Food Chain

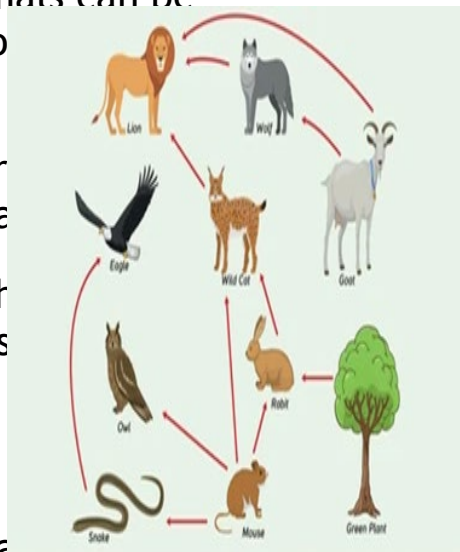
Animals eat plants and other animals. Animals can be grouped under four categories depending on their food habits.
