## **2. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMITTING STUDENTS FOR 2024-2025 BATCH U.G. / P.G. / Ph.D. / GENERAL PROGRAMMES / DIPLOMA PROGRAMMES**

**HITS eligibility criteria for admissions are in line with the various statutory bodies. such as UGC, AICTE, COA, BCI, PCI, INC, NMC, etc.**

**International / National level Competitive Exam Scores (JEE/CAT/CLAT/GRE/GMAT/etc.) are accepted for admissions along with HITSEE, HITSCAT, etc.**

### **Eligibility – B.Tech. Programmes**

Admission will be based on merit, considering the Entrance exam marks along with Plus Two / HSC / Intermediate / CBSE / ICSE / equivalent examinations marks, etc., as per the University norms:

- ❖ Passed 10+2 examination with Physics / Mathematics/ Chemistry / Computer Science / Electronics / Information Technology / Biology / Informatics Practices / Biotechnology / Technical Vocational subject / Agriculture / Engineering Graphics / Business Studies.
- ❖ Obtained at least 50% marks (for the reserved category as per Government norms) in the above subjects taken together.

OR

- ❖ Passed D.Voc. Stream in the same or allied sector.

### **Cambridge norms (General Certificate of Education – GCE)**

University of Cambridge General Certificate of Education (GCE) ‘A’ Levels / Edexcel GCE ‘A’ Levels and Other GCE ‘A’ Level Examinations conducted by Cambridge International Examinations / British Examining Bodies

- International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) or General Certificate of Secondary Education (GCSE) or GCE ‘O’ Levels (11 years of schooling), equated to the 10th grade of an Indian Board
- Advanced Subsidiary (AS) Level (12 years of schooling), equated to the 11th grade of an Indian Board
- GCE ‘A’ Levels (13 years of schooling), equated to the 12th grade of an Indian Board

The candidates intending to join first-year E&T courses should have studied the General Certificate of Education (GCE), Cambridge Assessment International Education. And required to have obtained ‘Advanced’ Level passes in Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry / Biology / any Technical Vocational subject, and English at AS level.

## **Eligibility – B.Des. Programmes**

A Pass in 10+2 in any stream from any recognized board of education.

Obtained at least 50% marks (for the reserved category as per Government norms) in the qualifying examination. **OR**

Passed D.Voc. Stream in the same or allied sector.

## **Eligibility - Vocational Stream Candidates**

HSC - Vocational Candidates:

Candidates who have qualified with HSC (vocational stream) with Engineering / Technical vocational subjects and any one or two of the related subjects like Mathematics, Physics, or Chemistry are eligible, provided they have passed their qualifying examinations and obtained a minimum aggregate of 50% marks in the vocational & related subjects.

## **Eligibility-B. Arch. Programme**

i) Qualified in the National Aptitude Test in Architecture (NATA) conducted by the Council of Architecture (COA) in 2024.

ii) Passed an examination at the end of the 10+2 scheme of examination with at least 50 percent Aggregate marks in Physics, Chemistry, and Mathematics, and also at least 50 percent marks in aggregate of the 10+2 level examination.

**OR**

iii) Passed 10+3 Diploma Examination with mathematics as a compulsory subject with at least 50 per cent marks in aggregate.

**No direct lateral admission is allowed at any other year / stage of  
B.Arch. course based on any qualification.**

## **ELIGIBILITY FOR LATERAL ENTRY (LES) - II YEAR**

### **For B.Tech. Programmes (Admission to direct second year)**

Passed minimum THREE years / TWO years (Lateral Entry) Diploma examination with at least 50% marks (for the reserved category as per Government norms). **OR**

Passed B.Sc. Degree from a recognized University as defined by UGC, with at least 50% marks (for the reserved category as per Government norms) and passed 10+2 examination with Mathematics as a subject. **OR**

Passed B.Voc / 3-year D.Voc. Stream in the same or allied sector.

## **For B.Des. Programmes (Admission to direct second year)**

Students after completion of the Diploma are eligible to join B.Des. courses.

Students pursuing a Diploma in any related courses of Interior / Communication with subjects whose credits can be mapped to the B.Des. course can be considered on a case-by-case basis.

If the credit mapping cannot be done with the course they are pursuing, the student has to complete all the subjects as offered in the B.Des programme.

## **ELIGIBILITY FOR MCA PROGRAM**

Passed any graduation degree (e.g., B.E. / B.Tech. / B.Sc / B.Com. / B.A. / B.Voc. / BCA etc.) preferably with Mathematics at 10+2 level or at Graduation level.

Obtained at least 50% marks (for the reserved category as per Government norms) in the qualifying Examination.

## **LATERAL ENTRY FOR MCA (Direct admission to the final (second) year)**

Passed B.Tech. / B.E. (CSE / IT) / B.C.A (4 years), subject to the availability of seats in the 2<sup>nd</sup> year.

## **6. Facilities Available in the Institution**

### **6.1. GENERAL AMENITIES AVAILABLE IN THE CAMPUS TRANSPORTATION.**

A full-fledged Transport Department functions in Hindustan University with various Types of Buses (i.e., Ashok Leyland, TATA, Bharat Benz & Eicher) to provide transport facilities to Students and Staff from various places in and around Chennai and adjoining areas. This Service is offered to ensure a hassle-free and Safe transportation. The University is operating 40 Buses to provide a transport facility for Students and staff of Hindustan Institute of Technology & Science from Various Places in the city.

#### **Accommodation**

The university has a fully furnished, air-conditioned guest house which can accommodate 40 guests at a time. The hostels have well-furnished air-conditioned and non-air-conditioned rooms with a bath attached, providing the right ambience for studies.

Every hostel (both boys' and girls' hostels) is provided with a dining hall, uninterrupted water supply, reading hall, internet connection, indoor recreation facilities, and continuous medical and transport facilities. Canteen and fast food centers are open from 7:00 am to 9:00 pm.

#### **The following facilities are established at the Hostel**

- a) Reception with help desk/enquiry counter.
- b) Visitors & parents lounge.
- c) Hostel Office.
- d) Security Vigilance Office with monitoring mechanisms.
- e) Hostel Infirmary & Pharmacy.
- f) Recreation complex with indoor games.
- g) Well-equipped Gym.
- h) 'Sports Café' for refreshments.

#### **Banking Facilities**

A nationalized bank and ATM facilities are available within the campus.

#### **Campus Clinic**

The University has a full-fledged Clinic on campus with a doctor and supporting staff available for service. Free checkup and treatment are provided. Vaccination camps are arranged periodically. A dedicated Ambulance Facility is also available 24/7 on the University Campus.

#### **Solar Plants and Back-up Power Facility**

The on-grid solar power generation system reduces the electricity expenses and has an alternative form of power generation, a clean and renewable energy source. HITS has established solar plants on the campus for green energy. Two solar plants with a capacity of 450 kW and 100 kW are established at the institute and are operational, generating approximately 50000 Units per month.

HITS has four DG sets with different capacities of KVA (180, 380, 500 & 725 kVA), which provide the standby supply to the entire campus during the EB power failure, without interrupting day-to-day work.

### **RO Water Plants**

To overcome the daily water demand, HITS has established four “Reverse-Osmosis” water treatment plants, and the treated water is supplied to the entire campus for drinking purposes.

### **Sports Facility**

HITS has an excellent infrastructure with all facilities for sports and recreation, which help students to improve their physical and mental well-being, thereby producing outstanding sports persons. Excellent sports equipment is available in the Department of Physical Education. Our sports and recreation facilities include 20 courts for outdoor games such as tennis, football, cricket, Basketball, Shuttle, horse riding, and athletic running tracks. 06 Indoor courts for games such as Rock/wall Climbing, Carom, Table tennis, and Chess are available, including the ones inside hostels.

### **Reprographic facility**

The institute has established a reprographic facility at various places, which are networked. In addition, the institute has its own Reprographic vendor (M/s Balaji Xerox) near the Bay store, which offers printing, copying, and binding services to staff and students. Printing machine operators use photocopying machines and printers to produce all kinds of documents, leaflets, pictures, etc. This vendor also offers high-quality scanning facilities at a reasonable price.

### **Auditoriums**

The University has 10 auditorium halls equipped with a public address system, LCD and projector facilities, where Conferences are held. Seminars, Workshops, and University functions are conducted.

Students of HITS are immensely encouraged to participate in cultural activities. The Auditoriums of HITS have capacities ranging from 200 to 1,000 students and are used to host a wide range of cultural festivals annually, which include Yarona, Graffiti Rock Concert, Music Orchestra, Dance Fest, Film Festivals, Colors of Youth, and K-Pop.

### **Open Air Theatre**

The Open-Air Theatre is used for celebrations and functions.

## **SAFETY AND SECURITY MEASURES ON THE CAMPUS**

**Security Measures:** Security guards, Vigilance Officers, CCTVs, Security fences, gates, surveillance cameras, and lighting are established at the institute to deter criminal activity and enhance safety.

**Emergency Preparedness:** The Hindustan University has well-defined protocols for various emergencies, such as fires and natural disasters. These plans are communicated to staff, students, and visitors.

**Access Control:** Restricted access to certain areas of the campus, such as dormitories or administrative offices, is ensured to prevent unauthorized entry and enhance safety.

**Campus Safety:** The presence of security guards and a vigilance team for 24/7 is ensured to respond to incidents, maintain order, and contribute to campus safety.

**Technology Integration:** HITS uses technology such as biometric scanners or mobile apps for reporting incidents, hostel administration, and attendance monitoring.

**Safety Education and Training:** Students, faculty, and staff are provided with training on safety procedures and awareness of potential risks regularly to create a culture of safety on campus.

**Food Safety:** The cafeterias functioning in the various centers of this institution for the use of students and staff members are operating as per the safety and security measures prescribed by the licensing authority.

### **Go-Green Initiatives**

Two **Solar** plants with a capacity of 450 kW and 100 kW are established at the institute, generating 50000 Units.

**STP** – Sewage Treatment Plant 150 KLD to treat sewage water for the usage of flushing and gardening. A new STP plant with a capacity of 450 KLD is coming up on the campus to cater to the needs.

**Biogas** - Food waste generated in HITS is converted to biogas for cooking purposes.

Garden waste – Garden waste converted into manure for garden purposes.

**E-charging Points** – The institute has established e-charging points for 4-wheelers and 2-wheelers, encouraging the use of e-vehicles.

**E-Cars** - The institute has e-cars (battery cars) for commuting within the campus by guests, executives, parents/visitors.

### **Parking Facility**

Designated Parking Areas are established on the campus for parking, including student parking lots, faculty/staff parking lots, visitor parking spaces, and accessible parking spots for individuals with disabilities. Different permits are issued for students, faculty/staff, and visitors to facilitate ease of parking.

## **LIBRARY AND LEARNING RESOURCES**

The Hindustan Institute of Technology and Science (HITS) Central Library, known as the Dr. K. C. G. Verghese Research and Resource Centre, is a modern, fully automated facility occupying 65,000 sq. ft. over three floors in the Founder's Block. The library maintains a vast collection including over 225,867 volumes of books, 240 national and international print journals, and 3,260 CDs/DVDs. It provides access to more than 24,563 e-journals and 235,243 e-books through subscriptions to Proquest Academic Complete and premier scholarly databases such as Scopus and the E-Journals from IEEE, ScienceDirect, Springer Nature, Cambridge University Press, and SAE.

The library is fully computerized using the LIBMAN Integrated Library Management System, enabling seamless acquisition, cataloguing, circulation, serials control, and an Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC). Access to digital resources is enhanced via platforms like Knimbus for effective

resource discovery and remote access, along with the mLibrary mobile app that offers users 24/7 library access on Android and iOS devices.

Services offered include Open Educational Resources (OER), Article Alert Service, Current Awareness Service (CAS), Selective Dissemination of Information (SDI), lending/referral services, reprographic facilities, question banks, and overdue alerts. The library also provides Turnitin plagiarism detection and AI writing detection software accessible to faculty, research scholars, and postgraduate students.

The HITS Book Bank serves undergraduate students in Engineering and Technology disciplines by issuing textbooks for the entire semester, ensuring equitable resource access. The Central Library functions on all working days, Saturdays, and Sundays, offering both physical and digital access to its extensive and continuously updated resources to support the academic and research excellence of the HITS community.

## **INTERNET POLICY**

Usage of Wireless infrastructure in hostels and common places is to enhance the accessibility of the internet for academic purposes and to browse exclusive online resources for students and staff.

Wi-Fi internet will be available in Hostels and Common areas. The availability and strength of the Wi-Fi signal may vary based on the location.

As per the IT data policy of HITS free Wi-Fi usage quota is limited per year to prevent misuse. Data usage policy may vary as per the directions of the Institution.

The Wi-fi access points provided in hostels and common areas are the property of the Institution, and any damage or loss of the equipment or related item will be considered a serious breach of the Institution's code of conduct. In the event of any loss or damage to the wireless infrastructure, it will be assessed, and the same will be recovered from all the students who are residing on that floor/building/hostel.

Any product of human intellect which is unique, novel, and non-obvious and which qualifies for protection under relevant acts of the government governing patent, copyright, etc., and developed at HITS belongs to the Institute. HITS shall be the owner of the work, including software created by HITS personnel with significant use of HITS resources. HITS shall have sole ownership of all intellectual property created by a student during his/her course of study in the Institute.

## **WI-FI ACCESS GUIDELINES**

Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI), a statutory body that controls the Internet Service Providers (ISPs.) in India has directed all institutions to take strong steps in strengthening the security of Wi-Fi networks and the users utilizing the HITS Wi-Fi services must be registered with authorities

and ensure that no other mobile networks, other than the registered one, is allowed in Wi-Fi network access. Hence, the Institution has the right to do lawful monitoring/logging of all internet users' activity and share it with statutory bodies, if required. Any user or device that accesses a Wi-Fi network shall:

Protect the user account from unauthorized users by not sharing the credentials with others for any reason/means. The student will be held responsible for any misuse of his/her account. ### **6.3 SERVICES FOR STUDENTS**

#### **Student Council**

As per the UGC norms, the HITS Student Council has been constituted with members from the different branches of study. The Council is headed by the President and members representing the foreign students on campus, boys' and girls' hostels, sports, cultural wing, NSS, NCC, etc. The Council members have to abide by the rules and regulations of the Institution. They must also manage and extend their support when any event or extra-curricular activities are held at HITS. In addition to this, they should adhere to the code of conduct of the Institution.

#### **Student Welfare Committee**

A Student Welfare Committee has been constituted in HITS. The members are faculty from different departments. The Committee is supported by the members of the Student Council. They aid in enhancing the discipline and development of students. The members of the Committee provide the right direction and counseling and guide the students for further improvement. The Committee also extends its help in improving the amenities for the students, which are required on the campus. The Student Welfare Committee meets once a month to review the welfare activities.

#### **Hindustan Centre for Corporate Social Responsibility (HCSR)**

The Hindustan Centre for Corporate Social Responsibility actively involves itself in eradicating extreme hunger and poverty, promoting education, promoting gender equality and empowering women, reducing child mortality and improving maternal health, and combating HIV, malaria, and other diseases. The Centre also works on environmental sustainability, employment-enhancing vocational skills, and social business projects. The HCSR ensures that the funds allotted by the Central and the State Governments for socio-economic development and relief, for the welfare of the Scheduled castes, the Scheduled Tribes, other backward classes, minorities, and women, reach the needy.

#### **Counselling / Mentoring Service**

HITS aims to help students excel in developing a holistic personality. Along with the emphasis on progress in academics, focus is maintained to help a student build on the 21st-century skills (4C's: Critical thinking, Creativity, Collaboration, Communication). In the crucible of social and emotional interactions, these skills are developed and fine-tuned with this goal in mind. HITS has a structured mentoring/counselling system on its campus, the best arena for holistic growth.

## **Mode of Counselling**

Each student is assigned a mentor, who provides constant support to the student. A ratio of 1:20 is maintained in the mentorship programme. The mentor is expected to meet the students at least once a month. Mentors can refer the students to the respective Department Mentorship Coordinator for assistance. In case of the need for further professional guidance, the student is directed to the University Counsellors, who are professionally trained to help students handle academic, career, and mental health issues. All ethics of counselling practice are well maintained in the programme.

## **The Counselling Services Include:**

### **Individual Counselling**

These sessions are aimed at helping students individually to handle Academic issues: lack of motivation to study, time management, and exam preparation.

**Behavioral issues:** addictions, peer pressure

**Emotional issues:** managing anger, stress, anxiety, and sadness.

**Social issues:** adjustments in the hostel, handling conflicts with peers and authorities, and relationship issues.

### **Group Counselling**

Proactive sessions are conducted in groups to provide awareness of the need for counselling and the availability of the counselling center on campus. In addition to this anti-ragging propaganda, strategies for interpersonal challenges and motivational talks are offered. Periodical visits to classrooms & hostels by the Counsellors as an additional support offered to the students to deal with adjustment challenges.

### **Academic Mentoring**

- Mentoring 1:20 (Mentor and Student Ratio).
- Personal enhancement and development schemes such as career counselling, soft skill development, career-path-identification, and orientation to well-being for the students.
- Group Career Counselling sessions by the training department. Individual need-based Career Counselling by trained counsellors and individual mentors.
- A General Orientation for all the students at the time of joining is conducted to keep them informed on the support system, Student Activity, Rules and Regulations, General Psycho Educational Programmes on various issues like suicide prevention, substance abuse, etc.
- General Psycho Educational Programmes on various issues like suicide prevention, substance abuse etc.,
- Soft skills and Personality development training programmes are conducted regularly by the Training Department.

Parents are regularly informed about their ward's progression in attendance, academics, behavior, etc. This communication is carried out through the following:

- Monthly progress report cards are sent through the post or email.
- Regular telephone calls are made to parents.

- Ramps and lifts are provided at various blocks for smooth mobility to enable them to access classrooms, laboratories, and various venues within the campus without any difficulty.

- A scribe will be provided during the examinations based on the request from the students.
- Based on the requirements, continuous staff assistance is provided in the library.

#### **1. MARSHALS COMMITTEE:**

1. To maintain students and staff discipline on the campus.
2. To conduct periodic meetings to review the disciplinary matters on campus.
3. To ensure all students enter the campus on time through regular supervision.
4. To maintain the campus free from ragging.
5. To monitor closely the various locations inside the campus to prevent the incident of ragging.
6. To conduct an enquiry into any complaints made by the first-year students.
7. To display anti-ragging boards on every floor in all buildings on the campus.
8. To conduct anti-ragging meetings every month and an anti-ragging rally once a year.

#### **2. WOMEN EMPOWERMENT CELL (WEC)**

1. Identification of strong leadership and change makers, and building the capacity of women.
2. To promote a culture of respect and equality for women.
3. The provision of opportunities and programs for female gender to be financially, mentally and emotionally empowered to promote their growth as individuals in their own right.

4. The Committee should find appropriate solutions to settle the problems faced by the women staff/students about matters relating to sexual harassment within 10 days after thorough investigation.

### **4. ANTI-DISCRIMINATION CELL**

1. The Cell will look into matters of depriving a student and a group of students on a particular caste, creed, religion, language, ethnicity, gender, disability, or any type, and matters of imposing conditions on any student which is incompatible with the dignity of human beings.
2. The Cell is constituted to safeguard the interests of students without any prejudice to their caste, creed, religion, language, ethnicity, gender, disability, and to eliminate discrimination or harassment against any student in Hindustan University by providing preventive measures to facilitate punishment for those who indulge in any form of discrimination to promote equality among the students.

### **12.1 HINDUSTAN INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY AND SCIENCE COUNSELLING SERVICE**

Counselling and faculty mentoring are given prime importance at Hindustan Institute of Technology and Science. Counselling is not about providing a solution to the problems; rather, it is about providing a direction towards a solution. Counselling involves providing free and confidential services to members of the University community. The staff and counsellors of Hindustan Institute of Technology and Science provide students the support and assistance they require to function effectively as learners, as members of the university

community, and as individuals. Hindustan Institute of Technology and Science Counselling Services is designed to assist students in striving towards achievement and to utilize their potential. The University Counsellors are professionally trained and share their experience and knowledge in academic advising, career counselling, and mental health issues. The Counselling Centre is thoroughly committed to the need for confidentiality in student/ client/ counsellor communications.

Therefore, confidentiality of student information is maintained with professional standards of ethical practice and conduct.

#### **The Counselling services include:**

- Personal Counseling
- Educational Counseling
- Career Development Programme
- Training and Internship Programme

The faculty and student ratio is maintained as 1:20 for all counselling and mentoring activities. Student details and counselling activities are maintained by each faculty mentor. All students will be assigned a counsellor within 15 days of joining their course. A staff counsellor will be provided to the student by the parent department, and the same staff counselor will provide counseling services for the student during his/her entire period of study at Hindustan Institute of Technology and Science. Faculty counsellors would keep a constant watch on absenteeism and non-performance of the students in the internal tests, which are major reasons for student problems. High-intensity problems that cannot be solved by the faculty counsellors will be referred to HUCS for further follow-up counselling sessions. A student who absents himself/herself for 3 continuous days will be identified by the faculty advisor, who will inform the parents. HUCS will also be organizing regular workshops and seminars to benefit the student community.
