### FEEDBACK FOR THE TEACHERS BY STUDENTS

#### (SESSION 2016-17)

For the session 2016-17, the students have filled up feedback form for permanent teachers, guest faculty and JBS teachers. The feedback committee decided a certain format for the purpose through which knowledge, teaching style and behaviour of the teachers and evaluated. (format attached)

Evaluation process was impartial and transparent as the teacher of a particular subject was evaluated by the feedback forms being filled up through the teachers of other subjects. For example feedback forms for Geography teachers are being filled up through the Economics teachers and vice versa. For the evaluation a scoring scheme was applied through which certain scores were decided "for example 05 for excellent, 04 for good, 03 for Poor. Statistical analysis process was implemented to know a particular teacher" score by adding up the marks amended for the evaluation. Mean of measures of central tendency was used in this process. For mean scores different categories of class interned were formed and then described. The table below shows haw analysis has been converted into Qualitative analysis:
