

Subject and Predicate

Subject: Who or what the sentence talks about is the subject of a sentence.

Predicate: The predicate tells us something about the subject. It tells us what the subject is doing or what the subject is.

eg.1 The horse likes to eat hay.

The horse - subject
likes to eat hay. - predicate

eg.2 Add suitable predicates
My grandmother wore a blue saree

eg.3 Add suitable subjects
The plant lost its leaves.
