অধ্যক্ষার নিবেদন





Online applications are invited through college website <https://berhamporegirlscollege.ac.in/>. Minimum eligibility criteria for different courses are as per norms of University of Kalyani. Seat availability and Details admission procedure are available in college website. Admission is granted strictly on the basis of the merit list published by the college. Documents uploaded at the time of online application are verified by college after admission.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION

- Original and attested copies of Mark Sheet of the last public Examination (H.S/Equivalent)
- Original and attested copies of Admit Card/Certificate of Madhyamik or Equivalent Examination as proof of age.
- Original and attested copies of Caste Certificate from the competent authority for SC/ST/OBC Candidates.
- Original and attested copies of Persons with Disabilities (PWD) Certificate for Physically Challenged Candidates.
- Original and attested copies of Character Certificate from the Head of the School or College last attended.
- Original Migration Certificate for students migrating from other Boards/University
- Original and attested copies of BPL Certificate, wherever applicable.
- Original and attested copies of Equivalence Certificate, wherever applicable
- Two Copies of recent passport size photograph of the student
- Original and attested copies of Registration Certificate (for already registered candidates under (University of Kalyani)





Admission Qualifications

Eligibility & Recognized Boards

A candidate may be admitted to the first semester of four-year(Eight Semester) UG-Courses of Studies on passing Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination in General conducted by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or an equivalent examination conducted by other State Board/Council, or The W.B. Council of Rabindra Open Schooling, or The National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) recognized by the Distance Education Bureau (DEB) subject to fulfillment of the conditions mentioned below:

Candidates from 'other' Boards

In case of other Boards/Councils, a candidate shall have to pass in five recognized subjects, of which one shall be English, of full marks not being less than 100 each. A candidate passing in four subjects shall not be eligible for admission.

Candidates from Vocational Stream

However, Candidates passing Higher Secondary examination from vocational stream conducted by the West Bengal State Council of Technical & Vocational Education & Skill Development (WBSCTVE&SD) or any other equivalent Board/Council are also eligible for admission provided that the candidate must have passed in 5 (five) recognized subjects, of which one shall be English, in the previous qualifying examination.

Candidates shall be allowed for admission within 03 (three) consecutive academic sessions including the year of passing the previous qualifying examination. (For example: candidates passing H.S. Examination in the year 2022 will get last chance of admission in the academic session 2024-2025.)

Programmes of Study

There shall be following one type of Under-Graduate Programmes-

4-Year UG Degree (Honours / Honours with Research)

As per the Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes, developed by the UGC there will be provisions for awarding UG Certificate and UG Diploma and Basic UG Degree with Major.

For 4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research), a student can choose a research stream in the fourth year subject to fulfilment of all conditions; laid down by the UGC for implementation of NEP and Curriculum Credit Framework.



ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION U.G 2024-2025

Students who are willing to get admission in B.A./B.Sc 1st Sem (both Major & Minor courses) require some minimum educational qualifications as per University of Kalyani's Guideline in different Courses of Under Graduate studies from the academic year 2024-2025. Followings are the minimum eligibility criteria

ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS

1. (a) A candidate taking up Honours Course in a subject must have obtained:
 - (i) A minimum of 50% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the respective subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.OR
 - (ii) 55% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.OR
 - (iii) 50% marks in the aggregate when the candidate has not studied the subject in his/her previous qualifying examination provided all the other clauses are satisfied.
2. However, candidates belonging to the Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe Community taking up Honours Course of study must have obtained a minimum of 40% marks in the aggregate and 40% marks in the subject or related subjects at the previous qualifying examination, as the case may be.
- 3 (A) Candidates from other Boards, who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) examination or its equivalent from the All-India Boards/Councils or State Boards/Councils including Open Schools and Vocational studies, are eligible for study at the UG level.
- 3 (B) Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) examination or its equivalent from the All-India Boards/Councils (i.e. CBSE, ICSE and National Institute of Open Schooling) are not required to submit the Migration Certificate for getting Registration under this University.
- 3 (C) Any dispute regarding eligibility criteria would be resolved by the Equivalence Committee set up by the University or by the Executive Council in its absence.

3. Minimum eligibility criteria:

- (i) 4-Year UG Degree (Honours / Honours with Research):** A student who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination held by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent Examination from other Boards / Councils with at least five subjects having English as Compulsory Subject of 100 marks is eligible to take admission to the UG-Courses of studies on the basis of merit and available vacancy of the particular subject(s) of the concerned college.
- (ii) Aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks in top-four subjects, including Marks obtained in English, in order of marks secured by a candidate. Marks obtained in Compulsory Environmental Studies (if any) shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks.**
- (iii) However, for preparation of Merit marks for admission for a particular Major/Hons subject, if the College desires it may add the marks of Major / related subject / English (where even related subject is not available) with the Aggregate Marks calculated as per 3.ii to reach at Merit Marks.**
- (iv) A candidate shall be allowed to pursue any one of the Programmes in a particular Academic Session. At the initial stage, every student has to choose one Major subject and two Minor subjects.**

Special condition for admission to UG courses in Chemistry, Economics, Environmental Science, Mathematics, Philosophy, Physiology and Sociology:

- (i) Chemistry: A candidate shall be allowed to take up Major/Minor in Chemistry only if he/she has passed in Chemistry, Physics and Mathematics at the previous qualifying examination.
- (ii) Economics: The subjects Mathematics, Statistics and Business Economics including Business Mathematics be treated as related subjects.
- (iii) Environmental Science: If the candidate does not have Environmental Education/Environmental Science/ Environmental Studies as elective subject then the subjects Biological Sciences, Chemistry, Computer Science, Economics, Geography, Geology, Mathematics, Modern Computer Application, Physics and Statistics be treated as related subjects.
- (iv) Mathematics: A candidate shall be allowed to take up Major/Minor in Mathematics only if he/she has passed in Mathematics at the previous qualifying examination. A candidate who has passed in Business Mathematics is not eligible for admission to Mathematics Major Course.
- (v) Philosophy: The subject Psychology be treated as related subject.
- (vi) Physiology: A candidate shall be allowed to take up Major/Minor in Physiology only if he/she has passed in Biological Sciences and Chemistry at the previous qualifying examination.
- (vii) Sociology: The subjects History, Philosophy, Political Sc. & Psychology be treated as related subjects.

6. Intake Capacity and Reservation of Seats:

The intake capacity for each programme will be as follows:

4-Year UG Degree (Honours / Honours with Research): The existing intake capacity in honours subject as approved by the University shall be considered as the intake capacity for 4-Year UG Degree (Honours / Honours with Research). In addition to that,

Eligibility for Sports Quota

(ii) Candidates must have participated in Inter District School, or, State Inter-School, or, State- Junior, or, Open Inter District Tournaments, or, State Open Championship, Calcutta First Division Championships

CERTIFICATE FROM THE STATE ASSOCIATIONS / BODIES, THE DISTRICT OFFICER FOR PHYSICAL EDUCATION, DSA, OR, DSSA SHALL ONLY BE ACCEPTED

Program Dynamics

Undergraduate Degree Programmes of 4-year duration, with multiple entry and exit points and re-entry options, with appropriate certifications such as:

a UG certificate after completing 1 year (2 Semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study, provided that a skill based vocational course (additional 4 credits) must be completed during the summer term by the students who will exit the programme after securing 40 credits. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven (7) years.

A UG Diploma after 2 years (4 Semesters) of study, provided that a skill based vocational course (additional 4 credits) must be completed during the summer term by the students who will exit the programme after securing 80 credits. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven (7) years.

* A Bachelor's Degree with Major shall be given after completing 3-year (6 Semesters) programme of study.

* A Bachelor's Degree (Honours) shall be given after completing 4 year (8 Semester) programme of study. If the students complete a rigorous research project/dissertation in their major area(s) study in the 4th year of a bachelor's degree then he/she will be given Honours with Research degree.

The Under Graduate Colleges having the affiliation for Honours (Major) Course(s) are entitled to the affiliation for introducing Minor Course(s) in the same subject(s), subject to the approval of appropriate authority. In that case, the approval / post facto approval for intake capacity is to be taken from the University.

Similarly, the Under Graduate Colleges having the affiliation for General (Minor) Course(s) are entitled to the affiliation for introducing Major Course(s) in the same subject(s), except Defense Studies and Film Studies, subject to the approval of appropriate authority. In that case, the approval / post facto approval for intake capacity is to be taken from the University.

All testimonials are required to be uploaded online during application. Verification of documents will be done by the respective college authorities only when the students will report for classes in due course. Admission will be cancelled if the documents are found not in conformity with the declaration in the forms submitted online.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

Berhampore Girls' College invites the co-operation of the students and their guardians in the creation and the maintenance of an atmosphere conducive to academic and cultural development, and in upholding the traditions of the institution. Students are especially invited to cooperate, in their own interest to ensure enforcement of rules regarding discipline.

1. Students must be punctual and regular in attending classes, tutorials, class tests examinations etc. Failure to obtain the required attendance percentage, non-submission of assignments and unjustified absence from tests /examinations will be treated as breaching the code of conduct.
2. Students must be seated in their classrooms at the beginning of each period. They must not enter or leave the classroom without permission of the lecturer. Impersonation during roll call is a punishable offence.
3. Use of Mobile Phone during class hours is prohibited and is liable for punishment. Resorting to any kind of malpractice (copying, impersonation, use of unfair means, exchanging answer-sheets) during examinations will not be tolerated and will be dealt with severely.
4. Students should carefully follow the Notices put up on the Notice Board (both online and offline). No excuse will be considered if Notices on the Board are ignored.
5. When a lecturer is absent or is unable to take class, students should maintain a strict order among themselves so as to not disturb the adjoining classes. Students are expected to treat the members of the staff both teaching and non-teaching and their fellow students with courtesy both in and outside the College.
6. Students shall not, by their act or conduct, cause damage to the reputation of the institution. Students are expected to come to college dressed suitably maintaining decency. Students must wear and display visibly their Identity Cards at the gate while entering the College and always keep it on your person during college hours inside the campus. Students are not allowed to loiter or stand about the verandas or corridors of the College during class hours.
7. Smoking, chewing and spitting tobacco products or pan masala, consumption of alcohol or narcotic drugs is strictly prohibited inside the college premises. Violation of this rule will invite disciplinary action. The college premises is a smoking free zone, respect it. Students must refrain from mishandling and tampering with library books or college computer systems.
8. Students must conserve electricity and They must switch off lights & fans when they leave the classroom, study room of library & computer lab. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited. Disciplinary action will be taken against those who violate this rule.

COLLEGE UNIFORM

In keeping with the tradition of the college, there has always prevailed a uniform dress at the institution. The college has introduced a particular dress with proper specifications and colour for students. Such a rule is framed in accordance with the ethos and the viable teacher-student atmosphere that exist in the college. While in college students should dress in a manner that is befitting an academic institution. Under no circumstances should their attire cross the borders of decency. Each student is advised to acquire a set of the College Uniform which is required to be worn compulsorily.



RULES RELATING TO ATTENDANCE

- For enhancement of academic activities and promoting sincerity and perseverance among the students, the College strictly abides by the attendance norms of the University of Kalyani, which are as follows:
- The examinations of every semester will be held in theory covering 80% of the total marks in each paper and Internal Assessment shall be conducted for 20% of the total marks of each paper/subject/module. The marks of Internal Assessment are divided into two categories i.e. written exam and class attendance. For a full paper of 75, 10 marks is allotted for internal examination (i.e. 13%) and 5 marks for a full paper of 75(i.e. 7%) will be given based on the regular class attendance: 5 marks is allotted for attending 75% classes or above; 4 marks for attending 60 to 74% of the number of lectures delivered; 3 marks for attending 50% to 59% of the number of lectures delivered; and 2 marks for attending below 50% of lectures delivered. The attendance will be counted from the date of commencement of classes or date of admission whichever is later.
- As per University norms students with attendance below 75% will not be allowed to appear in the university examination. In terms of Internal Assessment of the college students with attendance below 50% cumulatively in all courses in a semester are not eligible to appear in the respective internal evaluation.
- It is mandatory to attend online and extra classes whenever arranged by the departments as well as any faculty member of the department due to various reasons. Such type of attendance is redacted on students register.

PARENTS / GUARDIAN-TEACHER MEETING

The Institution is acutely conscious of the importance of maintaining a meaningful coordination among the different stakeholders of an Institution. In this regard regular meetings by respective departments are conducted to keep parents or guardians aware of the performance and development of their wards on a regular basis. It is also a significant medium for procuring feedback from the guardians. The exact dates of the meetings are notified by the Departments.

STUDENT HOSTEL

The College has two hostel campuses. The new hostel is situated in the main college campus with an annex building i.e. “Nibedita Chhatri-nibas” (New Hostel) and the other is 200 meter away from the college campus i.e., “Amiya Rao- B. G. Rao Prangan”, (Old Hostel). There are four hostel buildings in the Old Hostel Campus, Kadambini Ganguli Bhawan, Kalyani Bhawan, Old MsDP Bhawan and Box Building. Another new hostel building in the old campus has been constructed with the grant received from the Government of West Bengal under MsDP (Multi-sectoral Development Programme), New MsDP Bhawan. A separate building is almost on the verge of Completion for the P.G students with the UGC fund. Hostels of Berhampore Girls' College are decorated by 367 lively and active Boarders who can maintain their Messing properly under the guidance of college authority, Superintendents and Staff of Hostels. College authority has tried to pay attention to the improvement of study of Boarders by offering 110 Seats of Nibedita Chhatri Nibas/New Hostel to the practical based Science students. The Boarders of Nibedita Chhatri Nibas/New Hostel can participate in their practical classes without any anxiety of coming back to Hostel as their Hostel is within the college Campus. 257 Seats of Old Hostel are allotted to the students of Arts. Boarders of two Hostels always enjoy the same facilities. Arrangements have been made to provide security, healthy academic environment and economically affordable accommodation. The two hostels are adequately supervised and monitored by superintendents and assisted by other stuffs. Moreover, the college has four two-storied Staff Quarters with sixteen units. A day care center is carrying out its activities in a unit of the staff-quarters. There is also a non-teaching staff quarters with four units.



CAMPUS FACILITY

LIBRARY

Berhampore Girls College, established in 1946, is an undergraduate college in Murshidabad and it offers post graduate courses also. It is affiliated to the University of Kalyani. It is situated on the ground and first floor of the Annex building. The College has a quite large open-access library with a collection of approximately 41,000 books. Books are classified by using DDC20 classification schedule and catalogued by using AACR2 cataloguing code. The Central Library is automated using ILS software KOHA. The library is fully computerized with WEB-OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue). The library has its own website accessible through college website through which library related information is disseminated. There are many links of OER (OPEN EDUCATION RESOURCES) in website. The library has a unique feature of E-Requisition through which library remains accessible even after college hours get-over. A large number of rare and old books and magazine are preserved in library. Books circulation system occurs through barcode scanning. The total collections of the central library are as follows: Books 41152 (including books of seventeen departmental libraries), Periodicals 14, Periodical bound volumes 186, Newspapers 05, Job-related weekly newspapers 02, CDs/DVDs 59, Maps 39, and Charts 05. The library has subscribed to e-journals and e-books through NLIST and DELNET. The library has its Book Bank also. In addition to the Central Library, every department has a Departmental library. These Departmental libraries have been built up with the aim of providing easy access of books. Departmental libraries are being totally controlled by the department concerned. The library has-

6. Library Fine: After the due date of submission Rs. 1 per working day need to be paid as a fine amount.
7. Clearance certificate: Students leaving the College for the University Examinations must return the library books and get a clearance certificate from the Librarian before receiving results for B.A. / B.Sc. and M.A. final semester examinations.

DEPARTMENTAL LIBRARY

Departments offering Honours Courses have well-stocked individual seminal libraries for the use of their honours students. This library provides easy access of texts and reference books to students of the departments.

The College possesses two conference hall, Amiya Rao Conference Hall & Priti Gupta Conference Hall with a capacity to seat approximately 150 & 60 people respectively with provision for state-of-art audio-visual facilities which enable the hosting of seminars, conferences, workshops and cultural programmes.

The College has a sick room with first Aid facility which can be used in case of emergency. The College has a small medical room with observatory bed and First-aid Box with medicines. 
COLLEGE CANTEEN

BOTANICAL & HERBAL GARDEN



The college also sends information to the students from time to time on college matters, including examination notices etc., through text messages.

RESEARCH ACTIVITIES



STUDENTS AWARENESS PROGRAMME

Gender Sensitization

Berhampore Girls College is dedicated to keeping its students informed about contemporary societal and environmental issues. Various initiatives such as seminars, workshops, and rallies are regularly organized to raise awareness among both faculty and students. During the 2024-25 academic year, each department of our college independently organized an awareness campaign focused on "Gender Sensitization and Prevention of Crimes against Women" alongside encouraging the ban on single-use plastic items. Various units within our college, such as the Women's Cell, Anti-Ragging Cell, and Grievance Redressal Cell, play a comprehensive role in ensuring that our students know their rightful position in society. The Government of India is implementing numerous programs, schemes, and legislations to address various forms of gender discrimination. The underlying cause of gender discrimination lies in the patriarchal mindset prevalent in Indian society.

Gender sensitization is crucial as it fosters our attitudes. This process helps in developing a more democratic society that is capable of transforming attitudes to embrace gender equality as a fundamental social value.





The objectives include:

- Raising awareness about gender discrimination, violence against women, the deprivation of women, and related issues through various means such as lectures, seminars, talks, workshops, and debates.
- Cultivating an inclusive environment where students and staff actively engage in college activities and initiatives with open-mindedness.
- Addressing cases of sexual, psychological, emotional, and physical harassment objectively and to the best extent possible within the capacity of an academic institution.
- Motivating students to actively engage in all cultural events hosted by the college, allowing them to display their talents and contribute to the planning and execution of ideas for college exhibitions.
- Encouraging students to enroll in NSS Unit-1 and the NCC wing.
- Providing a variety of value-added courses to improve students' employability, alongside promoting participation in physical fitness activities. Additionally, facilitate career counselling, recruitment workshops, entrance test preparation, and guidance for competitive exams both on-campus and externally through the Placement Office.

To meet these goals, the college has developed and implemented a well-planned inclusive strategy, as outlined below:

- Arranging seminars, talks, workshops, and competitions focusing on gender-related issues, while also motivating students to engage in community service, social initiatives, and environmental efforts facilitated by Calcutta Ekatma and Mother Earth Foundation, with whom the College has established Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs).
- Promoting student involvement in extracurricular pursuits, encompassing competitions hosted both internally within the college and externally by other institutions. Additionally, encouraging students to autonomously organize events such as Freshers' Welcome, Class Farewell, and Teacher's Day. Furthermore, urging participation in significant occasions including College Foundation Day, International Women's Day, Republic Day, National Youth Day, Parakram Divas, and Independence Day celebrations.

Several other accompanying policies are as follows:

- An Anti-ragging Cell has been established in compliance with government regulations to address complaints and provide counselling to resolve issues. The Internal Committee examines student, teaching, and non-teaching staff grievances, ensuring equal opportunities for all while handling grievances with utmost care and confidentiality.
- The college has developed teaching strategies that are not only reflective but also goal-oriented. These strategies enhance student-teacher relationships and address any shortcomings, ensuring the effectiveness of efforts towards 'gender mainstreaming'.
- Ultimately, the college staff is instructed by the Head of the Institution to abide by the College Codes of Conduct and to act in a manner appropriate for an all women in the institution.





PLASTIC FREE GREEN CAMPUS

In order to make our campus environment friendly the Campus Maintenance and Green Initiative Committee of the college has undertaken some activities and rules to be followed by all stakeholders. As a part of the green initiative program various types of plants were planted inside the campus and those are looked after carefully by the assigned stakeholders. 'সবুজের অভিযান ব্রিগেড' is formed in the college. The campus of Berhampore Girls College is now a Plastic free zone as a part of the initiative of Green Campus campaign. There is one Herbal Garden (Madhu mali Veshaja Uddyan) that will face Ayurvedic needs, one rain harvesting field, one solar plant to face the challenges the scarcity of electrics. A Vermi Composting Plant is set up to use the organic and inorganic wastes. Vermi composting or worm composting is a simple process for converting biodegradable waste into organic manure with the help of the earth worm. The uses of Sal leaf and clay pots are mandatory in the college canteen. In the meantime, 70% use of Plastic wastes is restricted. At least one day of the week, the entry of the cars run by petrol and Diesel is completely restricted. Frequently campus cleaning drives were undertaken by all the students, staffs to clean the dirtying elements in the whole campus and at the same time students were being made conscious about the importance of a clean and green campus. The use of L.E.D Light everywhere in the campus restricts the high use of electricity. As the campus is full of green trees, the committee decided to provide some alternative ready-made biodegradable shelters for the birds and following that decision a large number of such built up nests were put into the branches of the trees to facilitate the comfortable living of the birds. Thus, Eco-system is preserved. Several extended programmes have taken place to make the awareness of green and clean campus place in 2024-2025. Every department organised awareness program in order to make the students conscious about the various effects of the use of plastics in our day-to-day life. Seminar, Wall-Magazine and Poster presentations, lecture sessions, essay competition etc. are arranged to aware the students and through them to the society.
