

Session I & II - Outcome Based Education Policy and Perspectives

Dr. Joseph Charles Tamilmaran D , Assistant Professor, School of Management and Coordinator, Outcome Based Education The speaker introduced Outcome-Based Education (OBE) as an educational approach centered on defining specific learning outcomes or objectives that students are expected to attain by the end of a course or program. The emphasis was on what students should comprehend and accomplish, shifting away from a sole focus on what teachers should deliver. The speaker delved into the institution's OBE policies and perspectives, underlining the importance of clear learning objectives, alignment with institutional standards, and diverse assessment methods such as exams, projects, portfolios, and other evaluation forms. Professor Joseph advocated for OBE to adopt a student-centered approach, promoting active learning, critical thinking, problem-solving, and practical application of knowledge over rote memorization. He stressed the significance of educators employing various instructional strategies to facilitate students in reaching their intended outcomes. The speaker also underscored the necessity of



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transparency and accountability within OBE policies and the integration of quality assurance mechanisms to uphold high educational standards in programs.

Session II - Outcome Based Assessment and Evaluation

Dr. Joseph Charles Tamilmaran D, Assistant Professor, School of Management and Coordinator, Outcome Based Education discussed on the process of evaluating students' performance against specific educational objectives. Professor Charles also provided insights into a range of assessment tools and techniques, which encompass quizzes, exams, essays, projects, presentations, portfolios, observations, and performance evaluations. He highlighted that the selection of the assessment method depends on the nature of the intended learning outcomes. Additionally, the speaker addressed both formative assessment, which occurs during learning to provide ongoing feedback, and summative assessment, which determines overall achievement. The use of rubrics and evaluation criteria was also explained to ensure fairness and objectivity in assessments. Professor Joseph emphasized how assessments can contribute to making well-informed decisions regarding curriculum, teaching methods, and educational policies.


Session II - Interpersonal Relationship Skills







Report

Day 1 – Topic: Role of Teachers in Developing Curriculum

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Kristu Jayanti College organized a Faculty Development Programme on "Implications of Changing Paradigms of Higher Education in the Context of NEP 2020" on July 6, 2023. The session commenced with the Inaugural Address rendered by Fr. Dr. Augustine George, Principal, Kristu Jayanti College, on the "Role of Teachers in Developing Curriculum". Fr. Dr. Augustine George articulated the growth prospects of the college over the years and also focused on the futuristic view of the college for improving the quality paradigm of the institution. He also emphasized the role of teachers in providing quality education by adopting different teaching pedagogies and focusing on research. Fr. Dr. Augustine also explained the trust areas to be concentrated for the holistic development of the students and institutions as a whole. The session was enlightening as Fr. Dr. Augustine explained the philosophical thoughts of St. Chavara and briefed the inspirational story about the development of the college from its inception until today.

The principal called upon three deans to continue discussion in the three focus areas; Dr. Aloysius Edward, Dean, Faculty of Commerce and Management, and Director, IQAC, who focused on the role of teachers and their importance in the development of the institution. Dr. Edward also focused on the 24 rules that must be followed by each teacher during the academic and assessment processes at the institution. He also briefed on the role of class animators in maintaining the code of conduct, mentoring, and upholding Jayantian principles.



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The curriculum and its framework are part and parcel of each teacher's academic responsibility. The session on the curriculum framework and its articulation was delivered by Dr. Gopakumar A. V., Dean, Faculty of Humanities, who stressed the mapping of COs and POs (Course outcomes and Programme outcomes). Dr. Gopakumar addressed how a particular course helps attain different levels of importance, catering to regional, national, and global needs. He also briefed on the Blooms taxonomy that could be applied while framing the curriculum and question paper setting. He briefed on the integration of online courses into the curriculum framework as specified by UGC. The session provided clear ideas on the metrics of formative and summative assessment processes leading to the measurement of OBE attainment.

Dr. Calistus Jude A. L., Dean, Faculty of Sciences, briefed the teachers about the general norms that must be followed by teachers and students inside the campus premises. Dr. Calistus Jude listed out the roles and responsibilities of each and every teacher for upholding Jayantian decorum and also pointed out the dos and don'ts that should be followed by Jayantians as the college focused on holistic development.

The first session of the FDP provided insight on the role of a teacher in the academic, administrative, research, and assessment processes of the institution to all the faculty members.

Day 2 – Topic: National Higher Education Qualification Framework in the context of NEP 2020

Date: July 07 2023, 3.15 pm to 4.15 pm

Resource Person: Dr. Aloysius Edward J, Dean, Faculty of Commerce and Management, Director, IQAC, Kristu Jayanti College

Write up on the Session:

During the second day of FDP, Professor Aloysius Edward presented his views on National Higher Education Qualification Framework in the context of NEP 2020. Resource person has addressed on the various polices of NSOF framework such as, India recognized the need for NQF both for general education and for vocational education and training (VET). The Ministry of Labour and Employment developed the National Vocational Qualifications Framework (NVQF) and the Ministry of Human Resource Development (renamed as Ministry of Education, after NEP 2020 recommendations) developed the National Draft National Higher Education Qualifications Framework (NHEQF) and Vocational Education Qualifications Framework (NVEQF). These two frameworks were considered and used while developing the National Skills Qualifications Framework (NSQF) notified in 2013.

The variation in types of HEIs in India result in a lack of comparability of outcomes associated with different qualifications across institutions. It constraints the mobility of students and their



employability. Further, some of the Indian qualifications are not recognized abroad. Similarly, some of the qualifications from abroad are not recognized in India. It has been felt that given the size of the higher education system and the diversity of institutions and programmes of study in India, the country needs to move towards developing a nationally accepted and internationally comparable and acceptable qualifications framework to facilitate transparency and comparability of higher education qualifications at all levels. The NHEQF is an attempt in this direction. The NHEQF is an instrument for the development, classification, and recognition of qualifications along a continuum of levels from 5 to 10, with levels 1 to 4 of the National Skills Qualifications Framework (NSQF) covering school education. Each level is structured based on the defined learning outcomes, i.e., statements of what the learner is expected to know, understand and/or be able to do on the successful completion of an approved programme of study/learning at a specified level. Students on completion of the chosen programme(s) of study under the NHEQF must possess and demonstrate the graduate profile/attributes defined in terms of the expected learning outcomes, whether they were acquired through one mode of learning or the other, or through a combination of different modes of learning such as direct in-person/face-to-face instruction, open and distance learning, online education, and hybrid/blended modes. Resource person has highlighted some of the areas as follows,

- Scope and coverage of the NHEQF
- The NHEQF is an outcome-based framework for qualifications of different types.
- NHEQF levels
- Expected graduate attributes/profile at different levels on NHEQF
- The Learning outcomes descriptors
- NHEQF level descriptors
- Descriptors for qualifications at levels 9 on the NHEQF
- Learning outcomes descriptors for a higher education qualification at level 10 on the NHEQF
- Academic credit framework for different types of qualifications within the NHEQ

The Session of the FDP provided clear information on NSQF framework and academicians were able to select appropriate NSQF policies to implement or enhance in the current Indian national higher education world.





Write up on the session:

The Centre for Research of the college always nurtures high-quality research, facilitates knowledge creation, and maximizes the impact of research outcomes so as to serve the student community and the globe by providing all the necessary support and opportunities. The Institutional Initiatives to Enhance Research Quality was presented to the faculty members in the last day of the FDP by Dr. Justin Nelson Michael. He started the session by showing a new model for research, as AI model. A stands for Acceleration and I stands for Ignition. Sir also listed the different gears and explained the concepts through that. Gear 1 focusses on research policy and guidelines as per UGC and the college norms, which include research promotion policy, code of ethics in research, prevention of plagiarism and other good academic research practices. The Gear 2 include publication of articles in UGC CARE, ADDBC, Web of Science, Scopus indexed journals, books with ISBN, chapters, proceedings etc. Sir also presented the publication status of the college for three academic years. He showed different research projects in Gear 3 category. He also explained the guidelines to avail seed money and grants and presented the current status of the department projects. The college has installed Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) cell and having MoU with the IP farm which can be considered as Gear 4. Sir presented the status of patents filed, published and granted through college. There are five Ignition and Impact areas which are Research Quality Impact in National and International Ranking agencies, Seed money for Research Publications, Institutional Benchmarks, bibliometrics and Research score. Dr. Justin Nelson Michael also listed the institutional measures to enhance the research output through research day and research mentoring programme. He alerted the faculty members about the pitfalls of the perception score also. He invited Dr. Baba Gnanakumar, Coordinator, Centre for Consultancy and Corporate Training to throw lights on improving the faculty perception and research score. Dr. Baba Gnanakumar showed different portals of government agencies which



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helps to improve the visibility of the teachers as well as the institution. It was a great learning experience for all the participants about the institutional initiatives and the ways to enhance research quality. 

Assessment Score Distribution:




Total points distribution



Brief Write Up of Event:

Kristu Jayanti College (Autonomous), Bengaluru, Department of English organized A Seven-Day International Faculty Development Programme on “New Frontiers in Literary Research” from 9th October to 17th October, 2023. The FDP focused to equip researchers in exploring diverse genres, vantage points, themes and encounters ventures into frontiers of research. There were totally 378 participants benefited by their active participation in all the sessions. First day of the FDP began with the inauguration ceremony at 10:00 am. Dr. Lyola Thomas, P.G Coordinator gave the welcome address, which was followed by the FDP’s Concept note by Fr. Joshy Mathew, Head, and Department of English. Dr. Fr. He started the session with a quick review of action research and moved on to shed light on adopting the deliberation – Acting Paradigm. With much enthusiasm he discussed about planning, action and observation. The analogy put forth by him from his personal life as he was dealing The ethical action; admonish, exhort or rebuke clearly portrayed his deep understanding an involvement in contributing to the academic world.

Secondly, he dealt on the purposes of a literature review and why literature review is an argument and how effective an argument had to be constructed. He used 'Links in a Chain' as a technique to brief about the importance of coherence. He did not miss to explain thesis and hypothesis and how vivid reading could help in dealing thesis and hypothesis in general. He concluded his phase two as he briefed the topic Synthesis.

Moving to referencing he was quick to mention it as a 'key' to a believable manuscript. Bringing about the importance of Sources to the stage, he spoke about the quality set by the sources collected by the researcher. 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The second day of the faculty development programme began with the welcome address. The speaker of the second day was Prof: Saibal Debbarma. He is an Author, Poet and Asst. Professor of English at Govt. Degree College, Gandacherra. His poems were published by Niharika Publishers, Tripura, in a book titled “Kirat: An Anthology of Contemporary Poems from Tripura” and another volume of his poetry titled “Skin of the Earth” was published by Akshar Publications. He loves writing about the enchanting landscapes of Tripura and collecting folktales of the Tripuri Community. The topic he touched upon is ‘Healing Modern Anxieties through Lyrical Poetry’. He began his lecture enumerating on the creative ways to solve problems and pointed out that poetry is necessary to deal with modern anxiety. Further, he shed light on examples of various artists like Van Gogh and Edvard Munch, who were mentally disturbed, but able to create revolutionary paintings through their innovativeness. He also pointed out that Mother Nature is incessantly depleted due to industrial advancements, which left the modern man in trauma and anxiety. In addition, he expounded on various renowned writers like Sigmund Freud, Albert Camus, Nicholas Mazza and Elaine Showalter, their theories dealing with the causes of anxiety and how to overcome it. He also figured out the statistics of suicide among students in various Indian standard Institutes like IITs and IIMs and the main contributing factor behind all this is ‘pressure of perfection’. He also disclosed the interesting concept of ‘poetry therapy’ as a cure-all for the stress and lyric poetry as a panacea for anxiety. Last but not the least, he expounded instances related to Greek legend of the myth of Orpheus highlighting on the traits of Apollo, Greek God of Poetry and Music. His valuable concepts and theories made the audience overwhelming. Dr. Aninditha Chowdhury was the session in charge, who introduce the speaker and managed the overall proceedings and Dr.Neha Kumari delivered the vote of thanks. The session concluded with a question-and-answer session followed by group photo.



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The speaker for the third day was Dr Priya Chandran. He is an Assistant Professor of English at Kannur University, Thalassery, Kerala. The lecture was about the relationship between caste and fear in films. The speaker began the session by discussing the historical context of this topic and provided examples. The speaker highlighted how caste can be used as a tool for creating fear, as it is tied to the stratification system in society, affecting one's birth, occupation, and status. The speaker shared the story of the movie "Puzhu" to illustrate how characters in the film experience fear related to their caste. The lecture delved into the representation of caste-related fear in films, spanning from the early 1930s to the present. It covered various categories, including Dalit cinema, mainstream cinema, social commentary, regional cinema, and documentaries addressing caste-related issues. Dr. Smrity Sonal was the session in-charge and introduced the speaker. She welcomed the speaker at the beginning of the session. Q&A session followed the lecture, allowing the audience to ask questions or seek clarification. Mr. Jithin Joseph delivered the vote of thanks, expressing gratitude to the speaker and the audience for their participation.



What is Poetry Therapy?

- Poetry therapy is defined as the use of language, symbol, and story in therapeutic, educational, and community-building capacities. Once considered a form of bibliotherapy, poetry therapy has emerged as an independent field that is inclusive of bibliotherapy, narrative therapy, and journal therapy.
- In 1928, poet and pharmacist Eli Grierer began offering poems to people filling prescriptions and eventually started "poemotherapy" groups at two different hospitals with the support of psychiatrist Dr. Jack L. Leedy and Dr. Sam Spector. After Grierer's death, Leedy and others continued to incorporate poetry into the therapeutic group process, eventually coming together to form the Association for Poetry Therapy (APT) in 1969. Eli Grierer is credited with giving poetry therapy its name.
- As interest grew, several books and articles were written to guide practitioners in the practice of poetry therapy. Hynes and Mary Hynes-Berry co-authored the 1986 publication 'Bibliotherapy - The Interactive Process: A Handbook'. More recently, Nicholas Mazza outlined a model for effective poetry therapy, also discussing its clinical application, in 'Poetry Therapy: Theory and Practice'.

Objectives:



- To help teachers know the overall implications of business analytics in today's world.
- To make teachers step in to the world of analytics in the research area of faculty members.

Brief Write up on the Program:

Rev. Fr. Dr. Augustine George, Principal, Kristu Jayanti College (Autonomous) inaugurated the event. He emphasized the need of data analytics in the current era and how it contributes towards finding solution in various complicated areas of studies as well as in businesses. Father also mentioned various tools that are in use for data analytics and also regarding the building blocks' life cycle.

The first session was handled by Dr. P.C. Gita. In the present era of technology, it is important for every company to analyze its past and present data in order to predict the future and meet the customer demands. It is here data analysis plays an important role. But in order to derive a solution to the identified problem the need of business data analytics arrives. Dr. P C Gita very clearly gave an overview of what is Business data analytics, the levels of analytics, difference between data analysis and data analytics and the factors driving the growth of data analytics in India. She also took up a case study on strategies that Netflix has adopted to stay on the top in the entertainment market. Some of the key takeaways from the case study were how Netflix has customized its branding based on customer feedbacks and by using advanced analytical tools in order to deliver personalized recommendations to its customers. Ma'am also introduced some of the analytical tools to the crowd which the companies use to analyze big data such as R, Tableau Public, Python, Statistical Analysis System, Apache Spark Excel 365, Rapid miner, Qlik View and Knime.

The second session was handled by Dr. Baba Gnanakumar P. There are two types of data that needs to be handled by companies to analyze and interpret the results such as qualitative and quantitative data. And to analyze them certain BI tools such as Python or Excel 365 are used. Dr. Baba Gnanakumar P gave a clear cut view of how to classify the data into qualitative and quantitative, what are the statements that needs to be considered (subjective and non-ironic statements) and what are the statements that needs to be omitted (objective and ironic) with a practical demonstration of how to gather data using Microsoft Excel 365 and the various stands used for classification of qualitative data such as IPTC and Sense ID.



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The third session was handled by Dr. Arthi R. For large amounts of data to be understood clearly and succinctly, data visualization is essential. One such BI visualization tool is Tableau. It uses real-time data and updates itself, so there's no need to update the data constantly. The limited number of analyses that Tableau allows for compared to other statistical analyses is one of its drawbacks. Dr. Arthi R. demonstrated the use of bar charts, pie charts, regional charts, bullet charts, and categorical charts in tableau for the audience.

The fourth session was handled by Dr. Sinimole K R. Descriptive statistics are brief informational coefficients that summarize a given data set, which can be either a representation of the entire population or a sample of a population. Dr. Sinimole K R from Rajagiri business school, Kochi gave a brief explanation on the concept of descriptive statistics and various measures that are included such as mean, median, mode, standard deviation, skewness and kurtosis and the application of the same in a real life research work.

The fifth session was handled by Dr. Sreejith R. Analytics can be approached in different levels such as descriptive, diagnostic, predictive and prescriptive. Dr. Sreejith R from Rajagiri College of Social Sciences took the audience through the Predictive analytics approach, classification of modeling through various tools namely the Decision Tree and Random Forest using R programming.

The sixth session was handled by Dr. D Ravindran. Data analytics provides the opportunity for companies and marketing teams to gain more insight to help make their business more relevant and establish themselves within saturated markets. Dr. D Ravindran from Kristu Jayanti College (Autonomous), Bengaluru addressed the questions as to why and how data analytics is useful for companies to make business more relevant with the market trends. Also, sir gave hands on experience of data analysis using Excel 365.

The last session was handled by Dr. Sreejith R. Advanced Analytics is the autonomous or semi-autonomous examination of data or content using sophisticated techniques and tools, typically beyond those of traditional Business Intelligence (BI), to discover deeper insights, making predictions or generate recommendations. Dr. Sreejith R from Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Kochi helped the audience by guiding through the various advanced analytical tools with a live demonstration and also discussed regarding the future trends and opportunities of such tools for analytics.




Outcome:




Session VII: Supervised Learning in Python, Dr. Ravindran D


Topic: Designing Engaging Learning experience for Gen Z Learners


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contributions and support in making the event a success. She acknowledged the valuable insights shared and encouraged the participants to actively engage in the upcoming sessions of the FDP.
