



## GOKHALE INSTITUTE OF POLITICS AND ECONOMICS (GIPE)

Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics (GIPE), Pune, was established in 1930 by the Servants of India Society (SIS). It is the oldest research and training institute in Economics in the country. It is dedicated to research into the socio-economic dimensions of Indian society and carries forward the legacy of Gopal Krishna Gokhale. Gokhale laid the foundation of the Servants of India Society in 1905. His rationale was to promote education and develop capabilities among Indians to govern a newly independent nation. Over the decades, the Institute has established strong credentials in empirical and analytical research. In recognition to its contribution to higher learning and research in Economics, the Institute was awarded the status of institution Deemed to be a University, in 1993.

*The objectives of the Institute comprise two broad paths – research and teaching.*

### **(a) Research:**





The presence of reading rooms within the library building makes the learning environment more conducive of going beyond the text books.


- **Presence of Research Centres creating an unique research -oriented learning environment**



- **Computer lab**







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# B.SC. ECONOMICS 4 -YEAR PROGRAMME



## Overview

The B.Sc. Economics programme is designed to provide students with a solid foundation in economics, promoting interdisciplinary learning and skill development. The programme focuses on critical thinking, research, and community engagement, offering flexibility with multiple entry and exit points. It ensures holistic development through a combination of major, minor, skill enhancement, and value-added courses. Total mandatory credit requirement after completion of four years is 168 credits.







## M.SC. ECONOMICS (FINANCIAL ECONOMICS)

The two year M.Sc. Economics (Financial Economics) Programme is designed to be a rigorous and analytically innovative course that imparts advanced training in analytical and critical skills comprising data analysis, problem-solving, performing data visualisation, and expertise in machine learning algorithms with Python and R programming languages, MS Excel and other econometric software like STATA, SQL, Power BI, Tableau and EViews. Our students get comprehensive hands-on training on various Corporate Valuation Models such as DCF Modeling, LBO, Merger Modeling, in-depth understanding of pricing and valuation of financial derivatives and fixed income using various applications. The financial economics specialisation keeps in line with the Gokhale Institute's contemporary methods of underpinning theoretical knowledge with quality training, interpretation and application of real-time situations in the financial industry at large.



## M.SC. ECONOMICS (AGRI BUSINESS ECONOMICS)

The two year M.Sc. Economics specialisation in Agri Business Economics trains students to be well-versed in major economic fields, be it the corporate world or as economists working in research and service organisations. The programme exposes students to the disciplines of Agriculture Finance and Risk Management, Supply Chain Management and Econometrics for Data Analytics and Visualization. They equip students with core economic principles as well as with advanced quantitative techniques to analyse questions of business and policy. Our students are imparted with practical skills and an introduction to the knowledge of the Bloomberg database along with other mandatory studies of software and applications such as Python, Advanced MS Excel, SAS, SQL, Power BI, Tableau, STATA and R. Our students are capable of capturing innovations in the agriculture markets and analysing their effects on overall efficiency. Apart from these courses, the students also learn about the Agricultural Policy Framework in India, Agricultural Finance and International Trade in Agriculture.






## M.SC. ECONOMICS (INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS ECONOMICS AND FINANCE)

The two year M.SC. Economics (IBEF) programme helps the students learn broad aspects related to the international business environment, export management, FDI policy, FTP policy, international trade theories, international trade bodies like WTO, international logistics and supply chains, international relations, several aspects of international finance and foreign portfolio investment. Added emphasis has been laid on strategic alliances, international technical/financial collaboration and joint ventures, to enable the students to discharge efficient services and to tackle practical situations in a business environment. Along with this, students are trained in data analysis and various quantitative techniques in Statistics and Econometrics using packages like Python, R, STATA, SQL, Power BI, Tableau, SPSS, and MS Excel, and hands-on training/knowledge on databases such as Bloomberg Terminal and Trade Analytics.

The students need to complete sixteen compulsory courses and four elective course each one of four credits.

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
## M.SC. ECONOMICS (POPULATION STUDIES AND HEALTH ECONOMICS)

The two years M.Sc. Economics specialisation in Population Studies and Health Economics is designed to impart in-depth knowledge of Population Studies- dynamics of population change along with its linkages with humanities. This course examines the interrelationship of the population with different social, economic, health and nutritional phenomena, in addition to examining complex digital and demographic data using computational methods. Introduction of Health Economics completes the missing link of the courses on Population and Health. This gap is bridged here, considering importance of functioning of health system, healthcare delivery and utilization along with health financing and health insurance.

At the end of the programme , the student is expected to learn pricing and forecasting methods and models used by actuaries. The programme familiarises students with core data science methods, machine learning in demographics, and demographic and social science methods for understanding digital data. Moreover, students engage with large-scale healthcare data like census (microdata), NFHS, NSS, LASI, HMIS, population census, etc. Students also get adequate software and machine learning training in software like Python, Stata, ArcGIS, SQL, Power BI, Tableau, DICOM, PACS, R Programing, SPSS, SOCSIM, JAS-mine, and NETLOGO.


## M.SC. ECONOMICS (PUBLIC POLICY)

Started in academic year 2023-24, the two year M.Sc. Economics (Public Policy) offers an opportunity to understand problems in public policy framing and conduct robust, applied and impactful studies that influence public policy. This programme gives students a keen understanding of issues in public policy and its relationship with empirical research evidence that significantly influences the public policy process. They can design research problems, undertake a range of policy-relevant studies, and conduct research to the highest standards. Students are exposed to soft skill development, such as presentation and communication, the impact of public policy on primary, secondary, and tertiary sectors in select advanced and emerging markets and project management. They will also conduct impact analysis of public policy, evidence-based policy evaluation, project assignment, fieldwork, and dissertation.



## **M.A. ECONOMICS**


The Master of Arts in Economics is a postgraduate programme in economics comprising training in economic theory, econometrics, and applied economics. The objective of the programme is to offer students theoretical knowledge in addition to training in tools required for empirical research and analysis to evaluate the economy and government policy. The programme is designed to equip students to pass various civil services and competitive examinations. The programme blends economics with other social science disciplines, namely, politics and sociology, to develop a holistic understanding of the political economy. The programme focuses on current, real-world economic issues and trains students in applied analytics and quantitative skills.



Within the programme, the students are equipped with the knowledge of software like R, STATA, Advanced MS Excel, SQL and Python. Making the students well versed in the theoretical and practical application of economics, the programme enables them to understand and tackle real-life world scenarios with an expertised mindset. A special focus on quantitative research and research methods inculcates an unbiased scientific approach towards the question at hand. From research to analytics, the programme provides first-hand experience to the students, making them eligible to step into any career branch - public sector, corporate, research or academic too.

The students need to complete sixteen compulsory courses and four elective course each one of four credits.

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

## POST GRADUATE PROGRAMME IN FINANCIAL ECONOMICS (PGPFE)



This course will equip the students to provide real-time solutions to the issues related to the financial markets. Total number of credits is 48.







The Common University Entrance Test (CUET) will provide a common platform and equal opportunities to candidates nationwide, especially those from rural and remote areas, and help establish better connections with the universities. A single examination will enable the candidates to cover a wide range of outreach and be part of the admissions process to various universities. Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics is a participating University for CUET (UG &PG) 2025 and the selection will be **based on CUET score** for B.Sc, M.A and M.Sc programme (Table 1).
- Students are advised to check the official website of NTA (National Testing Agency) for registration dates and information on CUET—PG—20 25 and CUET—UG—2025, respectively.

Cancellation of admissions and refund of fees shall be as per the UGC Norms published by the commission from time to time and cancellation of admissions will be through online System only.




## IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS

- Admission will be based on merit and no Management Quota is available.
- Candidates are required to generate Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) ID from website <https://www.abc.gov.in/> and enter the same in the application form. **The ABC ID is mandatory** for filling up of the application form.
- The preferences given by the candidates during filling up the form for M.Sc programme will be considered as final and cannot be reversed after submission.
- In case of any dispute, the decision of the **Admission Committee** of the Institute shall be final and binding on the candidates.
- Admission to the Programmes will be provisional and shall be subject to confirmation by the “**Admission Committee**” of the Institute upon physical verification of original documents.
- The submission of all original documents/certificates within a stipulated time is mandatory.
- The decision of the **Admission Committees** in the matter of admission, verification of documents and programme-wise allocation of seats shall be final and binding on the candidates.
- Candidates shall submit the following original certificates at the time of document verification:




- The schedule , process and procedure of admissions shall be notified separately on the website of the institute.
- The candidates must ensure to have all mandatory documents with them before depositing “Admission fees”.
- The institute will not be responsible for any monetary loss of a candidate if he/ she is not eligible for admission in any category/quota and he/she deposits admission fees.
- The candidates, who are admitted to the programme require to give two undertakings as per the UGC norms and Government of Maharashtra resolution at the time of admission/document verification without fail (See ANNEX X).
- Students have to abide by all the rules and regulations of the institute.
- Maintaining 75% attendance in all the courses are compulsory, failing to which students will not be allowed to sit for the examination.
- All the admitted students admitted are advised to bring their own Laptop in the classroom.

## APPLICATION & ADMISSION PROCESS FOR HOSTEL

Limited hostel accommodation (on sharing basis) are available. Out of four hostel buildings three of them are, exclusively for P.G students located in the residential campus (800 meter from GIPE) and one of them (for girls only) are outside the residential campus (within 500 meter from GIPE).

- Admission will be given in the hostel based on the merit list at the time of admission to the respective programme as per the Institute norms.
- Allocation of seats will be based on vacancy, merit and reservation policy.
- Student to login to the web portal <https://erp.gipe.ac.in/login.htm>. After the applicant converts into a student, i.e. by paying the admission fee, the applicant login now gets converted to the student's ERP login. Once the Student logs in to the web portal, student can apply for the hostel.
- If a student meets the eligibility criteria outlined in the hostel rules, regulations, merit list, and reservation policy, they are qualified to submit an application for hostel accommodation. If the student gets the hostel accommodation, the hostel fee tab gets activated.
- After filling in the asked details and submitting the hostel fee, the room in the hostel will be allocated to students. Students have to show the Payment receipt to the Hostel warden to occupy the room and follow the hostel check-in formalities.
- At a time of admission to hostel, every student shall sign an undertaking that the student shall follow the Rules and Regulation laid down by the Institute. In case breach of the any of them student shall be liable for the disciplinary action.
- Students are required to disclose all past medical history at the time of admission to the hostel. Any non-disclosure of past medical history is at risk of the students.
- If any student provides any false statement or information in the hostel admission form, the students' admission shall be liable to be cancelled. On such cancellation, the student shall not be entitled to enter in the hotel or part thereof.







- For the Boy's hostel, 'Wing-I' is a double occupancy and 'Wing II' is a triple occupancy per room.








## HOSTEL ADMISSION CANCELLATION AND REFUND

- Refund of Hostel Fees on cancellation of admission will be made after three months on cancellation after keeping 18% of the processing fees with the Institute.
- This facility of refund of an amount on cancellation will be applicable up to the permissible date being received through UGC Notifications for cancellation of admissions for the year 2025. It will be notified in due course through ERP / Website after receipt of formal notifications from the UGC.
- After the notified last date from the UGC for cancellation of admissions, there will not be any refund on cancellation of admissions except Caution Money deposited at the time of admission
- The policy of refund for cancellation of Hostel admissions is subject to ratification from Finance Committee and Executive Council of the institute and changes / variance if any in rules / policy will be communicated to the students from time to time as the case may be.
- No Pro-Rata fees adjustments will be there irrespective of admission on a later date or cancellation after admission in the hostels.
- Any student who is expelled from the Institute will automatically cease to be a hostel student. In such a case, the hostel fee will not be reimbursed, except for caution money deposited at the time of admission.




## HOSTEL RULES

- The Institute has limited Hostel accommodation on a shared basis. The rooms will be allocated randomly and no reshuffling is possible. The inmates shall not interchange their allotted rooms without prior permission of the Rector. Requests for the same shall be entertained only on medical grounds. Hostel authority deserves the right to do any kind of reshuffling of rooms or change in room allotment and compliance is mandatory.
- Students are required to inform the Hostel Superintendent whenever they change their room to ensure that room changes are properly documented for administrative and safety purposes. Changing rooms without informing the HS may result in disciplinary actions.
- Ragging inside or outside the Institute campuses is strictly banned. Legal action will be initiated against students involved in ragging, as per provisions of the UGC Anti-Ragging Regulations, 2009. - Students are expected to conduct themselves in a manner befitting the Institute's stature. Students shall not indulge in any activity which may bring disrepute to the Institute.
- The inmates should observe decorum in the hostels and the residential campus. Since the hostels are located in a residential area, loud music, late-night activity, and partying on the campus are not permitted. Students shall not cause any discomfort or inconvenience to other fellow students or other residents on the campus.
- Celebration of birthdays inside the hostels and the residential campus is not permitted.
- Consumption of alcoholic drinks, smoking, eating paan/tobacco products and spitting is strictly prohibited on the Hostel / Residential campus.
- Subscription to the hostel mess is compulsory for all inmates. Students residing at the hostel shall be required to pay the mess charges upfront along with the tuition fees. No instalment in these payments is admissible. No refund towards mess fees deposited is admissible in case of non- availing the hostel mess facilities due to any reason.



- The Institute shall appoint a Mess Committee comprising of Student Representatives, Hostel superintendent, Members of the teaching/non-teaching staff and the Manager/Representative of the Mess Contractor. The Committee shall oversee the general functioning of the student mess and shall monitor the quality, cleanliness, maintenance and upkeep of the kitchen/dining hall, etc.
- The use of electrical appliances such as heaters, irons, immersion rods, etc., is not permitted in the rooms. Under no circumstances cooking shall be permitted in the hostels.
- The inmates shall be responsible for the cleanliness of their rooms. They are expected to clean their room on their own and keep the hostel premises clean.
- Resident students shall consciously develop water and energy-saving habits and avoid wasteful, improper use of water and electricity, as well as amenities such as furniture, water coolers, washing machines, etc. provided in the hostels.
- Under no circumstances shall students be permitted to allow any person to stay overnight in their rooms.
- Male students/visitors are not permitted to enter the Girls' Hostels.
- Female students are not permitted to enter the Boys' Hostels.
- Students shall not bring and/or keep any pets on the premises including fish, cats, dogs, and so on. Students should desist from pampering stray dogs by offering food, petting them etc.
- Unauthorized guests or outsiders in the hostel room are strictly prohibited. Guests may be allowed on the prior written permission of the Hostel superintendent/ Rector. Any student keeping an unauthorized person in his/her room will be liable to disciplinary action amounting to expulsion from the hostel.
- Students shall treat the staff and housekeeping staff of the Hostel with due courtesy at all times. Service of the housekeeping staff shall NOT be utilized for private or personal work. No tips in cash or kind will be given to the staff of the Hostel.
- The Institute will not be responsible for any loss of money or valuables. Students are advised not to keep ornaments, jewelry, and large sums of money with them.



- The gates of the residential campus shall remain closed from 11.30 p.m. to 5.00 a.m. No student shall be permitted to leave or enter the campus during the above period except with prior permission of the Hostel superintendent or Rector or any other official authorized by the Institute.
- Aimless roaming on the campus will not be allowed by the students during the above-mentioned period. All the inmates will be expected to be in their allotted rooms.
- Please note informing the hostel superintendent/rectors getting permission for leave is only related to hostel records. Regarding academic matters (e.g. fulfilment of requirement of attendance criteria and appearance in examination, mode of examination etc.) student has to abide by the instruction of the Programme coordinator/examination section/ academic office and rules of the GIPE.
- The Rector and Campus Secretary have the discretion to inspect any room at any time.
- Resident students must vacate their rooms within a week after completion of the semester-end examination of the second and fourth semesters and hand over the room keys to the authorized official.
- The inmates shall be responsible for the hostel property in their charge. They shall be required to pay the cost of repairs in case of damage caused by them to the furniture, electric fittings or the building, painting etc., whether intentionally or otherwise. Damages of any kind to the properties of the Hostel Rooms, Buildings and Mess, Furniture and Equipment etc. due to mischievous behaviour from the students will be recovered from the Caution Money Deposit and if the damage is more than the amount available in this deposit, it may be recovered from students separately by issuance of proper notices. In any of the case, Caution Money will not be refunded to the student after completion of the course and on non-payment of damaged cost, the clearance of the course will be held up depending upon decision of the authorities of the institute.
- The Hostel authority reserves the right to terminate the occupancy of the student for any willful disobedience or defiance of authority, non-observance or frequent violation of hostel rules, causing damage to person or property or indulging in anti-national or undesirable activities. In such cases, the deposit shall be forfeited and fees will NOT be refunded.

## AMENDMENT AND INTERPRETATION OF RULES

The institute may alter, suspend, and/or amend any of these regulations, at any time without any prior notice. Students are deemed to have read these rules and regulations and to have agreed to be bound by them, including any changes that may be made therein, from time to time.




## UNDER THE BANYAN TREE (UTBT)
