above shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after the candidate has cleared the compartment in one consecutive chance subsequent to the qualifying examination. 4.2 Subject to the reservation made by the University, the admission shall be on merit. The merit for this purpose shall be determined on the basis of the score of a candidate to be computed as follows:

(i) Percentage of marks in the qualifying examination;

**Explanation:** In case of a compartment candidate, eligibility shall be determined by including the marks of the subject in which the candidate has been placed in Compartment.

**NOTE:** The candidates securing less than 20% marks in the subject of compartment at the +2 examination be made eligible to join B.B.A 1st Semester, if they cleared their compartment subject/s in the Supplementary Examination held in July/August, on or before the last date for admission with late fee with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor, provided the seat/s is/are available.

4.3 The affiliated colleges situated in the territorial jurisdiction of UT administration shall follow the reservation policy of UT Administration, Chandigarh for the various categories whereas the affiliated colleges situated in the State of Punjab shall follow the reservation policy of Government of Punjab.

Relaxation of % of marks for the purpose of determining eligibility for various categories viz. SC/ST/OBC (non -creamy Layer)/ BC / Differently abled candidates shall be given as per the guidelines of the respective Governments.

(Honours) degree course in a College affiliated to Panjab University. However, a person who has not qualified English as one of the subjects at the +2 examination, shall be eligible to join B.Sc /B.Sc. (Hons.)1st Semester provisionally, subject to his/her qualifying the deficient subject of English from the parent Board/Body/Council/University in two consecutive chances in the Supplementary Examination held in July/August, subsequent to his/her admission, failing which his/her admission to B.Sc. 1st Semester and the result for the examination shall automatically stand cancelled. The basic requirement for admission to B.Sc./B.Sc. (Hons.) 1st year programme is as follows:

The +2 examination of a recognised University/Board/Council; OR any other examination recognised by the University as equivalent.

Provided that –

- (i) a person joining the B.Sc./B.Sc. (Hons. ) course must have obtained at least 35 per cent marks in the aggregate of the qualifying examination and has studied Science subjects as per Table A.
- (ii) The details of teaching hours, marks and credits allocated to each course (Theory and Practicals) are given in respective Syllabi.

The admission of the candidate with a compartment as indicated above shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after the candidate has cleared the compartment in one consecutive chance subsequent to the qualifying examination. In case the candidate does not clear the compartment at one chance allowed to candidate subsequent to the date of the qualifying examination, the provisional admission of the candidate to the course shall stand cancelled.

**Provided that:-**

A candidate joining the B.Sc. /B.Sc. (Hons.) First Semester should have obtained at least 35% marks in the aggregate of all the subjects (including the marks obtained by him in the subject of compartment, Theory & Practical/s taken together) taken up by him/her at the +2 examination.

### ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR B.A., B.Com., B.C.A., B.B.A., B.Sc. and B.Sc. (BIOTECHNOLOGY) 3RD AND 5TH SEMESTER.

Any candidate who is admitted to the 1st/3rd/5th semester will be allowed to be promoted to 2nd/4th/6th semester respectively. However, for promotion from 2nd to 3rd or from 4th to 5th semester the candidate will have to clear 50% of the total credits/papers till that semester. It is further clarified that for calculating 50%, fractions like 2.5, 3.5 or 4.5 will be considered 3, 4 or 5 respectively.

### BACHELORS OF EDUCATION

#### B.A. B.Ed. (4 year Integrated)

B.A. B.Ed. is a four year integrated course comprising of 8 Semesters. Minimum qualification for admission to first semester for the course will be: 10+2 examination of any board/University, which is recognized by Panjab University as

equivalent, with at least 50% marks (45% marks in case of SC/ST).

### **B. Voc Degree in Food Science and Technology**

**Seats:** 50

**Eligibility:** 10+2 in any stream with 45% marks.

B. Voc Degree in Food Science and Technology is affiliated with Panjab University, Chandigarh.

The B. Voc degree program is a full time degree course under UGC National Skill Qualification Program (NSQF).

Candidates will be eligible to receive Certificate after the first 2 semesters ( One Year), Diploma after 4 semesters (Two Years Year) , three years degree after six semesters, four years degree/PG Diploma after eight semesters( four Years) according to Panjab university B. Voc NEP template dated 2.2.2024.

No candidate will be allowed to join any other course or service simultaneously.

There shall be an examination at the end of each semester.

### **B. Voc Degree in Medical Lab Technology**

**Seats:** 50

**Duration:** Three Years Degree Course

**Eligibility:** 10+2 Science (Medical/Non-Medical) with 45% marks.

B. Voc. Degree in Medical Lab Technology is affiliated with Panjab University, Chandigarh.

The B. Voc degree program is a full time degree course under UGC National Skill Qualification Program (NSQF).

Candidates will be eligible to receive Certificate after the first 2 semesters ( One Year), Diploma after 4 semesters (Two Years Year) , three years degree after six semesters, four years degree/PG Diploma after eight semesters( four Years) according to Panjab university B. Voc NEP template dated 2.2.2024.

No candidate will be allowed to join any other course or service simultaneously.

There shall be an examination at the end of each semester.

### **Certificate course in Cosmetology and Beauty Care**

**Seats:** 50

**Duration:** One Year

**Eligibility:** 10+2 in any Stream with 45% marks.

Diploma in Cosmetology and Beauty Care under UGC National Skill Qualification Program (NSQF) is affiliated with Panjab University, Chandigarh.

Candidates will be eligible to receive a Certificate after the first 2 semesters (1 Year) according to Panjab university B. Voc NEP template dated 2.2.2024.

### **Diploma in Medical Lab Technology**

**Seats:** 50

**Duration:** Two Years

**Eligibility:** 10+2 Science (Medical/Non-Medical) with 45% marks.

Diploma in Medical Lab Technology under UGC National Skill Qualification Program (NSQF) is affiliated with Panjab University, Chandigarh.

Candidates will be eligible to receive Certificate after first 2 semesters ( 1 Year) and Diploma after 4 semesters( two Years) according to Panjab university B.Voc NEP template dated 2.2.2024.

### **ONGOING UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES**

The candidate who is admitted in third and fifth semester will be allowed to be promoted to second/fourth/sixth semester respectively. The candidate must fill the Examination form of 4th Semester or 6th semester, as the case may be. However, for promotion from second to third or from fourth to fifth semester the candidate will have to clear 50% of the total papers/credits till that semester. It is further clarified that for calculating 50% fraction, like, 2.5, 3.5 or 4.5 will be considered as 3, 4 or 5 respectively. This applies to all ongoing undergraduate classes.

### **B.A. 2nd year & 3rd year (old system)**

Every student is required to study the same subjects in B.A. 2nd year & 3rd year as he or she had studied in BA 1st year (Semester I & II). Change of subjects is not allowed.

No 'Failed' candidate shall be admitted in any of the courses. (The students whose admission forms were duly sent by the Department/College to the Controller of Examinations for appearing in the examination, but did not appear, will also be considered as 'failed' students under University Rules.

### **B.A. (Honours)(old system)**

The college offers Honours to the students (Session 2024-25) in the following subjects: English, Hindi, Punjabi, Economics, Political Science, Sociology, Public Administration, Geography, History and Psychology.

A student may be offered Honours in Second Year (Session 2024-25) in any one of the elective subjects mentioned above to be studied by him/her in all the three years of the Degree course. Provided that he/she has obtained at least 50% marks in the subject of honours in the First Year of the BA. (General) Course

### **B.Com (Honours) old system**

A student who has secured at least 50% marks in B.Com I shall be eligible to opt for Honours in B.Com II. The Honours examination shall consist of two papers out of which paper I shall be taken along with the IInd year exam and paper II with the final year exam.

The college offers two options

- ii) Business Finance & Accounting
- ii) Banking

### **B.Sc. (Honours) Old system**

The college offers Honours to the students (Session 2024-25) in the following subjects: Physics and Chemistry

A student may opt for Honours in Second Year (Session 2024-25) in any one of the elective subjects mentioned above to be studied by him/her in all the three years of the Degree course. Provided that he/she has obtained at least 50% marks in the subject of honours in the First Year of the B.Sc (General) Course.

## POSTGRADUATE DEGREE PROGRAMMES

### Master of Commerce

#### M.Com (Business Economics)

This is a two year course divided into four semesters. The admission to this course will be on the basis of merit calculated as per rules and Regulations for M.Com. (Business Economics) (effective from the session 2015-16).

1. The minimum qualification for admission to the first semester of the course shall be-
  - (i) A Bachelor's/Post-graduate degree in any discipline of the University or a degree of any other University which has been recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent thereto with not less than 50% marks in the aggregate. Provided that in case of candidates having Bachelor's degree of the University through Modern Indian Languages [Hindi/Urdu/Punjabi (Gurmukhi Script)] and/or in a Classical Language (Sanskrit/Persian/Arabic) or degree of any other University obtained in the same manner recognized by the Syndicate, 50% marks in the aggregate shall be calculated by taking into account full percentage of marks in all the papers in language excluding the additional optional paper, English and the elective subject taken together.
 

**OR**
  - (ii) Pass in the final examination conducted by the (a) Institute of Chartered Accountants of India or England (b) Institute of Cost and Works Accountants of India or England and (c) Institute of Company Secretaries of India.
 

**OR**
  - (iii) AMIE examination with 50% marks or more after having passed the diploma examination with 60% marks or above and have at least 5 years research/ teaching or professional experience.
 

**OR**
  - (iv) Any other qualification as recognized by the Syndicate for this purpose.
2. Admission will be made on the basis of entrance Test PU-CET (PG) + Merit (50% weightage to entrance and 50% weightage to qualifying exam)

**Note:** Any changes in the PU ruling will be followed at the time of admissions.

#### MASTERS OF COMMERCE (M.Com)

The duration of the course shall be two academic years. Each year shall be divided into two semesters. Admission to M.Com is based on merit. The admission will be made strictly according to Panjab University rules.

#### Eligibility

The minimum qualification for admission to the first semester of the course shall be:

- (i) A Bachelor's degree in Commerce with not less than 45% marks in the aggregate.
 

**OR**
- (ii) B.Com. (Hons.) Degree with not less than 45% marks in the aggregate.
 

**OR**
- (iii) A graduate with Honours in Economics OR, Mathematics OR Statistics OR Commerce with not less than 45% marks in the aggregate.
 

**OR**
- (iv) A graduate with 50% marks in aggregate having offered either Economics, Mathematics, Statistics OR Commerce as a subject in the examination

Provided that in case of candidates having Bachelor's degree of the University through Modern Indian Languages (Hindi/Urdu/Punjabi (Gurmukhi Script) and/ or in a Classical Language (Sanskrit / Persian / Arabic) or a degree of any other University obtained in the same manner recognised by the Syndicate 50% marks in the aggregate shall be calculated by taking into account full percentage of marks in all the papers in Language excluding the additional optional paper, English and the elective subject taken together.

**OR**

- (v) A candidate who has passed B. Voc. (Banking, Insurance & Retailing) and B. Voc. (Retail Management) shall be eligible to get admission in the course with not less than 45% marks. OR
- (vi) An associate of the (i) Institute of Chartered Accountants of India or England or (ii) Institute of Cost and Works Accounts of India or England;

**OR**

- (vii) A pass in the final examination conducted by the Institute of Company Secretaries of India;

**OR**

- (viii) Any other qualification recognized by the Syndicate for this purpose.

## **MASTER OF ARTS**

### **M.A. in English, Economics, Psychology, Public Administration & Sociology**

Admission will be made strictly in order of merit. for admission to M.A. (1st semester). In case the College/ Department decides to hold Entrance Tests at their level, the following procedure will be followed besides the rules/regulations of Panjab University governing eligibility in a particular subject.

- (i) Academic Weightage 60%
  - a. 10th Class 10%
  - b. 10+2 Class 10%
  - c. B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com. 40%
- (ii) Written and Oral Test / Aptitude Test 40%
  - a. Written Test of one hour duration 25%
  - b. Aptitude Test (wherever applicable) 15%
- (iii) Weightage for Panjab University 5%
- (iv) Weightage for Honours 15%

The duration of the course of instruction for the Master of Arts examination shall be two years and the examination shall be held in four semesters. First and Third semesters shall be from July to December and Second and Fourth semesters shall be from January to May, respectively, or as decided by the Vice-Chancellor. The examination shall be conducted at the end of each semester only in those courses which have been offered in that semester.

A person who has passed one of the following examinations from the Panjab University or an examination recognised by the Syndicate as equivalent thereto, shall be eligible to join the M.A. degree course: –

- (i) A Bachelor's degree obtaining at least 45 per cent marks in the subject of Postgraduate course or 50 per cent marks in the aggregate.
- (ii) B.A. with Honours in the subject of the Postgraduate course or B.Sc. Hons. School course.
- (iii) Master's degree examination in any other subject. Provided that-
  - (a) For the Public Administration course, a person who has passed B.A. with 45 per cent marks in any one of the subjects - Political Science or Economics or Sociology or Psychology or History.
  - (b) For Post Graduation in Psychology a Bachelor's degree obtaining atleast 45% marks in the subject (Psychology as full paper in each semester) and 50% marks in the aggregate from a recognized University or B.A. (Honours) with Psychology.
  - (c) For the Economics course, a person who has passed the B.Com. examination with 45 percent marks in the subject of Economics shall also be eligible.

- (d) For Sociology Course
- (i) Subject weightage will be given to candidates who have taken six full papers in Sociology in B.A. course.
- (ii) Weightage for Hons in Sociology (15%). Weightage shall be given in Hons in Sociology in case the candidate has studied ten papers (6+4=10).

**Explanatory Note:**

- 67 marks out of 150 shall be accepted as 45% marks in the subject of Postgraduate course.
- A candidate shall be deemed to have passed the examination if he obtains 35% marks in each paper. Each candidate shall be required to obtain pass marks in each course of theory and practical separately for each semester.

**The following are not eligible for admission to M.A. courses:**

- (a) If a student fails to pass M.A. Part/Semester-I or fails to appear in the examination even though he/she had requisite attendance, he/she is not allowed to seek re-admission for M.A. Part/Semester-I in the same subject.
- (b) If a student fails to meet the prescribed attendance requirement, and is, therefore, debarred from sitting in the examination, or does not on his/her own volition seek permission to sit in the examination he/she should be deemed to have failed in the examination. Such a student is not allowed to seek re-admission in the same Department;
- (c) If a student fails to earn promotion to the M.A. Part-II or the next semester of M.A. for any of the reasons specified in Paras (a) and (b) above for two successive years in the same or two different Departments, he/she is debarred from seeking admission in any Departments.
- (d) In order to ensure the implementation of the above conditions, the columns given in the Admission Form, seeking information from the applicant on the course(s) attended by him/her in the preceding three years must be filled by him/her.

If he/she leaves these columns blank, the admission form will be rendered invalid and if he/she makes a misstatement or conceals relevant facts, his/her admission will be cancelled even if made.

**MASTER OF SCIENCE (M.Sc.)**

The College offers the Master of Science programme in the following subjects: Biotechnology\*, Chemistry\*, Zoology\*, Physics\* and Mathematics.

\*Admission to these courses will be on the basis of entrance test PU-CET (P.G.) conducted by the Panjab University. Only the rank holders in these entrance tests will be considered for admission. 50% weightage will be given to the score in entrance test & 50% to the score in the qualifying examination.

**Biotechnology**

**Eligibility**

Bachelor's degree in Physical, Biological, Pharmaceutical, Agricultural, Veterinary, Fishery Sciences, Engineering, Technology Medicine (MBBS) with at least 55% marks.

**Chemistry**

**Eligibility**

- a) B.Sc. Honours School examination of the Panjab University in Chemistry.
- b) B.Sc. examination of the Panjab University securing at least 50% marks in the subject of Chemistry and 50% marks with Chemistry & Mathematics along with anyone of the following subjects: Biochemistry, Botany, Geology, Physics, Statistics, and Zoology. Provided that a student who had not taken up Mathematics as one of the subjects in B.Sc examination may be admitted to M.Sc. (2 Year Course) in Chemistry on the condition that he passes an additional paper in Mathematics in the first semester examination securing at least 40% marks.

- c) Awarded B.Sc. Pass degree under the old B.Sc. Honours School regulations by the Syndicate on the recommendation of the Board of Control;
- d) B.Sc. Honours School examination in the subject of the M.Sc. from any other University recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent to (a);
- e) B.Sc. examination of any other University recognized by the Syndicate securing at least 50% marks in aggregate with Chemistry & Mathematics along with anyone of the following subjects:  
Biochemistry, Botany, Geology, Physics, Statistics, and Zoology.

### Mathematics

#### Eligibility

- a) B.Sc. Honours in Mathematics of Panjab University.
- b) B.A./ B.Sc. with Honours in Mathematics of the Panjab University or from any other University recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent there to.
- c) BA/B.Sc. (Pass) with Mathematics having either at least 50 %marks in the aggregate or at least 45% in Mathematics of the Panjab University or from any other University recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent thereto.

### Physics

#### Eligibility

- a) B.Sc. Honours School in Physics from Panjab University.
- b) B.Sc. (Pass) with Physics having at least 50% marks in aggregate, from the Panjab University or from any other University recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent thereto.

### Zoology

#### Eligibility

B.Sc. (Pass) with Zoology having at least 50% marks in aggregate, of the Panjab University or from any other University recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent thereto.

## POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA COURSES (EVENING CLASSES)

The College offers the following Postgraduate Diplomas in the evening:

1. Postgraduate Diploma in Computer Application
2. Postgraduate Diploma in Marketing Management
3. Postgraduate Diploma in Mass Communication

The duration of each course is one year. The classes of these courses would be held in the evening.

#### How to Apply

On the spot admission would be granted to these courses on a first come, first serve basis. Candidates should appear for the interview with all documents and completed application forms as per admission schedule.

#### Post Graduate Diploma in Marketing Management (P.G.D.M.M)

##### Eligibility

The minimum qualification for admission to First Semester of the above two courses shall be:

- (i) A Bachelor's/ Post-graduate degree in any discipline of the University or a degree of any University which has been recognised by the Syndicate as equivalent thereto; with not less than 45% marks in the aggregate:  
Provided that in case of candidates having Bachelor's degree of the University through modern Indian Languages (Hindi / Urdu / Punjabi (Gurmukhi Script) and / or in a Classical Language Sanskrit / Persian / Arabic) or a degree of any other University obtained in the same manner, recognised by the Syndicate, 45% marks in the aggregate shall be

calculated by taking into account full percentage of marks in all the papers in Language excluding the additional optional paper, English and the elective subject taken together.

**OR**

- (ii) A pass in the final examination conducted by (a) Institute of Chartered Accountants of India or Institute of Chartered Accountants of England and Wales, or (b) Institute of Cost and Works Accountants of India or Institute of Cost & Management Accountants incorporated by Royal Charter, London, or (c) Institute or Company Secretaries of India.

**OR**

- (iii) AMIE examination with at least 50% marks.

### **Postgraduate Diploma in Computer Applications (P.G.D.C.A.)**

#### **Eligibility**

- i. Graduate (B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./ B.C.A. under 10+2+3 system of examination) with atleast 50% marks in any discipline.

**OR**

- ii. B.E. / B.Tech.

**OR**

- iii. B.Voc. (Software Development), B.Voc. (Hardware and Networking) and B.Voc. Multimedia (Graphics & Animation) course with at least 50% marks.

**OR**

- iv. Any other examination recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent to (i) or (ii) above with at least 50% marks in any discipline.

### **Post Graduate Diploma In Mass Communication (P.G.D.M.C)**

#### **Eligibility**

A Bachelor's, Postgraduate Degree in any discipline of the University or a degree of any other University which has been recognised by the Syndicate as equivalent thereto.

### **Post Graduate Diploma in Cosmetology and Beauty Care**

**Seats:** 50

**Duration:** One Year

**Eligibility:** Graduation in any Stream with 50% marks.

### **Post Graduate Diploma in Food Processing and Quality Control**

**Seats:** 50

**Duration:** One Year

**Eligibility:** Graduation in any Stream with 50% marks.

### **ADMISSION TO P.G. COURSES FOR B.VOC. GRADUATES**

"Students with B.Voc. Degree should be considered eligible for the trans-disciplinary vertical mobility into such courses where entry qualification is a Bachelor Degree without specific requirement in a particular discipline", as per U.G.C. Notification No.D.O. No.F.-2-7/2017 (CC/NVEQF)/Misc. dated 3rd/4th August, 2016, Point No.(ii).

### **GUIDELINES FOR REGULAR STUDENTS**

Eligibility Rules for the University Semester Examination

The students can appear in university examination only if they fulfil the following conditions:

- (1) A student has to attend 75% of the total lectures delivered to the class in each subject including practical classes during each semester.

- (2) A student of B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com., etc. must obtain at least 25% marks in aggregate of all subjects in terminal examinations to be held in September 2024 and March 2025.

**Note**

A special test may be held at the discretion of the Principal, and the student shall qualify in the special test only if he/she obtains at least 30% marks in the aggregate of all the three elective subjects. If a student fails to obtain the required percentage of marks, his/her candidature from the University exam will be withdrawn.

**Environment Education & Road Safety Examination**

This is a compulsory qualifying paper, which the students have to study in the B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com. / BBA / BCA.

The students are required to qualify this paper either in the 2nd year or 3rd year of the course. The examination is conducted by the University. If not already cleared by old students of 1st year.

**Note:** Admission criteria and course contents are subject to revision by Panjab University.

**Rules for Withdrawal**

1. A student who wishes to leave the college must apply in writing to the Principal; the application must be countersigned by his parent or a responsible guardian. No student will be permitted to leave the college until he/ she has cleared all the college dues.
2. A student must pay the college fees and all other dues until his/ her name is formally withdrawn.

**Refund of Fee**

1. If a student chooses to withdraw from the program of study in which he/she enrolled, the Institution concerned shall following four-tire system for the refund of fees remitted by the student
2. The HEIs concerned shall deduct an amount not more than 10% of the aggregate fees as processing charges from the refundable amount.
3. Fee shall be refunded by all HEIs to an eligible student within fifteen days from the date of receiving a written application from him / her in this regard.
4. Refund forms will be available at the College Website [www.davchd.ac.in](http://www.davchd.ac.in)
5. Prospectus Fee (Rs 850/-) is Non Refundable.

**System of Continuous Assessment for Postgraduate Classes**

The under mentioned mode of Testing and Evaluation is followed.

- 1) Mid Semester Exam-80%.
- 2) Continuous Assessment-20%

Continuous Assessment may include written assignments, snap tests, participation in discussion in the class, term papers, attendance, etc.

**Security**

Security deposited with the college at the time of admission will be refunded when a student leaves the college.

**Cancellation of Seats / Admissions**

Admission of all such students who fail to attend atleast 33% of the total lectures delivered and practicals held in all the papers during the first 10 days from the start of teaching work in the course concerned, shall be cancelled by the College after following the procedure given below:

1. By the 12th day after the start of classes for a particular course, that names of those students who fail to attend at least 33% of the total lectures/ practicals shall be put up on the college Notice Board. Within 4 days of the date of such notice, a student who is short of attendance may give in writing the reasons for his/her absence from the classes.

2. If a student does not submit an application in writing within the prescribed time as stated above, or the reasons adduced by the student in his/her application are not found to be sufficient and justified in the opinion of the authorities, his/her admission shall be cancelled by the college.
3. All the seats thus falling vacant shall be filled from the waiting list or through subsequent counselling.
4. When the admission of the student is cancelled as stated above, the college shall display on the Notice Board the list of the person(s) next in the waiting list and make admissions accordingly.

**Note:** It is obligatory on the part of students to keep in touch with the college for the possibility of the seats to fall vacant. In case a student absents himself continuously for 5 days, his/her name will be struck off the College rolls automatically.

#### **Verification of Certificates:**

All certificates submitted by the candidates at the time of application in support of their claims shall be checked against the originals at the time of interview.

For the marks obtained, the original certificates shall be ones issued by the University/Board concerned only, and NOT by any Principal of a School/College.

In case a candidate happens to have surrendered the original certificate to an institution/ office, as for re-evaluation etc., a copy of the certificate duly attested by the candidate himself / herself, or a Class-1 Officer of the University or a Gazetted Officer may be considered, after a satisfactory explanation from the candidate. Admissions based on such certificates shall be treated as provisional.

A certificate, submitted by the candidate in support of a claim made by him/her, should be in the format prescribed by the issuing authority. No deviation from this shall be made.

#### **Verification of SC/ ST Certificates**

The admission of the SC/ST candidates producing the requisite certificates of being SC/ST for admission to various courses at this college/university is made provisional subject to verification of the certificates from the issuing authority.

#### **Discipline**

- The college lays special emphasis on the maintenance of discipline and proper decorum in and outside the classrooms.
- Students are expected to show proper respect to their teachers, be polite to one another and show courtesy to the employees of the college.
- To create the right academic atmosphere in the college, the students should maintain silence while moving on the campus and sitting in the library. Movement from one room to another should be orderly.
- In vacant periods, the students must move to the library.
- Absence from the composition or tutorial period entails a fine and disciplinary action.
- Smoking and ragging are strictly prohibited on the College Campus and Hostel Premises. Crossing through lawns is to be avoided.
- No cycling is permitted on the College Campus. All cycles/scooters/ motorcycles/cars should be parked in the space provided for them. The students are not allowed to park cars either inside or outside the College.

Quarrels and disputes with fellow students should be avoided. A complaint in writing should at once be made to the Principal whenever there is a dispute. The students should not take the law into their own hands.

Students who violate the above rules shall be liable to punishment which may be in the form of a heavy fine, withdrawal of concessions and stipends and in extreme cases, expulsion from the college.

Use of mobile phones in teaching areas by the students is strictly prohibited. A fine of Rs. 1000/- would be levied on any student caught violating this rule.

### **Dress Code**

Articles of Clothing should be as per the guidelines i.e. inappropriate articles of clothing are strictly prohibited in the college campus.

### **PRIZES**

#### **Academic**

#### **Based on University Examination**

Two prizes shall be awarded in each elective subject. If the total number of students in a subject is less than ten, there will be only one prize.

The qualifying marks will be at least 60% for science subject.

#### **Other than Academic**

Prizes, Roll of Honour are also awarded for outstanding achievements in sports, community service and extracurricular activities.

### **Hostel Admission**

For admission to the College Hostels, a separate Prospectus is available on the college website. Until accompanied by his/her parents or a responsible guardian, no student is admitted to the Hostel. Admission to the College Hostels can be refused without assigning any reason.

### **Hostels for Girls**

Hostel accommodation will be provided strictly on merit for 400 girls in the hostels attached to the college campus. All essential facilities are available to the boarders. AC rooms are also available. Maintaining security, academic atmosphere and providing hygienic food to the boarders will receive utmost attention of authorities.

### **Hostel for Boys**

Hostel accommodation will be provided strictly on merit for about 250 students.

Ragging is strictly prohibited in or outside the hostels. Anyone found guilty will be dealt with strictly and may even be expelled from the college.

### **Counselling**

College also provides the services of a professional counsellor for the students who fall prey to the stress and strain of academic burden or face other personal problems.

### **Aid to Students**

The college does its best to look after the needy and deserving students and arranges help for them in the form of books, grants, scholarships and lump sum grants from the Students Aid Fund. Various organizations and individuals have also instituted some scholarships. The meritorious students in academics as well as in sports get incentives. For all the scholarships, the students must apply in writing to the Principal / Scholarships Committee.

All types of State, Central Govt, scholarships are available in the college as follows:

- 1) The Govt, of India Scholarships under: -
  - a) National Loan Scholarship Scheme
  - b) National Talent Scholarship

- c) Sports Talent Scholarship
  - d) Post Matric Scholarships for students belonging to Scheduled Castes.
  - e) Grants-in-aid scheme of scholarships to students from non-Hindi speaking states for Post Matric studies in Hindi.
  - f) National Merit Scholarship Scheme
2. U.T. Administration Scholarship for SC/ST students only.
  3. Sports Authority of India Scholarship for outstanding sportsmen.
  4. Students Aid Fund Scholarship-from the UGC and partly from the college.
  5. Donor Scholarships.
  6. The college awards five special scholarships to deserving students of Sanskrit for the promotion of the language.

### Half Fee Concession in Tuition Fees

This is open to all students. For availing this concession, the income of the parents of the student from all sources should be up to Rs. 1,00,000/- per annum. The student must fill a separate form, available in the college office in case he/she wishes to avail of this concession.

### General Rules for Scholarships

1. All cases for help are scrutinized by a duly constituted committee. The scholarship will be distributed strictly according to Merit. The decision of the committee will be final.
2. A lump sum aid is granted to:
  - a) Pay college dues
  - b) Meet hostel expenses
  - c) Purchase books and
  - d) Incur other expenditure considered necessary and useful for the student.
3. Applications are considered as long as the funds last.

All students belonging to Scheduled Tribes/Scheduled Castes/Other Backward Classes will get application forms for Government of India/State Government scholarships from the college office and submit them duly completed within one week from the date of admission. There are two kinds of application forms for Scheduled Caste/Tribe students-one for the fresh candidates and the other for renewal of those who enjoyed scholarships in the previous year. The College will not be responsible if there is any delay in getting the scholarship.

Fee concessions, Stipends and scholarships of all categories are liable to be withdrawn if performance in studies falls or a student remains irregular in attendance or is found guilty of misbehaviour. Deserving students, who take part in Arya Samaj and Arya Yuvak Parishad Activities, attend prayer meetings and other lectures and functions regularly will be shown regard at the time of awarding concessions, stipends and allotment of seats in the Hostel. Students can apply afresh for concessions if they show creditable results in the House Examinations.

### College Leave Rules

Leave must be applied for in advance on the prescribed leave form available from the office on payment. In case a student absents himself/herself continuously for five days, his/her name will be struck off the college rolls automatically. The maximum leave allowed to a student during the year is 15 days only. In case of serious illness, the leave application must be submitted as soon as possible along with the medical certificate. Leave up to 3 days will be granted by the tutor and more than 3 days by the Principal.
