

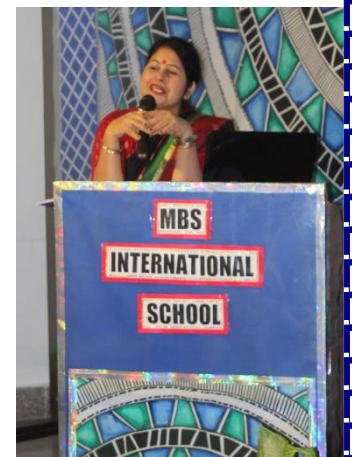

**Glimpse of the Workshop**

In the present era, it has become imperative for all the schools to provide holistic learning opportunities to give them quality education. Responding to this need, two days CBSE workshop on Classroom Management was organized in MBS INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL, DWARKA on 20-9-19 and 21-9-19.



It was attended by nearly 45 teachers of various schools from all over Delhi-NCR. It was conducted by resource persons, Ms Rajni Ashat and Dr. Shiksha who enlightened the teachers with tips on effective classroom management. The workshop focused on the elements of classroom management which include- content management, conduct management and covenant management. Various activities were undertaken to illustrate these elements with an involvement of the listeners. The teachers also got a chance to display their ideas of 'Dream Classrooms' fitted with the latest facilities.



Ms. Rajni then highlighted the importance of ‘management’ in the absence of such facilities. She emphasized that there are innovative methods of teaching that are available at hand and teachers should be curious enough to find out about and use them. The responsibilities and duties of teachers must be parallel to the needs and the creative minds of the children. Teachers also have the added responsibility of understanding the ever-growing and animated mind of a child.

It was a great learning experience, as it helped the teachers to adopt various techniques to make the teaching and learning process more effective. There were many topics which were covered in the two-day programme such as – Understanding Classroom Management, Physical Arrangement in Classroom, Components of Effective Classroom, Teaching Styles, Learning Styles, Managing Classes with Large Number of Student and Management of Inter-Personal Relationships. The workshop

revolved around active discussions between the teachers and the resource persons. Teachers were introduced to various innovative methods for managing classrooms. They were divided into different groups, and they actively participated in evaluating their own style of teaching through several self-evaluation surveys, helping them to understand their teaching styles. Teachers also sportingly took part in group activities which involved case studies, role plays, presenting lesson plans and also shared their personal experiences in classrooms which helped others to learn new ways of interacting with children.

There was emphasis on addressing the concerns of students and reducing stress by substituting punishments with consequences.

The workshop was an interactive one which helped the teachers devise innovative strategies which can be applied in real classroom situations. Overall, it was an excellent refresher for the teachers.
