Pursuant to Section 260 of the Companies Act, 1956 Shri Shri V. B. Bagal will hold office as Director upto the date of ensuing Annual General Meeting. The Company has received a Notice in writing from members (alongwith the Deposit of required amount) proposing the candidature of Shri V. B. Bagal for the office of Director u/s 257 of the Companies Act, 1956.

None of the Directors other than Shri V. B. Bagal are interested in this resolution.

Under Section 293 (1) (d) of the Companies Act, 1956, the Board of Directors of a Company cannot. except with the consent of the company in general meeting, borrow monies, apart from temporary loans obtained from the company's bankers in the ordinary course of business, in excess of the aggregate of the paid-up capital and free reserves of the Company, that is to say, reserves not set apart for any specific purpose. The Shareholders at the Extra-Ordinary General meeting of the Company held on 25th February, 1997, had accorded their consent to the Board of Directors borrowing upto Rs. 250 Crores. (B) MANUFACTURING RESULTS OF SAMEERWADI:

The results for the year reflect working of two crushing seasons i.e. part of 1995-96 and part of 1996-97. It covers the period from 1-4-1996 to 31-3-1997 the results whereof are produced below:

The cane crushing target during the year under report underwent a change after the Season commenced. There was a gradual decline in the cane supplies as the Season advanced. This was on account of the fact that due to frequent power cuts, Borewell pumps and river lifts were not working to the required extent leading to water shortage and gradual drying of cane which led to heavy fall in the cane yields.

Accordingly, the cane crushing during the Season 1996-97 was 8.94 lac tonnes. However, the Recovery percentage substantially improved to 11.93%.

(C) CANE PRICE SETTLEMENT OF PREVIOUS YEARS:

In terms of MOU arrived at between the Company and cane growers association, Sameerwadi in the meeting held on 17th and 18th November, 1995 in the Chamber of Hon'ble Minister for Sugar, Textile, Environment & Ecology, Sameerwadi's final cane price for above two Seasons was linked with M/s.UGAR Sugar's cane price on pro-rata recovery basis. Recently, Ugar has declared its final cane price @ Rs.790/- per M.T. & Rs.715/- per M.T. for the Seasons 1994-95 and 1995-96 ex-field. Accordingly on prorata recovery basis, our final cane prices work out to Rs.743.75 and 747.80 per M.T. respectively for the above years.

(D) PROGRESS IN "COGENERATION"PROJECT :

The Comapny has appointed M/s.Desein Consultants Private Ltd., New Delhi as Project Consultants for the Cogeneration Project, having regard to their considerable experience in implementation of several Power Projects. The consultants would provide comprehensive services including preparation of Detailed Project Report (DPR), Engineering & Supervisory Services for Testing, Commissioning, and guarantee runs for the Cogeneration Plant. The Consultants have since visited Sameerwadi site and have gathered all the relevant data and are now preparing the Detailed Project Report (DPR) and taking further steps in this regard.

(E) LEVY PRICE MATTERS IN SUPREME COURT 1974-75 TO 1979-80 SEASON:

In terms of the Supreme Court order dtd. 28.1.1997 Government of India has requested the State Governments to furnish information in respect of the above years to enable the Central Government to work out the 5A prices for all the zones so that the revision in levy prices for the above years can be determined and announced.

(F) LEVY PRICE FOR SEASON 1985-86 FOR SAMEERWADI FACTORY:

The Company's SLP in Supreme Court against the order dated 20-12-1990 of Karnataka High Court is still to be heard finally. In view of the Supreme Court Judgement in (E) above, the Company proposes after consulting the counsels, to take up the plea of consideration of 5A price in the computation of Levy Price for the Season 1985-86.

(G) ADDITIONAL LEVY PRICE MATTERS OF ERSTWHILE LAKSHMIWADI FACTORY FOR THE YEARS 1981-82 TO 1983-84:

The matter is listed in General List in Supreme Court. It is expected to reach for hearing in the next two to three months time.

(H) LEGAL MATTERS IN RESPECT OF LAKSHMIWADI 38 WORKERS:

- i) The appeal filed by 38 workers of erstwhile Lakshmiwadi factory against judgement of Labour Court at Ahmednagar in the matter of reinstatement of workers after 8.4.1988 will be coming up for hearing in September, 1997.
- ii) Similarly the Company's Writ Petition in High Court of Mumbai (Aurangabad Bench) against the order of the Industrial Court in favour of 38 workers for payment of unpaid wages, Bonus, D.A., etc. for the period of Closure i.e. from 16-12-1986 to 8-4-1988 has not yet reached the stage of hearing.

(I) DIVIDENDS:

The Directors recommend for consideration of Shareholders at the Annual General Meeting payment of Preference Dividend at 7.8572% on the Redeemable Preference Shares and also 20% Dividend on Equity Shares subject to deduction of tax for the year ended 31st March, 1997.

(J) DISCLOSURE WITH RESPECT TO CONSERVATION OF ENGERY ETC. :

The particulars about conservation of energy, etc. pursuant to the Companies (Disclosure of Particulars in the Report of the Boad of Directors) Rules, 1988, are set-out in the Annexure forming part of this report.

AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE SHAREHOLDERS ON THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH, 1997

We have examined the attached Balance Sheet and the Profit and Loss Account annexed thereto which are in agreement with the Company's Book of Accounts.

As required by the Manufacturing and Other Companies (Auditors' Report) Order, 1988, in our opinion, and on the basis of such checks of books and records as we considered appropriate and according to the information and explanations given to us during the normal course of audit, which were necessary to the best of our knowledge and belief, we report that:-

- The Company has maintained proper records showing full particulars including quantitative details and situation of its Fixed Assets. Physical verification of all the assets has been conducted by the management at the close of the year and no material discrepancies were noticed.
- The Fixed Assets of the Company have not been revalued during the year.
- 3. Physical verification had been conducted by the management at reasonable intervals in respect of finished goods, stores, spare parts and raw materials and no material discrepancies have been noticed on such physical verification as compared to book records. The procedure followed by the management for such physical verification are in our opinion reasonable and adequate in relation to the size of the Company and the nature of its business. On the basis of our examination we are satisfied that the valuation of its stocks is fair and proper in accordance with normally accepted accounting principles.
- 4. The Company has not taken any loans from companies, firms or other parties listed in the Register maintained under section 301 of the Companies Act., 1956 or covered by the definition of Companies under the same management under Section 370(1B) of the Companies Act, 1956.

We have obtained all the information and explanations which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.

In our opinion, proper Books of Accounts as required by the Companies Act, 1956 have been kept by the Company so far as appears from our examination of these books.

In our opinion, and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Account subject to note 4 regarding change in the method of valuation of closing stock and its effect on the profit of the year of the Company and read with other notes thereon give the information required by the Act in the manner so required and present a true and fair view of the state of the Company's affairs at the close of the above financial year and of Profit for the year.

NOTES: (1) SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

- a) System of Accounting:
 - The Company follows the mercantile system of accounting and recognises income and expenditure on accrual basis except bonus which is debited on payment basis.
 - ii) Financial Statements are based on historical costs.
 - iii) Fixed Assets are carried at cost of acquisition or construction.
 - iv) Investments are valued at cost of acquisition.
- b) The Liability as on 31-3-1997 for accrued gratuity to employees under the payment of Gratuity Act, 1972 as per Actuary's Certificate is Rs.1,91,84,828/-. The same is covered under Cash Accumulation Scheme of Group Gratuity Insurance with Life Insurance Corporation of India.
- c) Provision for Leave Encashment payable on retirement has not been made as per requirement of Accounting Standard 15 which has been made mandatory from 1.4.1995, as the liability is not ascertained.
- (2) Income Tax and Wealth Tax Assessments upto Accounting Year 31-3-1993 (Assessment Year 1993-94) have been completed and the demands upto Asst. Year 1993-94 have been fully provided although disputed and pending in appeals.
- (3) Depreciation on Fixed Assets has been provided on W.D.V. Method upto 30.9.95 and thereafter on S.L.M.
- (4) Closing Stock of Sugar is valued at cost or market value whichever is lower. Till last year quantity sold upto 31st July out of the Free Sugar stock was valued on realised value basis and balance stock on that date was valued at cost. Due to change in basis of valuation, the profit for the year is lower by Rs. 718.95 lacs.
- (5) No Provision has been made in the Accounts for following Disputed Liabilities in respect of Sameerwadi Factory.
 - a) Show Causes Notice for Rs.43.59 lacs and Rs. 42.02 lacs for period 1-4-1990 to 31-3-1991 and 1-4-1991 to 31-3-1992 respectively by Dy. Commissioner of Commercial Taxes (Intelligence), Belgaum by SUO MOTO revision for payments of Cane Purchase Tax on Harvesting and Transport Charges as the dept. has not taxed the same in assessments completed for subsequent years also.
 - b) Demand of Rs. 79.30 lacs from Superintendent of Excise, Bijapur on 2736.945 M.T. of Molasses destroyed in 1990 with the permission of Central and State Excise Department.
 - c) Demand of Rs.30.73 lacs (including interest of Rs.13.16 lacs) plus interest @Rs.21,715.50 per month for the period beyond 15-8-1992 for depositing the additional Levy Price collected together with interest in Levy Sugar Price equalisation Fund in view of dismissal of Company's appeal by Division Bench of High Court of Karnataka filed against Single Judge's order of the same Court dismissing Writ Petition filed for Levy Price determination for season 1985-86. The company has filed an appeal in Supreme Court against this order, which is admitted and pending.
