NSoJ Law has been approved by the Government of Karnataka to run a 5-year integrated law degree (BA,LL.B) by Karnataka State Law University (KSLU).

Prior to founding NSoJ, Timothy worked as a corporate lawyer in New Delhi, Singapore and Hong Kong at the global law firms Jones Day, Allen & Overy and DLA Piper, respectively. He has advised governments, corporations and global investment banks on international corporate finance. He has published several articles in The Financial Times and has contributed a chapter on leadership in young organizations in the Palgrave Macmillan publication "Leadership and Role Modelling: Understanding Workplace Dynamics" (2018). He also serves as a trustee of The General K.S. Thimayya Memorial Trust and is a member of the Ethics Committee and Institutional Review Board of Bangalore Baptist Hospital. Timothy is a cancer survivor who lives life to the fullest, including by studying Biblical texts, hosting The NSoJ Tannoy Podcast, playing cricket and fronting an alternative rock band.

Timothy received an LL.M (Master of Laws) degree from the London School of Economics (LSE) and is qualified as an advocate in India and as a solicitor of the Senior Courts of England and Wales. In 2020, he was named an Obama Scholar at Columbia University. He is currently partner at Tatva Legal Bengaluru and a BMW Foundation Herbert Quandt Responsible Leader.



The process involved several rounds of interviews and an English eligibility test. The release added that the programme conducted for youngsters from around the world is funded by the United States Department of State and enables undergraduates to spend a semester at any American university. Mr. Ranjan is spending an all-expense paid semester at the Mississippi Valley State University, Itta Bena, Mississippi, and is expected to complete his course by mid-December when he returns to NSoJ.






EVENTS, TALKS & WORKSHOPS


Our faculty and students work together produce print, broadcast and digital publications that meet global industry standards for production quality, reporting, news gathering, editing and presentation.
