



## ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Sree Narayana College, Kollam, is one of the pioneering centres of higher education in the state of Kerala, India. Affiliated to University of Kerala, the college is managed by the corporate management of Sree Narayana Trusts, Kollam. The college was initiated in 1948, an year after the historic Indian Independence. At a time when the luminary vision offered by education was considered expensive and unattainable, the founder of the college, Sri. R Sankar (1909- 1972), the former Chief Minister of Kerala, embarked on a mission of establishing a higher educational institution of national repute, catering to the educational requirements of the poor and the down-trodden. The college is named after the internationally renowned philosopher, social reformer and mystic poet, Sree Narayana Guru (1854 – 1928), whose preachings on social equality, societal reformation and education, brought out a tremendous impact upon the Kerala society, which might have otherwise been doomed with restrictions imposed by the miserable caste system or *Chaturvarnya*. Inspiring enough, the college upholds the preachings of Guru, through its motto, “*One caste, One Religion, One God for Man.*” An awakening social consciousness for an imminent need of education, and the progressive moves of Sree Narayana Dharma Paripalana Yogam (SNDP), both propelled by the visionary thoughts of Sree Narayana Guru, aided Sri. R Sankar in the establishment of this institution. The college initially offered only intermediate courses and was subsequently upgraded to a college offering Under Graduate programmes (in 1957) and finally Post Graduate programmes. Currently, the college is one of the largest of its kind in Kerala state, offering 18 Under Graduate and 14 Post Graduate Programmes; besides, nine of its departments offers research programmes. The college has recently initiated several utilitarian oriented Certificate Courses (both UGC approved and self-financed by the Departments of the college) to usher in and ensure more public participation in educational ventures. The college boasts of a rich tradition in upholding the liberalist and humanitarian values and this is much evident in the illustrious contribution in the discourses of socio political and cultural scenario, both within the state and in our nation. The extensive campus in ten acres of prime land in the heart of Kollam city, houses sprawling buildings boasting modernist architecture. An exhaustive library and the lively presence of the district IGNOU centre and Kerala University Distance Education centre make it a thriving educational hub in Kollam District. A vibrant campus, the enriching environs, the historic overtones, and the philosophic embodiment, combined with its strategic positioning near major rail road transit points make the college an attractive educational space to opt. for.

Keeping apace with the recent innovations and requirements in higher education sector, the college had qualified itself with NAAC ‘A+’ grade (2023) and ARIIA ‘A’; Band ranking (2020). Furthermore the college is assisted with various governmental initiatives and schemes such as RUSA, DST - FIST and DBT - Star Scheme. Adding to the glory of the college, it was ranked second under non-technical section for innovation in ARIIA Rankings 2021.

## AIM OF THE COLLEGE

The college aims at achieving the ideals of Sree Narayana Guru who exhorted us to ‘strive for the welfare of all, without any discrimination on the basis of caste, creed or religion’. The Guru was a Karmayogi who transformed the idealistic Advaita of his predecessors to a practical humanistic one by giving an ethical and social context to it. Imbibing the preachings of Guru as encoded in the thoughtful phrases such as, “One Caste, One Religion, One God for man”, “Liberate oneself through education”, “Humanness marks humanity”, etc., to mention a few, the college strives to mould generations in order to free them from casteism,

bigotry, sectarianism and exploitation. We consider education an instrument of socio-economic progress, political development and moral, social and intellectual awakening in each student.

## **VISION**

Sree Narayana College, Kollam, established in the year 1948 is a pioneering centre of excellence in the field of higher education. The libertarian, universal and philosophic preaching's of Sree Narayana Guru has acted as a guiding spirit in shaping and redefining the visionary stance of the college. At a time when caste divisions and social inequality was at its zenith, Guru's call for liberation through education, proved to be successful enough in ushering in a timeless shift. It is this awakening amongst the downtrodden and especially the visionary zeal exhorted by the Founder and Former Chief minister of Kerala, Sri R. Sankar, which resulted in the establishment of the college. The past glorious times stands testimony to this universal vision of the college, for it had stood with the underprivileged and the marginalized sections of the society in the act of ushering in enlightenment. The vision of the college is nowhere better exemplified than in its motto- "One Caste, One religion, One God for man."

## **MISSION**

The mission of the college draws itself from the visionary zeal imparted by Sree Narayana Guru and the farsighted vision of the founder manager, Sri. R Sankar. The establishment of the college in 1948 had evolved out of the social reformative movement led by Sree Narayana Guru, who believed that education can liberate human beings from the shackles of social inequalities and insecurities. The college derives its missionary zeal from the universally inspiring thoughts of Guru and thus takes it a mission to offer quality education, especially to those hailing from the backward and marginal sections of the society. By spreading the light of Guru's libertarian, democratic and humanitarian spirits upon the student community, the college aims to bring far reaching impacts upon the socio political and cultural spheres of the society. Furthermore, the awe-inspiring ideals of Sri. R Sankar, too proved to have shaped the missionary zeal of the college; for he was a commendable personality who put forth extra ordinary vigor in fighting against the odds and proving the society that even the unachievable heights can be scaled and success attained! In the contemporary scenario of globalization, fast paced communication networks and newly emerging new world order, the college envisages a mission of imparting excellence and competence, thus creating an empowered generation capable of facing all shades of challenges

## **LOCATION AND ACCESSIBILITY**

Situated in a pristine space, spreading across twenty-seven acres of prime land adjacent to the historic Cantonment Maidan in Kollam city, the college can be easily accessed via rail and road transit points. Inter district and inter state buses can be accessed from College Junction bus stop, just adjacent to the campus; similarly, Kollam Junction railway station is merely one kilometer away. Moreover, the campus shares its neighborhood with other colleges and libraries, thus boosting the academic environs. The enchanting location adjacent to the beach, the busy down town area and the ease of transport facilities, give the college an added advantage.

## **MANAGEMENT OF THE COLLEGE**

The Management of the college is vested with the Sree Narayana Trusts, Kollam, one of the leading educational agencies in the State. There is a Managing Committee which consists of the members of the Executive Council of the Sree Narayana Trusts and the Principal. The Secretary of the Trusts is the Manager of the College. Facilities are available for both full-time and part-time research.

### Admission to Research Programme:

Applications in the prescribed form are invited by the University twice a year, in June and December.

### Eligibility: Students

Only candidates who have qualified in the Entrance Test conducted by the University of Kerala or National Eligibility Test conducted by the UGC/CSIR or GATE or State Level Eligibility Test conducted by the Kerala Government or who possess M.Phil Degree by research in addition to a Masters Degree or its equivalent with not less than 55% marks will be considered eligible to apply for registration for Ph.D. (SC/ST 45% marks in Science, 40% marks in Arts and Commerce).

### Eligibility: College Teachers

5% marks relaxation for the candidates with minimum 10 years of teaching experience. Teachers with 7 years of teaching experience are exempted from the Entrance Test.

The maximum number of candidates permitted to work under a research guide in the college is five. Teachers are allowed to do part-time research. Candidates shall send their applications to the Registrar, University of Kerala through the college.

## **FOUR YEAR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME (FYUGP) STRUCTURE**

The FYUGP has a student centric approach in which the student can choose their own pathway for learning. On successful attainment of 133 credits in a three-year period, a student shall be awarded an Under Graduate Degree. In a four-year period, the student can successfully attain 177 credits and shall be awarded with either Undergraduate Honours Degree or Undergraduate Honours with Research Degree.

### **SEMESTER, COURSE AND CREDIT**

#### **Semester - wise Credit Calculation**

- ◆ One semester is defined as 90 working days, and an academic year is divided into two semesters.
- ◆ In addition to the 90 working days, ten working days in a semester can be used for the student's co-curricular activities and for conducting orientation programmes.
- ◆ The maximum number of credits a student can take per semester may be restricted to 28.

#### **Structure of Curricular Contents**

The proposed UoK-FYUGP curriculum consists of **Three Broad Parts**.

1. Foundation Component
2. Discipline Specific Pathway components (Major/Minor)
3. Discipline-Specific Capstone Components

#### **Foundation Component**

General foundation courses are standard for all students. They can be grouped into four major baskets: Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Value-Added Courses (VAC) and Multi-Disciplinary Courses (MDC). Below is a brief description of these course baskets is given below.

##### **(i) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)**

These are courses explicitly designed to achieve competency in English (E) and other languages (OL) with particular emphasis on language and communication skills. The courses aim to enable the students to acquire and demonstrate core linguistic skills, including critical reading and expository and academic writing skills.

##### **(ii) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)**

Skills are psychomotor as well as cognitive. They are about the abilities that students develop to perform various tasks. The 4Cs—Creativity, Critical thinking, Communication and Collaboration—are 21st-century skills for students to survive and work in any local or global work place.

##### **(iii) Value - Added Courses (VAC)**

These courses will develop a graduate student's personality, perspective building, and self-awareness. These courses will help the students identify themselves and their true feelings, thoughts, abilities and actions, empowering them to recognise their strengths and give insights to overcome the challenges.

**(iv) Multi-Disciplinary Courses (MDC)**

These courses broaden students' intellectual experience and build conceptual foundations for the arts, science, commerce, language, and social sciences. All UG students are required to undergo three introductory-level MDCs in any discipline other than their chosen Major. Each Board of Studies (BoS) is tasked with designing at least two introductory courses in their respective subjects to be offered as MDC (Multi Discipline Courses). These courses aim to cultivate a broad understanding and appreciation of the subject. This entails offering foundational-level courses across various disciplines. Except for the double major pathway, every student must enrol in one compulsory course entitled "Kerala Studies" in the third semester, while there remaining two are optional.

**Discipline- Specific Pathway Components (Major/Minor)**

The discipline-specific pathways allow the learner to pursue in-depth study of a particular subject or discipline and develop competency. These pathways include Major courses, Minor courses, and other optional courses.

**(i) Major Component**

The major is the subject that is the main focus of study. The student can conduct an in-depth analysis of a particular topic or discipline by selecting a major. Students may be allowed to change majors within the broad discipline at the end of the second semester by being given sufficient time to explore interdisciplinary courses during the first year. The primary component consists of three types: Discipline-Specific Core (DSC) or Discipline-Specific Elective courses (DSE), research, laboratory, and fieldwork.

**(ii) Minor Component**

It helps the student to gain a broad understanding beyond the major discipline. Students can choose courses from various disciplines or an interdisciplinary minors and skill-based courses relating to a vocational education programme. Students who take a sufficient number of courses in a discipline or an interdisciplinary area of study other than the chosen major will qualify for a minor in that discipline or the chosen interdisciplinary area of study. After exploring various courses, students may change the minor and vocational stream choice at the end of the second semester.

**Discipline-Specific Capstone Components**

The capstone-level courses (400-499) allow the students to demonstrate their cumulative knowledge in their field of study. It plays a vital role in preparing students for the world of practical applications with professional knowledge and skills. At this stage, the student will understand how to use appropriate and relevant knowledge to ideas and products. Capstone-level courses include specialised/advanced topics, internships, community engagement and services, vocational training, professional training, and other work experiences. The various capstone-level components are described below.

**(i) Advanced Major**

Advanced major courses include optional courses with a focused area of study attached to a specific major. These courses also include courses on research methodology. These courses will help graduates deepen their knowledge in a particular study area with more focus and direction.

**(ii) Summer Internship /Apprenticeship**

This promotes the induction into actual work situations. During the summer term, all students will also undergo internships/ apprenticeships in a firm, industry, organisation, or lab training with faculty and researchers in their own or other HEIs/research institutions. Students will be provided with opportunities for internships with local industry, business organisations, health and allied areas, local governments (such as panchayats and municipalities), parliament or elected representatives, media organisations, artists, crafts persons, and the agricultural sector. Through the internship, students may actively engage with the practical side of their learning and, as a by-product, further improve their employability.

**(iii) Field - Based Learning**

It provides opportunities for students to understand the different socio-economic contexts and will aim to expose them to development-related issues in rural and urban settings.

**(iv) Community Engagement and Service**

It seeks to expose students to socio-economic issues in society so that their learning can be supplemented by actual life experiences and generate solutions to real-life problems.

**(v) Vocational Education and Training**

The vocational and skill enhancement courses provide the necessary skills to increase employability and equip students with essential skills to succeed. The main objectives of the skill enhancement and vocational courses are to provide students with an understanding of the expectations of industry, to improve the employability skills of students, to bridge the skill gaps and make students industry-ready, to provide an opportunity for developing inter-disciplinary skills, and to mould the students as job providers rather than job seekers.

Vocational education and training programmes may be structured to encompass a minimum of ten credits, incorporating a dedicated job-oriented additional skill enhancement course alongside a job-specific internship or apprenticeship. At the culmination of their studies, students can pursue either a minor stream course or an additional skills enhancement course to ensure they possess the necessary competencies for employment. Practical aspects of vocational courses entail workshops or field-based activities that engage students in hands-on experiences relevant to their chosen vocation or professional field. The university identifies and catalogues accredited agencies offering vocational training and internships. Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) can select accredited agencies from the University-approved list.

**(vi) Research Projects / Dissertations**

Students choosing a 4-year Bachelor's degree (Honours with Research) must undertake research projects of 12 credits under the guidance of a faculty member who is a university-approved research guide or qualified for a university-approved research guide. The students are expected to be involved in original research. They shall investigate specific research questions, gather data, analyse findings, draw conclusions, and submit a detailed report for final evaluation and defence. The research outcomes of their project work may be published in peer-reviewed journals, presented at conferences/seminars, and patented.

**(i) Other Activities**

This component will include participation in activities related to the National Service Scheme (NSS), National Cadet Corps (NCC), adult education/literacy initiatives, mentoring school students, and other similar activities.

**Remote/Blended Learning Modes**

Students shall be able to earn credit by completing quality - assured online programs listed by BoS of the University from time to time from SWAYAM, NPTEL and other agencies approved by BoS. The BoS of the University of Kerala shall approve courses offered by different online educational platforms. Students shall be advised to opt for such online/MOOC courses with a comprehensive grade devaluation with proper grades and grade points.

**Guidelines for Acquiring Credit from Other Institutions /Online/Distance mode, etc.**

1. A student shall register for at least 21 to 24 credits as per the respective semester from the home HEI, where the student is officially admitted for a particular programme. However, students enrolled for a specific programme in one HEI can simultaneously enroll for extra credits from other HEIs with in the University or outside the University, subject to a maximum of 28 credits per semester, including the credits registered from home HEI.
2. Each institution shall publish a list of courses open for admission to students from other institutions well before each semester's commencement.
3. Each Board of Studies shall prepare and publish a list of online courses at different levels before the commencement of classes in each semester offered in various online educational platforms recognised by the academic council of the University, which can be opted by the students for acquiring additional credits.
4. At the end of each semester, the University shall include the credit acquired by the student through online courses, if any, in their semester grade card.

**Course Participation /Attendance**

The following are the provisions relating to course participation:

1. A student shall be permitted to register for the end-semester evaluation of a specific course to acquire the credits only if he has completed 75% of the prescribed classroom activities in physical, online, or blended modes, including any compensatory activities as specified by the faculty of that particular course.
2. Participation in activities outlined in the college or university curriculum, engagement in co-curricular activities, attendance at career-related interviews, dealing with illness, injury, family emergencies, parental care duties, and encountering adverse weather conditions may be regarded as authorised absences. All other permissible leaves, including maternity and menstrual, are also authorised absences. The existing university norms from time to time shall be binding in this regard.
3. The condonation facility shall be available per the existing university norms.

**Credit Transfer and Accumulation Facilities**

Provisions relating to Credit Transfer and Accumulations facilities are as follows:

1. The university shall establish digital storage (DIGILOCKER) of academic credits for credit transfer and accumulation with the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) facility provided by the University Grants Commission (UGC).
2. The University will create a dedicated Cell to manage credit transfer and accumulation, incorporating the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) facility offered by the University Grants Commission (UGC).
3. Every student has to create an APAAR (Automated Permanent Academic Account Registry) ID generated by the Ministry of Education, Government of India.
4. The validity of credits earned shall be for a maximum period of seven (7) years or as specified in the university/UGC regulations.
5. Students must earn at least fifty percent of the credits from the University.
6. Students shall be required to earn the required number of credits in the core subject area.

### **Degree, Honours Degree and Honours Degree with Research**

The proposed four-year undergraduate program offers three options for students, suitable for their plans and interests. The possibilities are a Three-Year UG Degree, a Four-Year Honours Degree, and a Four-Year Honours with Research Degree.

- a) **Three-year UG Degree:** Students who wish to exit after three years of a four-year degree programme will be awarded a UG Degree in the Major discipline after completing three years, securing a specific number of credits (133 or above) and satisfying the minimum course requirement as given in tables.
- b) **Four-year UG Degree (Honours):** A four-year UG Honours degree in the major discipline will be awarded to those who complete a four-year degree programme with the specific number of credits (177 or above) and satisfy the minimum course requirement as given in tables. To acquire an Honours Degree, the student shall pursue at least three courses in their major subject in the VII semester. This enables them to obtain in-depth knowledge in one of the subject areas. Students shall be allowed to pursue three courses (12 credits) from suitable interdisciplinary/transdisciplinary/multidisciplinary/vocational areas of their choice. Students shall be allowed to choose two online courses/courses (eligible for credit transfer) in their major area of study (with a course level of 400 or above) in the VIII semester. Students may be encouraged to do a project in their VIII Semester. Those students who are not doing the project shall do three courses, online or offline, for 12 credits or an internship project of 15 weeks. The three courses shall be selected from a pool of courses approved by the Board of Studies.
- c) **Four-year UG Degree (Honours with Research):** Students highly motivated to opt for research as their career can choose honours with a research stream in the fourth year. The student who secures a minimum of 177 credits, including 12 credits from a research project/dissertation, is awarded a UG Degree (Honours with Research).
- d) **Fast track Mode:** Students can choose a fast track to complete the degree/Honours programme in N-1 semesters. The additional credits required to complete the course in N-1 semesters shall be acquired every semester subject to a maximum of 28 credits per semester, including 21 to 24 credits, which varies with each semester from the home HEI. However, the maximum

number of credits in a six-semester degree is limited to 150 credits and 200 credits for eight semesters in Honours Degree. The student shall select courses from a pool of courses approved by the Board of Studies.

### Assessment and Evaluation

1. The assessment shall combine a Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) and an End Semester Evaluation (ESE).
2. 30% weightage shall be given for CCA. The remaining 70% of the weight shall be for the ESE.
3. CCA will have two sub-components: Formative Assessment (FA) and Summative Assessment (SA). Each of these components will have equal weightage and will be conducted by the faculty/ course coordinator handling the course.
4. FA refers to various methods teachers use to conduct in-process evaluations of student comprehension, learning needs, and academic progress during a lesson, unit, or course..
5. Summative assessments (SA) evaluate student learning, skill acquisition, and academic achievement after a defined instructional period- typically at the end of a unit, module, course or semester. SA may be a class test, assignment, or project to determine whether students have learned what they were expected to know.
6. Theory and Practical examinations will be at the end of each semester.
7. Regarding evaluation, one credit may be evaluated for 20 marks in a semester; thus, a 4-credit course will be evaluated for 80 marks, and 2-credit courses for 40 marks.
8. Odd-semester evaluations must be done in the HEI itself. At the time of the end- semester evaluation, the University of Kerala shall depute an observer from another HEI to monitor the odd-semester examinations conducted at colleges.

### Practical Examination

1. Continuous evaluation of practicals by the teacher-in-charge shall carry a weightage of 40%.
2. The end-semester practical examination, viva voce, and evaluation of practical records shall be conducted by the teacher in charge and an internal examiner appointed by the Department Council (60% weightage).

The scheme of evaluation of practical courses will be as given below:

3. Only those who have completed the continuous evaluation will be permitted to appear for the end-of-semester practical and viva voce.

### Letter Grades and Grade Points

A Mark system is followed to evaluate each question. For each course in the semester, letter grades and grade points are introduced in a 10-point indirect grading system as per the guidelines given below,

1. The Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) is computed from the grades to measure the student's performance in a given semester. The SGPA is based on the current term's grades, while the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) is based on the grades in all courses taken after joining the programme of study.
2. The weighted grade point will be mentioned in the student's grade cards based on the marks obtained.

**Computation of SGPA and CGPA**

The following method is recommended to compute the SGPA and CGPA:

- The SGPA is the ratio of the sum of the product of the number of credits with the grade points scored by a student in all the courses taken by a student and the sum of the number of credits of all the courses undergone by a student in the semester, i.e.

$$\text{SGPA (Si)} = \frac{\sum (C_i \times G_i)}{\sum C_i}$$

Where  $S_i$  is the SGPA in the  $i$ th semester,  $C_i$  is the number of credits for the  $i$ th course, and  $G_i$  is the grade point scored by the student in the  $i$ th course.

- The CGPA is also calculated in the same manner considering all the courses undergone by a student over all the semesters of a programme, i.e.

$$\text{CGPA (Si)} = \frac{\sum (C_i \times G_i)}{\sum C_i}$$

Where  $S_i$  is the SGPA in the  $i$ th semester,  $C_i$  is the total number of credits in the  $i$ th semester.

- The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded to 2 decimal points and reported in the transcripts.

## FIRST DEGREE PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

---

The First Degree Programmes include (1) Language Courses, (2) Foundation Courses, (3) Core Courses in the Major Subjects related to Degree Programmes, (4) Complementary Courses on allied subjects, (5) Open Course, (6) Elective Courses and (7) Project/Dissertation. In the case of Career Related First Degree programmes under CBCSS, there shall be a component of Vocational Course.

### 1. Semester

Semester means a term consisting of 90 working days distributed over a minimum period of 18 weeks.

### 2. Course

Course means a portion of a subject to be taught and evaluated in a semester. A course of 4 credits will meet a minimum of 4 hours per week and treated as full course. A semi course of one credit will meet atleast one hour per week in a semester.

### 3. Language Courses

Language Courses are courses in English and an additional language of students' choice. Students who join for any B.A./B.Sc programme in this college have to study 5 courses in English and 4 courses in additional language. The additional languages offered are Malayalam, Hindi and Sanskrit. Those who join B.Com programme have to study 4 courses in English and 2 courses in additional language.

### 4. Foundation Courses

Students who join for B.A./B.Sc. programmes have to study one course under language and one course under core. For B.Com programme students have to take up both the foundation courses under the core subject.

### 5. Core Courses

Core course means compulsory course in a main subject related to the First Degree Programme (FDP) in a discipline. Students who join for B.A./B.Sc. programmes have to study compulsory 12-15 core courses and submit one dissertation/project report. For B.Com Programme a student has to attempt 16 core courses and submit one dissertation/project work.

### 6. Complementary Courses

Complementary Course means a course in a subject other than the major subject and is complementary to the main subject. Students who join for B.A./B.Sc. programmes have to study 8 to 10 complementary courses while for B.Com programme a student has to choose 4 complementary courses.

### 7. Open/Elective Course

Students who join for B.A./B.Sc. programmes have to study two courses to a minimum of 4 credits and for B.Com Degree programme a student has to study 6 courses to a minimum of 20 credits. Open course means an optional course which the student is free to take at his/her will. Open Course shall be a course offered by the Departments other than the Parent Department. Elective course means a specialized course from the frontier area of core subject.

## 8. Audit Courses

Courses which student can register without earning credits (Zero Credit Course) and are not compulsory for completing the degree programme. Courses for more than the stated number of credits (120) may be obtained through audit courses.

## 9. Repeat course

Repeat course is a course that a student repeats if he/she has failed in it. Repeat courses are possible with the next batch for failed candidates. Students who complete the semester, by securing the minimum required attendance and by registering for ESE of each semester alone shall be promoted to higher semester. Students who fail to secure minimum required aggregate attendance during a semester shall be given one or more chances to repeat the semester along with the subsequent batch of students after obtaining re-admission subjected to the condition that the candidate has to complete the programme in not more than 12 continuous semesters and that the candidate has to appear for CE afresh each time.

## 10. Credit

Credit of a course is measure of the weekly unit of work involving lecture or laboratory session or seminar or similar activity designed for the course. Each credit hour is roughly equivalent to one hour of class time per week in a semester.

## 11. Attendance

Students who secure a minimum of 75% attendance in the aggregate for all the Courses of a semester taken together alone will be allowed to register for End Semester Evaluation (ESE). Others have to repeat the semester along with the next batch, unless they could make up the shortage of attendance through condonation. However, the award of Grade for attendance in CE shall be made course-wise. Condonation of shortage of attendance to a maximum of 10 days in a semester subject to a maximum of two times during the whole period of a Degree Programme shall be granted by the University on valid grounds. Benefits of attendance for a maximum of 10 days in a semester shall be granted to students who attend to University Union activities, meetings of University bodies and participation in extra curricular activities by treating as present for the days of their absence for the above purpose on production of participation/attendance certificate in such activities issued by the University Authorities/Principal.

## 12. Social Service/Extension Activities

Social Services and Extension activities are mandatory for all students in 3rd & 4th semester with a minimum attendance of 40 hours. A Student who makes achievement in Sports/Arts/N.C.C./N.S.S. shall get Grace Marks. The College offers the following Social Services and Extension Activities/Clubs.

1. National Cadet Corps (NCC), 2. National Service Scheme (NSS), 3. Nature Club/Eco Club, 4. Sports Club, 5. Health Education, 6. Womens' Study Unit, 7. Debate Club, 8. Literary Club, 9. Media Club, 10. Science Club, 11. Planning Forum, 12. Anti-Ragging Cell, 13. Environmental Activities (Bio Diversity Club)

## 13. Evaluation

The Evaluation of each Course shall consists of two parts :

- 1) Continuous Evaluation (CE)
- 2) End Semester Evaluation (ESE)

The CE and ESE ratio shall be 1:4 for both Courses with or without practical. There shall be a maximum of 80 marks for ESE and maximum of 20 marks for CE for all Courses (Theory and Practical).

### **Continuous Evaluation (CE)**

The marks of CE shall be consolidated by adding the marks of Assignment/Seminar and test paper respectively for a particular Course.

### **Assignments or Seminars (Max. marks 10)**

Each student shall be required to do one assignment or one seminar for each Course. Assignments/Seminars shall be evaluated on the basis of their quality. The teacher shall be similarly evaluated in terms of structure, content, presentation, interaction, etc.

### **Tests (Max. marks 10)**

For each Course there shall be one class tests during a semester. Valued answer scripts shall be made available to the students for perusal within 10 working days from the date of the test.

### **End Semester Evaluation (ESE)**

ESE of all Courses in all the semesters shall be conducted by the University. The results of the ESE shall be published according to the Examination Calendar prescribed by the University Level Monitoring Committee (ULMC), which shall not exceed 45 days from the last day of the examination. The maximum mark for a Course (ESE theory) is 80. The duration of ESE is 3 hours.

Total marks for the ESE of Practical is 80. The components of ESE of Practical have to be set by the Chairman, Board of Studies, concerned. The marks for the components of Practical for Continuous Evaluation shall be as shown below.

### **Attendance (Max. marks 5):**

The allotment of marks for attendance of practicals shall be as follows:

less than 51%	0 Marks
51% to 60%	1 marks
61% to 70%	2 marks
71% to 80%	3 marks
81% to 90%	4 Marks
91% to 100%	5 Marks

The marks of a Course are consolidated by combining the marks of ESE and CE (80+20).

A minimum of 35% marks (E Grade) shall be required for passing a Course with a separate minimum of 35% (E Grade) for Continuous Evaluation (CE) End Semester Evaluation (ESE).

Those who fail to secure a pass minimum of 35% (E Grade) for a course will have one chance to improve CE marks for the course.

#### 14. Project/Dissertation Work

For each First Degree programme there shall be a Project/Dissertation Work. The Project/Dissertation work can be done either individually or by a group not exceeding five students. However, Viva-Voce based on the Project/Dissertation work shall be conducted individually. The topics shall either be allotted by the supervising teacher or be selected by the students in consultation with the supervising teacher. The report of the Project/Dissertation shall be submitted to the Department in duplicate before the completion of the sixth semester. There shall be no continuous assessment for Dissertation/project work. A Board of two Examiners appointed by the University shall evaluate the report of the Project/Dissertation work. The Detailed guidelines regarding the conduct and evaluation of the Project/Dissertation will be framed by the Board of Studies concerned.

#### 15. Grading System

Grade indicates the level of performance of a student in a course. 'Grade Point' is an integer indicating the numerical equivalent of the broad level of performance of a student in a course. The product of Grade point and the credit of a course is called 'credit point' (CP).

#### 16. Semester Credit Point Average (SCPA)

SCPA is an index of overall performance of a student at the end of a semester. It is obtained by dividing the sum of the credit points (CP) obtained by a student (multiply the grade point obtained by the student in each course by the credit of that course) at the end of a semester by the sum of the credits of courses taken by the student that semester. After the successful completion of a semester, Semester Credit Point Average (SCPA) of a student in that semester shall be calculated.

Suppose the student has taken four Courses each of 4 Credits and Two Courses each of 2 Credits in a particular semester, after consolidating the Grade for each Course. SCPA has to be calculated as shown in the example given below:

For the successful completion of a semester, a student has to score a minimum SCPA of 4.00 (E Grade). However, a student is permitted to move to the next semester irrespective of his / her SCPA.

### 17. Cumulative Credit Point Average (CCPA)

CCPA Indicates the broad academic level of performance of the student in a programme. It is obtained by dividing the sum of the credit points in all the courses taken by the student for the entire programme by the total number of credit.

For the successful completion of a Programme and award of the Degree, a student must pass all Courses satisfying the minimum Credit requirement of 120 and must score a minimum CCPA of 4.00 or an overall grade of E.

### 18. Repetition of the Semester Courses:

Students who fail to secure the minimum required aggregate attendance during a semester shall be given one chance to repeat the semester along with the subsequent batch of students after obtaining re-admission and they will have to repeat the CE for all Courses.

The normal duration of the First Degree Programme shall be three years consisting of six semesters. No students shall be allowed to complete the programme by attending more than 12 continuous semesters.

### 19. Re-appearance of Failed Students:

Students who fail shall have to reappear for the ESE of the same along with the next regular batch of students. Candidates who fail to score 'E' grade in the ESE in any of the Course/Courses have to reappear for the ESE of the Course/Courses Concerned with next regular batch of students. The number of chances or such appearances is limited to 5 and the same have to be done within a period of 12 continuous semesters including the semester in which they have first appeared.

However, students who fail to secure SCPA of 4.00 have to reappear for the ESE with the next regular batch of students for such courses for which they have secured the least Grade for improving the SCPA. Here also the number of appearance is limited to 5 and the same has to be done within a period of 12 continuous semesters including the semester in which they have first appeared.

In both cases (i.e. failure to obtain 'E' Grade for individual Course/Courses and 'SCPA of 4.00) students shall not be allowed to repeat the semester, but the marks secured by them for the CE part shall be carried over and added to the marks obtained in the ESE they reappear. However, those who fail in the CE (i.e. those who fail to secure a minimum of 'E' grade) will have one chance to improve the same (except the marks for attendance) along with next regular batch of students.

## **20. Improvement of ESE**

Candidates who have successfully completed the semester, but wish to improve their marks for the ESE shall have only one chance for the same along with the next immediate regular batch of students. In this case, the better marks obtained shall be considered for the calculation of SCPA.

## **21. Grace Marks**

Grace Marks shall be awarded for Sports/Arts/NCC/NSS in recognition of meritorious achievements.

Our Famous Alumnus: **Olympian P R Sreejesh** completed his graduation in History from Sree Narayana College, Kollam. He is an Indian professional field hockey player who plays as a goalkeeper and former captain of the Indian national team. Sreejesh played a vital role in the Indian national team's bronze medal win at the 2020 Summer Olympics men's field hockey tournament. He won FIH Player of the Year Awards (2020–21) for best male goalkeeper, 2021 – Khel Ratna Award, highest sporting honour of India and 2022- World Athlete Of The Year 2021. **Olympian Renjith Maheswary**, Indian Triple Jumper represented India at the 2008 Beijing Olympics as well as in 2012 London Olympics. He made an Indian record of 17.30 m in Indian grand prix meet at Bengaluru on july 2016. Both of them were the glamorous personalities of our department.

- ◆ The maximum Grace marks awarded to a student in a year for all the activities put together shall not exceed 25 %.
- ◆ Course wise distribution shall be followed and Grace marks need not be awarded to a student if he/she secures less than 10% of the maximum marks for that theory course (external).
- ◆ The basic criteria for the award of Grace Marks shall be representing the University when called upon to do so. ## FEE REGULATIONS

### PAYMENT OF FEES

Fees are to be paid in two instalments.

**June** : First instalment of Tuition Fee including the special fee from all students

**November** : Second instalments of tuition fees

**Collection of Fees** : On or before the seventh working day of the month.

**With Fine** : ₹ 5/- on or before the 10th day after due date. ₹10/- thereafter.

If the fee and fine of an instalment are not paid before the last opportunity given for payment of the instalment, the name of the student will be removed from the rolls of the college with effect from the date following the last date for fees and the student will not get the benefit of attendance from the date of removal.

**Re-admission** : With the special permission of the Principal, the student has to remit all the arrears of fees with fine and Re admission of Fee ₹55/-. The re-admitted students will get the benefit of attendance only from the date of re-admission.

(Last opportunity is defined as the last working day previous to the date of the succeeding instalment. For the last instalment, the last opportunity is fixed as 5 March. Absence (with or without leave) from the college shall not be an excuse for non-payment of fees on the due date.

## CAUTION DEPOSIT

Caution deposit realised from every student on admission will be refunded on completion of the course or if the student leaves the college with T.C. after adjusting dues, if any. Students should produce the caution deposit receipt along with the application for refund. Amounts that remain unclaimed for three years will be forfeited.

## ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES

**Transfer Certificate :** A student applying for a T.C. shall not be given the certificate except on payment of all fees or other money due or such portion there of as the principal may see fit to demand for the academic year in which the student was last enrolled.

Transfer Certificates of students who have appeared for a University Examination will ordinarily be issued to them only after the publication of the result of the examination.

Late applicants have to pay a penalty ₹ 50/- and a fee of ₹ 100/- will be charged for the issue of a duplicate of Transfer Certificate.

**Conduct Certificate :** Any student who leaves the college without the written permission of the principal before completing his/her course will not be issued a certificate of character. Any student who discontinues his/her study in the college without returning a book issued to him/her or without paying any arrears or other dues shall receive no certificate of character or any other certificate.

A fee of ₹ 10/- one will be charged for the issue of certificates from the college.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COLLEGE

---

### MORNING PRAYER AND CLASS HOURS

Classes in the morning commence with the '*Daiva Dasakam*' (Prayer of Humanity). Staff and students stand in reverential silence during its soothing and melodious rendering.

The College works under the full day system with two sessions. In between the two sessions there is a noon interval of thirty minutes from 12.50 pm to 1.20 pm. Besides Lecture classes, there are Seminars, Tutorials, Group discussions and Counselling.

### ATTENDANCE

1. Those who secure a minimum of 75% attendance during the semester only will be allowed to register for the End Semester Examinations. Attendance will be taken at the beginning of each class.
2. No student shall absent himself/herself from a class without leave.

3. In case of absence on account of illness, a medical certificate is to be produced.
4. Condonation of attendance to a maximum of 10 days in a semester subject to a maximum of two times during the whole period of the U.G. and P.G. programme may be granted by the University. Union activities, meetings of the University bodies and participation in extra curricular activities will be treated as present for the above purposes on production of participation/ attendance certificate in such activities, subject to a maximum of 10 days in a semester.
5. Students whose attendance falls below the minimum of 75% shall apply for exemption through the Principal to the University.
6. Fee for exemption from attendance shortage upto 10 days ₹ 100. Application for condonation should be forwarded atleast 10 days before the commencement of the university examinations.

### **DRESS, BEHAVIOUR AND DISCIPLINE**

1. Every student is expected to be decent, cultured, polished and pleasing in his words and deeds inside and outside the college.
2. Students are expected to greet the teachers respectfully when they meet them.
3. Students are required to be neat and tidy in dress and person. They are advised to be courteous.
4. Students should handle college properties with care. Further, they are expected to do whatever they can to protect and promote the beauty, charm and dignity of the campus. Any damage done to college property will have to be made good.
5. Students should not write, carve or paint anything on any part of the college building, walls, furniture, etc.
6. Students shall take their seat in the class as soon as the bell is given. They shall rise when the teacher enters the classroom and remain standing till he/she takes his/her seat and directs them to sit down. They should keep with them Texts and Note books required for the classes they attend.
7. No student is allowed to enter or leave the classroom when the session is on without the permission of the teacher.
8. Students shall not roam about verandas and corridors during working hours.
9. Students are not allowed to stand or move about the verandas or do anything which might disturb the classes during working hours.
10. No notice, petition, etc. of any kind shall be circulated among students for publicity without the permission of the Principal.
11. No meeting or function of any kind shall be held on the campus without the prior permission of the Principal.
12. Political activism is strictly banned on the campus as per the Hon'ble High Court Order No. WP(C)No. 32540/2015(N) dated 27.10.2015 Students are forbidden to organise or attend meetings other than the official ones.
13. Students shall not take active part in political agitations directed against the Government or the Management.
14. Students on strike are strictly prohibited from entering the veranda or the class room or shouting slogans on the campus.
15. All strikes, demonstrations, agitations, dharnas, hartals and the like are banned on the college campus. Students who violate this rule shall be dismissed summarily.
16. Political activities are summarily banned on the college campus. Students engaging in any such activity which may cause disruption to classes or disturbance on the college campus are liable to be dismissed from the college.

17. Students are strictly prohibited from holding meetings or collecting any fund without the written permission of the Principal.
18. Smoking, chewing, snuffing and other unwholesome practices are strictly prohibited on the campus.
19. Irregular attendance, insubordination to teachers, indifference in class, habitual mischief-making obscenity in deeds or words are sufficient reasons for suspension or dismissal of a student from the college.
20. Minor offences are punishable with fine.
21. Malpractices at exams and test papers will be severely dealt with.
22. Any genuine grievance of students may be brought to the notice of the Principal either directly or through the group tutor.
23. The Principal is the final authority in the interpretation of the college byelaws and he reserves the right to frame and enforce rules governing the conduct of students in the class rooms and on the campus.
24. All students admitted to the college should keep with them their Identity cards, with recent passport size photographs, duly attested by the Principal. The students should produce their Identity cards as and when the teaching staff, office staff or any other members of the college service demand it.
25. Mobile phones are banned on the campus. (For Students)

## FACILITIES IN THE CAMPUS

### COLLEGE LIBRARY

The primary purpose of the College Library is to support the teaching, learning, research and other academic programmes of the college by collecting, co-ordinating and disseminating information. At present, the library has a large collection exceeding one lakh books which include reference books, text books, treatises, fiction, back volumes of journals etc. The Library subscribes to 35 periodicals, 60 journals and 9 news papers. Library membership is open to all staff and students.

The library system in our college is computerised. We have prepared the bibliographic database of books and journals to provide easy and accurate access to the available information. Users can use computer terminals for searching and retrieving the available information. Internet facility is available in the library.

Our library is offering e-resource accessing facility through National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content (N-LIST). N-LIST is jointly executed by the e-ShodhSindhu Consortium, INFLIBNET Centre and the INDEST-AICTE Consortium, IIT Delhi provides access to selected e-resources. The N-LIST project provides access to e-resources to students, researchers and faculty through server(s) installed at the INFLIBNET Centre. The authorized users from our colleges can access e-resources and download articles required by them directly from the publisher's website once they are duly authenticated as authorized users through servers deployed at the INFLIBNET Centre.

The library has 3 sections - Reference Section, Circulation Section and Periodical Section. The working time of the library is from 9.30 AM to 4.30 PM

2. Books, periodicals and newspapers should be handled with care and returned intact before leaving the library. All marking, underlining etc. in any book belonging to the library is forbidden. Students are expected to be co-operative in keeping the library neat and tidy. Loud reading and talking in the library are strictly prohibited.
3. Members are not permitted to take home books belonging to the Reference Section. Books will be issued only on production of Borrower's ticket. Loss of Borrower's ticket must be reported to the librarian and a new ticket will be issued on payment of ₹ 5/-.
4. Books issued to the students should not be retained for more than 14 days. An overdue charge @ ₹ 1/day will be collected from defaulters.
5. Members can renew/reserve books for their future use.
6. Damage in any book must at once be reported to the librarian; otherwise the borrower will be held responsible for damage that may be discovered later
7. If any book is lost, the person concerned will have to replace the book or pay the cost of it together with the stipulated fine.
8. Books taken for a vacation shall be returned within the first 3 working days after reopening.
9. A student against whom any charges are outstanding will not be issued books from the library.
10. Students shall return their library cards at the end of their course for getting library clearance.

**NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)**

The NCC which is administered through the Ministry of Defense, is the Youth Wing of the Indian Armed Forces founded in 16 April 1948.

The aims of NCC are as follows.

- To develop qualities of character, courage, comradeship, discipline, leadership, secular outlook, spirit of adventure and sportsmanship and ideals of selfless service among the youth to make them useful citizens.
- To create a human resource of organized, trained and motivated youth to provide leadership in all walks of life including the Armed Forces, and be always available for the service of the nation.
- To create suitable environment to motivate the youth to take up a carrer in the armed forces.

The subunit of 3(K) Naval Unit NCC started in this college on 1st September 1969. The authorized strength is 50.

Enrolment of cadets in the NCC is made at the beginning of the academic year. The cadets have to undergo a minimum of four hours training a week, so as to make a total of 70 training hours a year. Training is imparted usually on Saturdays.

Discharge certificates are issued to those who successfully attend not less than 75% of the training periods. B and C certificate examinations are conducted by the end of the academic year. NCC kits issued to the cadets should be returned before the month of March every year and a 'No dues' certificate should be obtained from the NCC officer.

**Academic incentives :** NCC cadets who secure more than 75% of attendance are eligible for weightage marks for their admission to various courses. Seats are also reserved in various professional courses.

NCC cadets are also eligible for grace marks under CBCS System. The Grace marks obtained by a student can be distributed to the End Semester Examination of the difference courses in a semester or among to semesters in an academic year as per the choice of the students. The students shall claim the grace mark with in six months after the end of the academic year.


